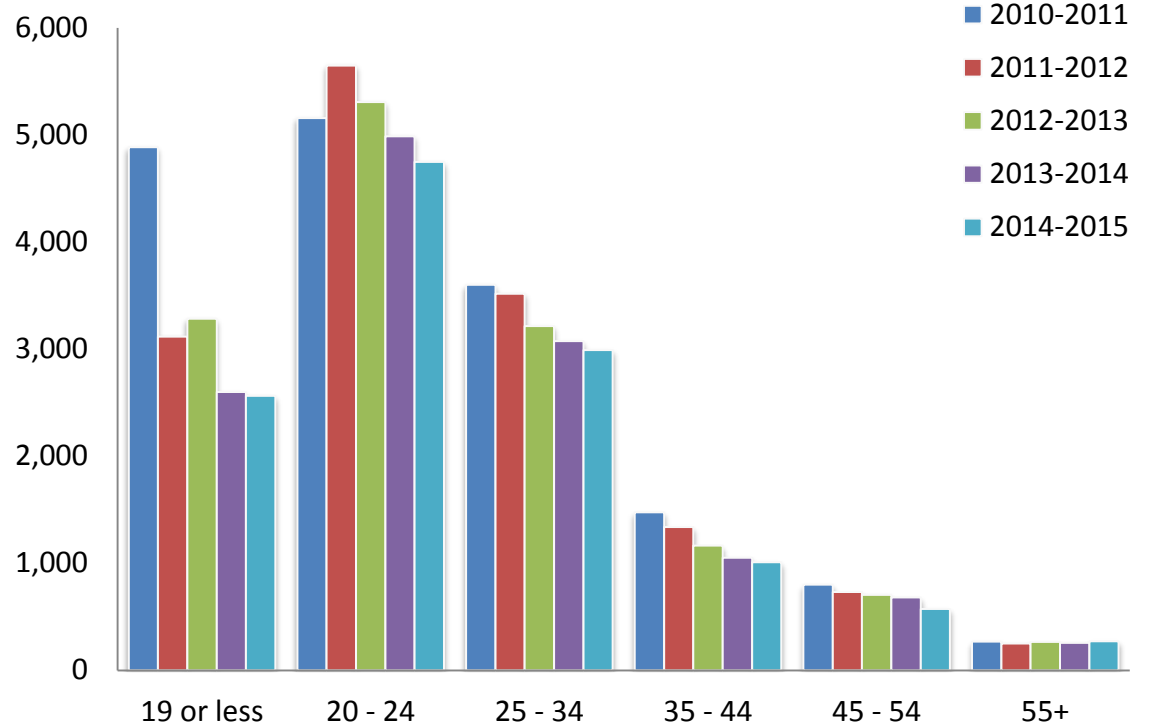
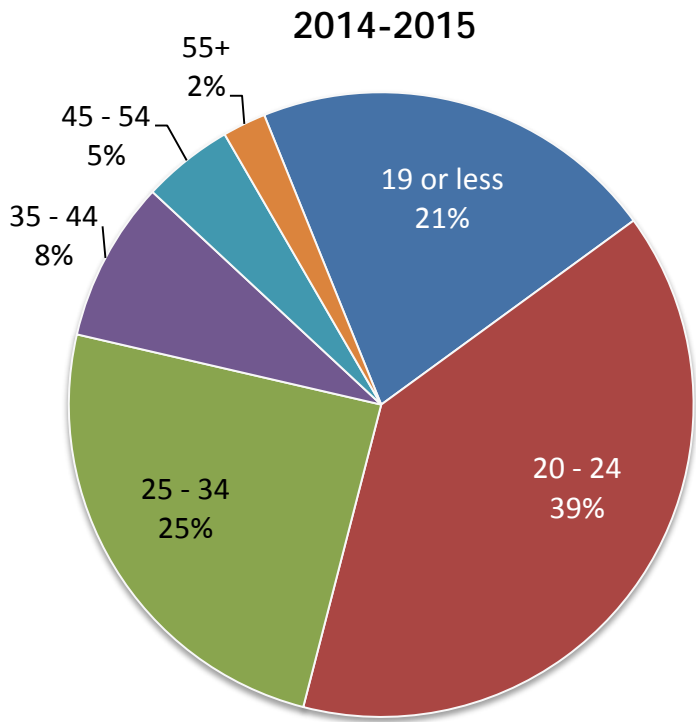

The National Student Clearinghouse is a national, non-profit organization that offers access to enrollment and degree records.

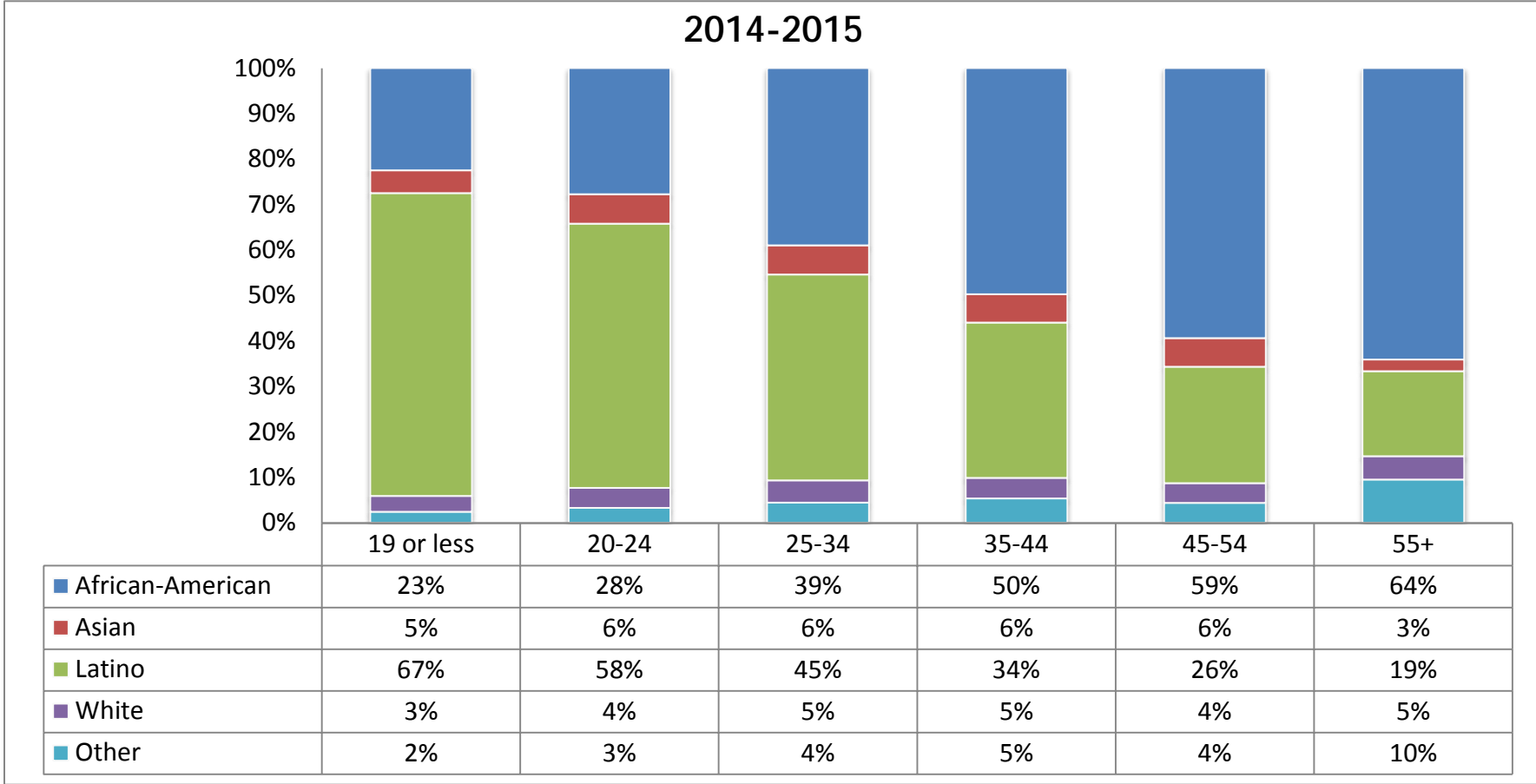

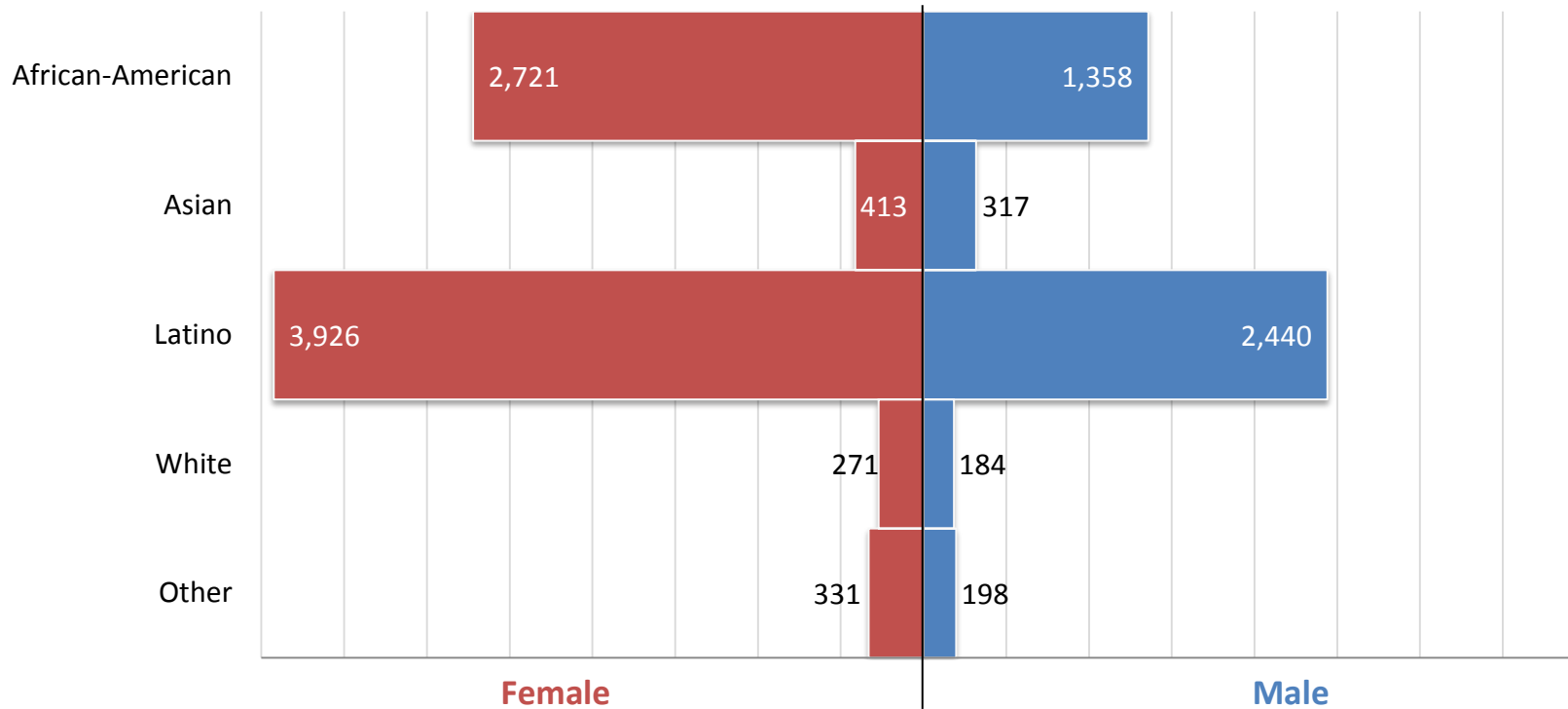

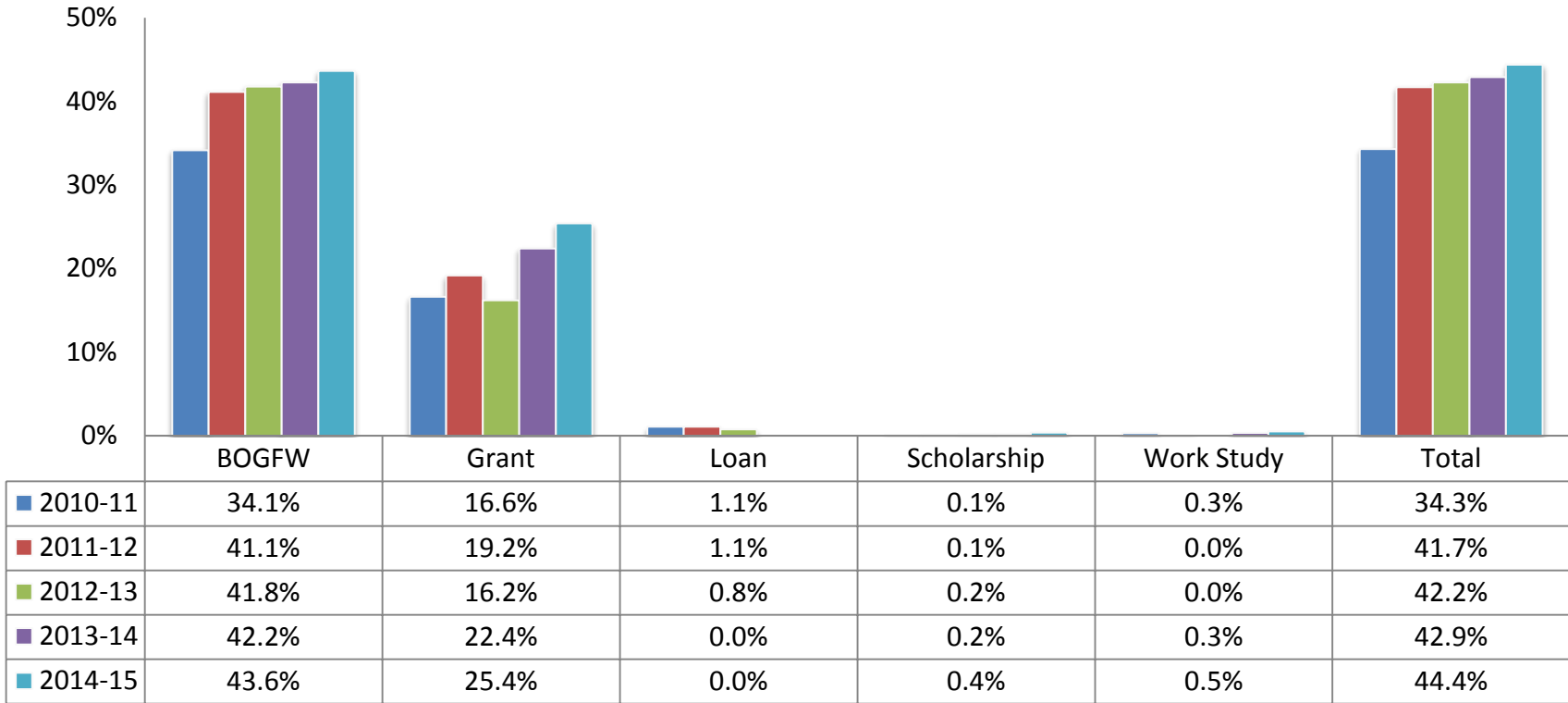

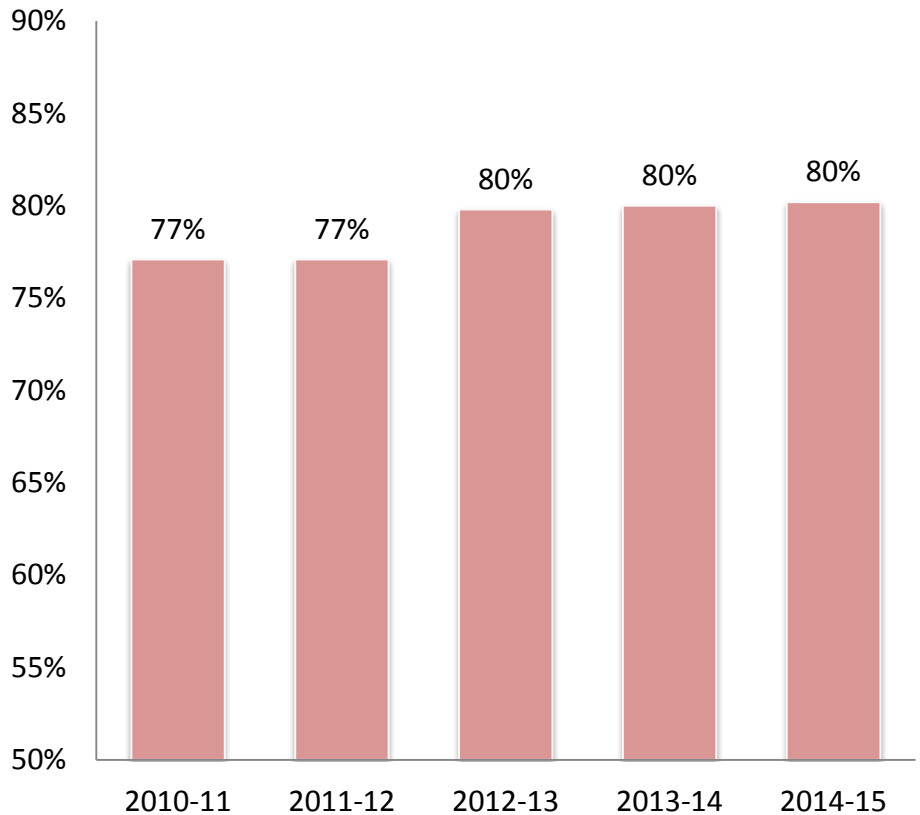
Compton Center has an Institution-Set Standard of 58% and an Institutional Effectiveness Outcome goal of 68% by the year 2019-2020.

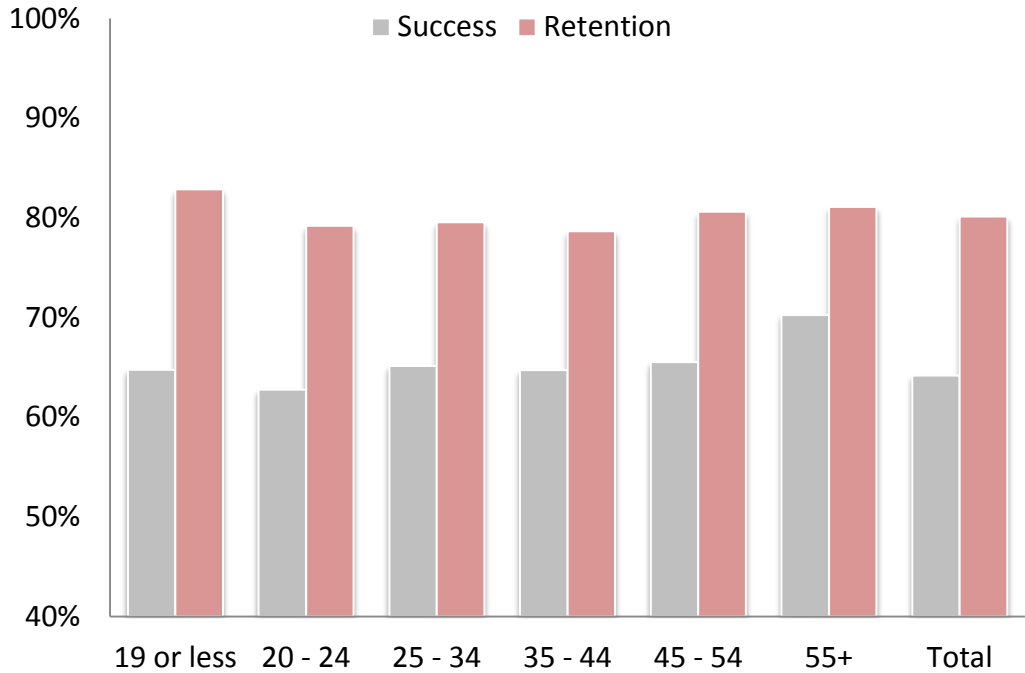

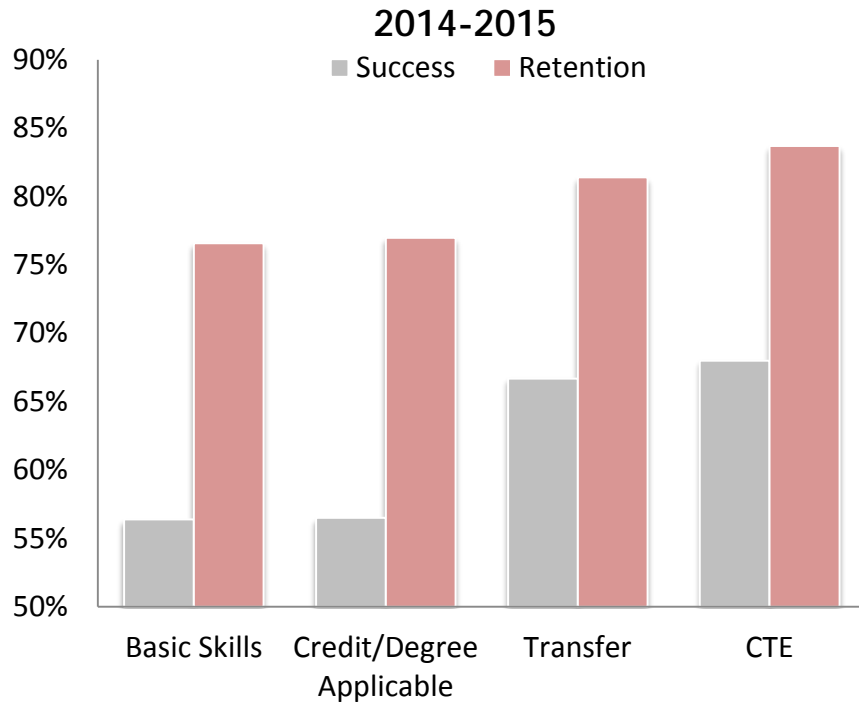
