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Minutes:

Student Success Center:

What can we do as a committee to support the Student Success Center? We want to find ways to help support this area, while it does not have a director.

- Brenda mentioned that instructors need to mention the in person tutoring services that are now available.
- Brenda noted that the computers are being used, around 10 students a day.
- Gayathri mentioned that she sent emails to instructors about the just in time workshops and boot camp information, to promote these services to students.
- Sarah had an idea to give incentives to instructors who refer their students to tutoring workshops.
- John'Ta requested a flyer of the tutoring services to promote to the ASG individuals and social media.
- Sarah finalized the boot camp schedule and will send it shortly.

Winter Bridge Program:

- The hours are being reviewed, VP Berger brought it up during council and has not been approved yet.
- The idea of winter program came from the summer bridge program. The focus is to help students adjust and help the transition from high school to college. The key courses such as English and Math retention numbers need to go up.
- The idea is to catch students from Fall 2021 who have withdrawn or failed their courses and provide them refresher tools to be successful when they retake the course in Spring 2022.
- John' Ta shared that he took Math 150 course and the difficulties was the coursework and understanding the subject matter.
- Sarah mentioned that the winter program will consist of Monday through Thursday, one-hour workshop each day, which equals to the number of hours for the English 101S course offered in Spring. Sarah will cover topics relating to the English 101S course. Sarah will review concepts that will be covered and helpful study habits and skills.

Data Requests (CRM Advise and Argos):

- Argos reporting platform that sits on top of Banner and it is used to create reports related to students. The request can be made to IT to create a report through Argos to provide a list of students who have withdrawn or failed an English or Math course. We may not have the information by mid- December when courses and grades are in.
- The winter bridge program is starting a little later in January to give enough time for final grades.
- CRM Advise data is Banner data as well, however CRM Advise benefits because you're able to

communicate with the students directly through this platform, rather than emailing directly.

December Meeting:

Lauren invited two doctoral candidate students who are conducting a project as part of their coursework for their doctoral program.

- Jennifer Davis: doctoral student who is doing an analysis of all the programs we offer, and the courses required for specific programs, coming from a student standpoint. Questions such as, where are the gaps? Are we offering certain classes needed for specific programs? There has been concerns on Compton College not offering certain classes, and this project will help us moving forward with course offerings.
- Etelvina De La Torre: doctoral student who will investigate which program is the most popular at Compton College. Where do we see the areas of popularity based on students key demographics?
