

ECC COMPTON CENTER ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2006-2016

Student Success

A significant number of classes have been added at ECC Compton Center. In 2014-15, 1,396 class sections were offered, an increase of 9% from 2006-07.

Increase each year in the number of degrees and certificates awarded. From 2006 to 2016, the number increased nearly 20 times over, going from 26 associate degrees to 438.

The total number of transfer students has increased from 128 in 2007 to 481 in 2015.

Over the past five years, the number of ECC Compton Center students transferring to UC and CSU schools has increased by more than 300%.

Facilities

Campus facilities are improving thanks to funds from Measure CC and Measure C, approved by voters in 2002 and 2014, respectively. A Comprehensive Facilities Master Plan is in the works for 2017-22.

Planned Future Projects:

- Instructional Building 1: A \$17.7 million project now in the planning stages to replace the current “Row Buildings.”
- Swing Space: A \$2.2 million project to create temporary instructional buildings located in the current practice football/soccer field area during construction of Instructional Building 1.
- Music Building North Wing Renovation: \$3.1 million project; estimated completion is Fall 2016.
- Public Safety Facility: A \$3.3 future headquarters for the campus police to be constructed in the current Foster Care Building location.
