The play focuses on mental health, gender identity, and Filipino culture. Following the performance, the students will be invited to participate in a Q&A session with the cast. They may inquire about various theater occupations such as the life of an actor or the process of writing a play. Virtual Transfer and Career Activities		We would like to support FACH students in exploring transfer and career opportunities in this virtual environment. To encourage FACH students to participate in Compton College-sponsored university tours, career workshops, and related events, we would like to enter students into monthly opportunity drawings to receive \$25 through Edquity. Events like these allow students to become familiar with campuses and promote transfer to four-year institutions. If students commit to transferring to one of these institutions, they will be familiar with the campus, resources, and services, allowing them to have a smoother transition from Compton College to their four-year institution. Students will be given a “ticket” for every event they attend to be entered in the monthly opportunity drawing held at the end of March, April, and May 2021. Twenty (20) winners will be selected at each opportunity drawing. Events they can participate in include Transfer Center and TST-sponsored activities like virtual university tours and workshops (e.g., CSUDH Virtual Tour on 4/8/21 and UCI EID Academy).
