### 1. Check-In – Desiree Corona Ramirez

- Today, we will be reviewing the Consultancy recap and discussing highlights from the California Guided Pathways institute that took place last week.
- Also, will discuss Steps to Enrollment and have some TST conference updates as well.

### 2. Consultancy Recap – VP Berger

- Two weeks ago, we talked about our challenge of practice moving students through to completion of degree certificates and transfers, we also shared this with other colleges. The feedback we got from other colleges were as follows:
  - In order to increase the numbers of certificates, we should look into how we can auto award CSU G
    students then they get the certificates of achievement. Especially, when a student is also earning an
    Associate degree for transfer at the same time.
  - Students may not be getting an Associate degree for transfer, they might just have made a request for the CSU G certification or, they just want to transfer. They are either meeting the CSU G pattern, so they should get one of them.
  - The second suggestion was, find a way to use Degree works to identify students who are missing
    one or two classes and reach out to them to complete their programs.
  - A conversation came up about undecided students as well, we don't really have an undecided major.
  - We have our Tartar Success teams; we can look at how to leverage our current TST structure also, act as a completion team.

- Long Beach City college reaches out to students who are near completion and who are within 15 units of completion.
- Due to the high numbers of A's in general studies, we got into a discussion about do we advertise students to students, the benefits of an Associate degree for a change for over a general study as well.

# 3. CAGP #2 Highlights – Desiree Corona Ramirez

- She shared screen and discussed the CAGP institute with committee members. The Guided Pathways Summit will take place on zoom, Friday, May 6<sup>th</sup> from 8:30am 11:30am.
- Tri-Chairs will send the registration link out campus wide or you can visit the professional development page to register. Hopefully, everyone will attend.

## 4. Steps to Enrollment – Dr. Jimenez

- Provided a quick recap on Steps to Enrollment, which includes orientation, meet with a Counselor to create either an abbreviated or comprehensive educational plan. These are a couple of core services that are required for priority registration. Also, he wants to discuss this topic at the Guided Pathways committee meeting.
- Update about the Call center, they currently called students who may not have a student educational plan or has completed the new student orientation.
- They schedule appointments for students to meet with Counselors and encourages them to complete the new student orientation.
- Also, he mentioned CRM recruit, we have the opportunity to create templates and proactively reach out to these students. There are a couple of ways we're sort of addressing this so, he wants to open it up for discussion with the Tartar Success team, categorical programs, etc.
- A couple of suggestions:
  - Is this something that can be folded into the current Target success team structure?
  - Maybe reviewing the Tartar success team manual
  - Review roles and responsibilities
  - Create a process to ensure these core services are completed, etc.
- Noemi commented on the roles and responsibilities, like the current TST structure, maybe we need to revisit it.
- Who's going to do the work to recruit students for summer and be involved for the fall semester because it's a lot of work for Advisors?
- Dr. Jimenez suggested making orientation mandatory for priority registration. **FYI:** Orientation is available 24/7 and it's online.
- VP Berger: Dr. Matthews is working on a Distance Ed orientation, and he has a student focus group revealing it right now. In the next couple of weeks, we'll go through it and provide feedback.
- DeVora: Presented at Ellucian Live conference in Denver on April, 12th or 13<sup>th</sup> and wanted to share her experiences with the group. It was phenomenal and it was great to network with other people and share different ideas.

## 5. TST Updates – TST Leads

- Dr. Jimenez: Jeanette and himself talked about how we can increase instructional faculty participation. Also, how can we keep the momentum going and strengthen commitment for our faculty counterparts.
- A few weeks ago, he gave out Cosmetology module one kits. Jeanette assisted with given out some Cosmetology module two kits to students.
- Noemi: They have four events coming up. There are as follows:
  - Creative Writing workshop, they provide a workshop about Graphic Novels.
