The Compton College Special Resource Center (SRC) / Disabled Students Programs and Services (DSP&S) provides many support services that enable students with disability-related limitations to participate in the college's programs and activities.

The following are examples of support services available to students with disabilities:

- Academic counseling
- Assistive software
- Campus and community referrals
- Career counseling
- Educational Assistance Classes
- Educational plans
- Interpreter services
- Note-taking services
- Priority registration
- Specialized tutoring
- Testing accommodations

The High-Tech Center computer lab is available to SRC / DSPS students by referral for prescribed accommodations. Services include:

- Assistive Technology: SRC / DSPS students are encouraged to use assistive technologies, such as JAWS, ZoomText, Kurzweil, and Read & Write, to support their educational goals.
- Test Accommodations: SRC / DSPS students with a signed Testing Accommodation Form from a SRC / DSPS counselor and faculty can receive extra time on tests or other accommodations.
- Equipment Loan: Equipment loans include digital recorders, digital enlargers and assistive listening devices.
- Alternative Media: Course materials and textbooks can be provided in digital format (e-text, MP3 audio, etc.).

How to Apply

Students interested in attending Compton College and receiving services through the SRC / DSPS must complete the following before the start of the semester:

1. New students are required to complete all of the **Steps to Enrollment** prior to registering for classes at Compton College. <http://www.compton.edu/steps/>
 - A SRC / DSPS counselor will develop an educational plan with you and help you register for classes.
 - Complete intake documents and orientation for the SRC / DSPS Program.
2. Students wishing to take advantage of SRC / DSPS services are required to provide verification of their disability to the SRC Office @SRCVerification@compton.edu

Eligibility Requirements

- A verifiable medical condition that lasts more than 45 days.
- The ability to negotiate the campus' facilities independently, or with the assistance of a student-provided attendant.
- The ability to take care of personal needs unassisted, or to provide one's own care attendant.

Participation in the Special Resource Center (DSPS) is voluntary. Students who choose to identify themselves to the SRC (DSPS) and qualify for services will work with staff to determine appropriate and reasonable academic accommodations.
