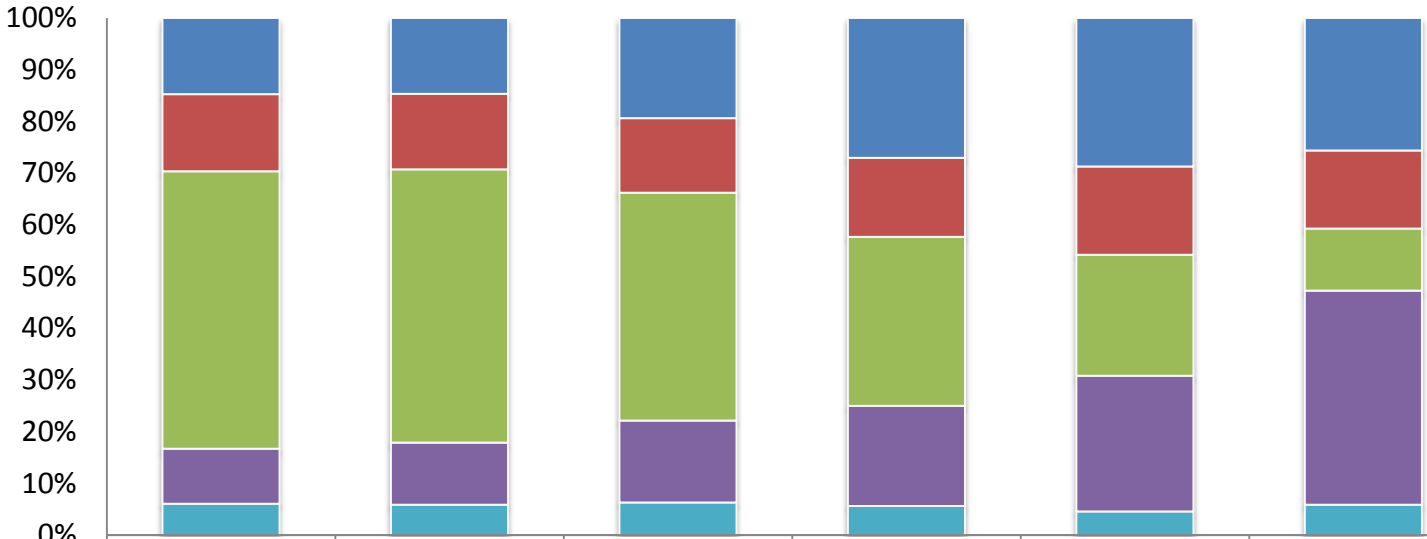

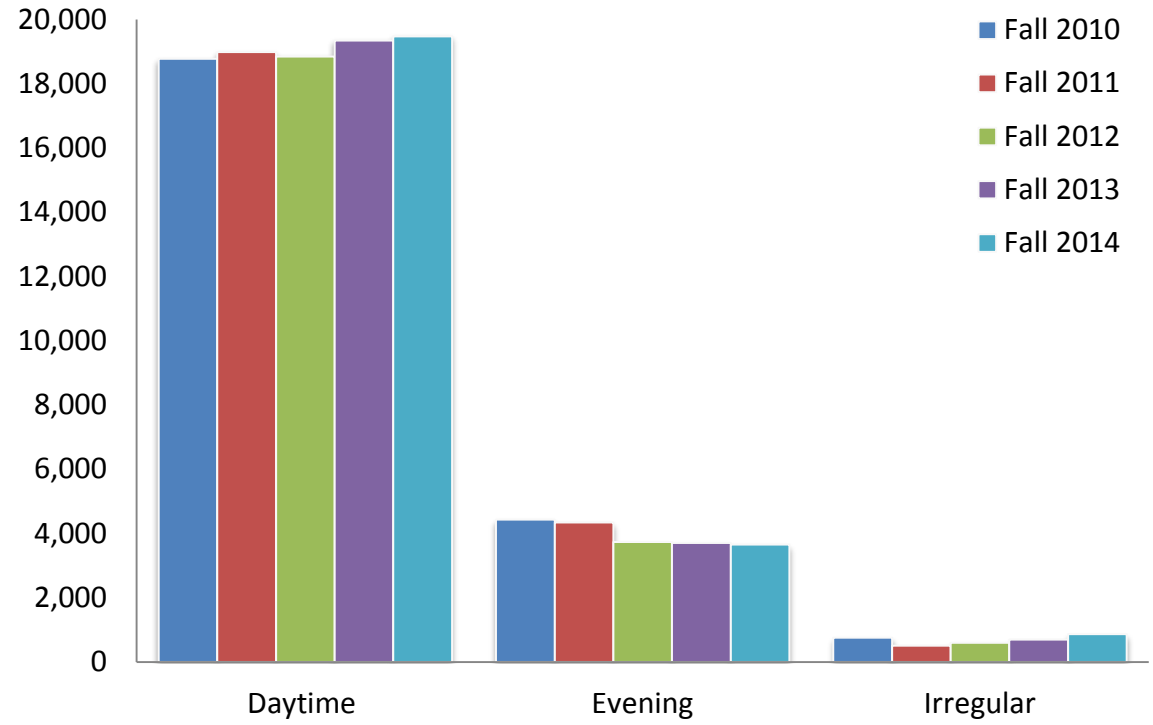

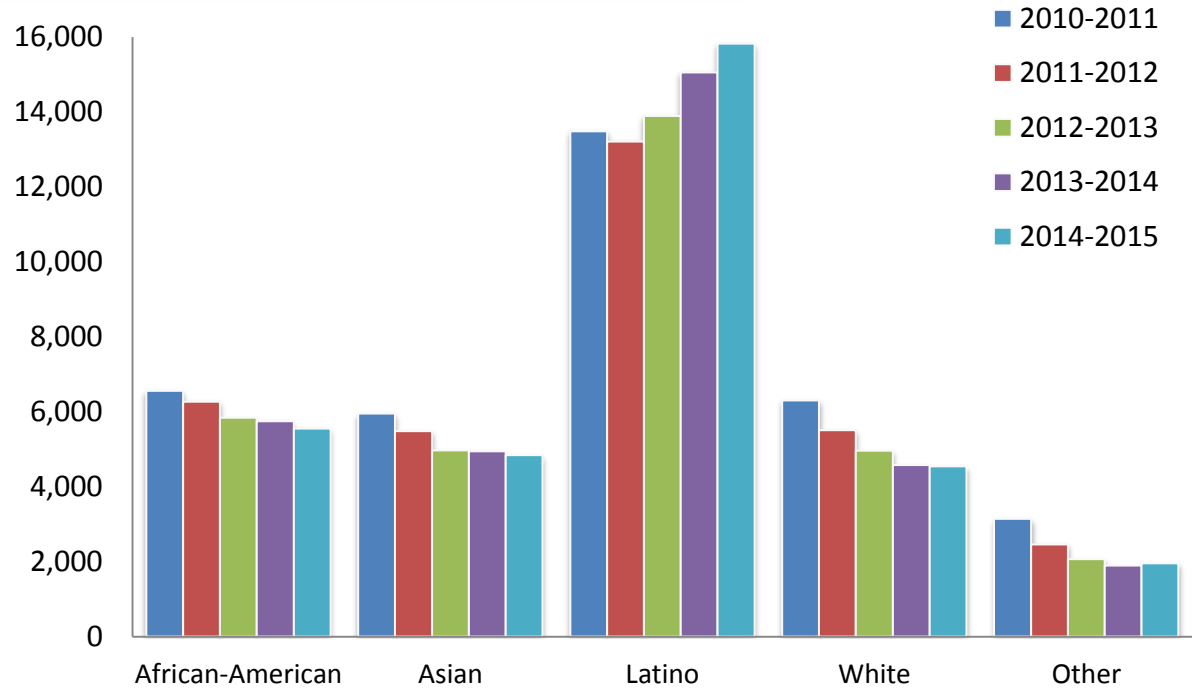
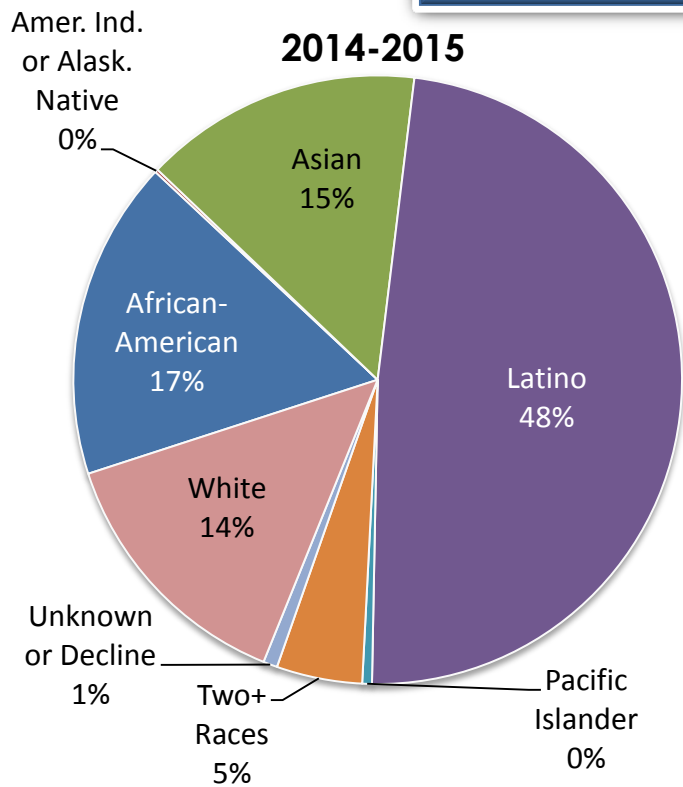
Enrollment by Day and Evening

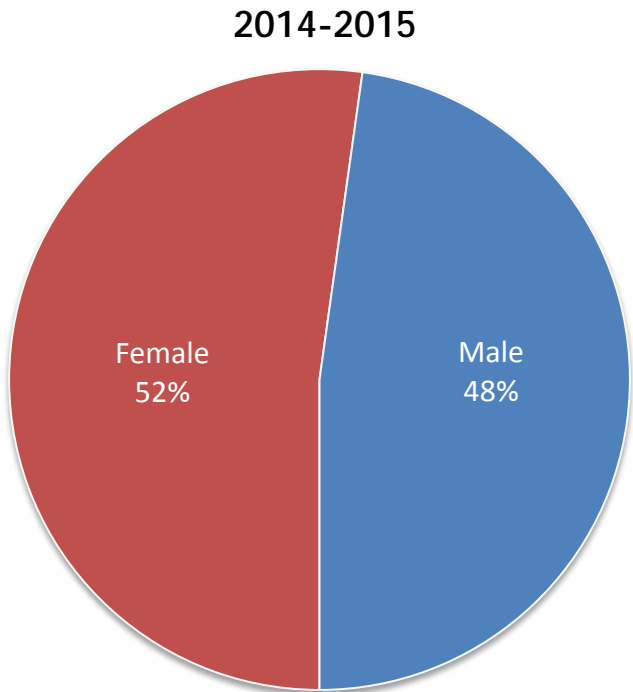

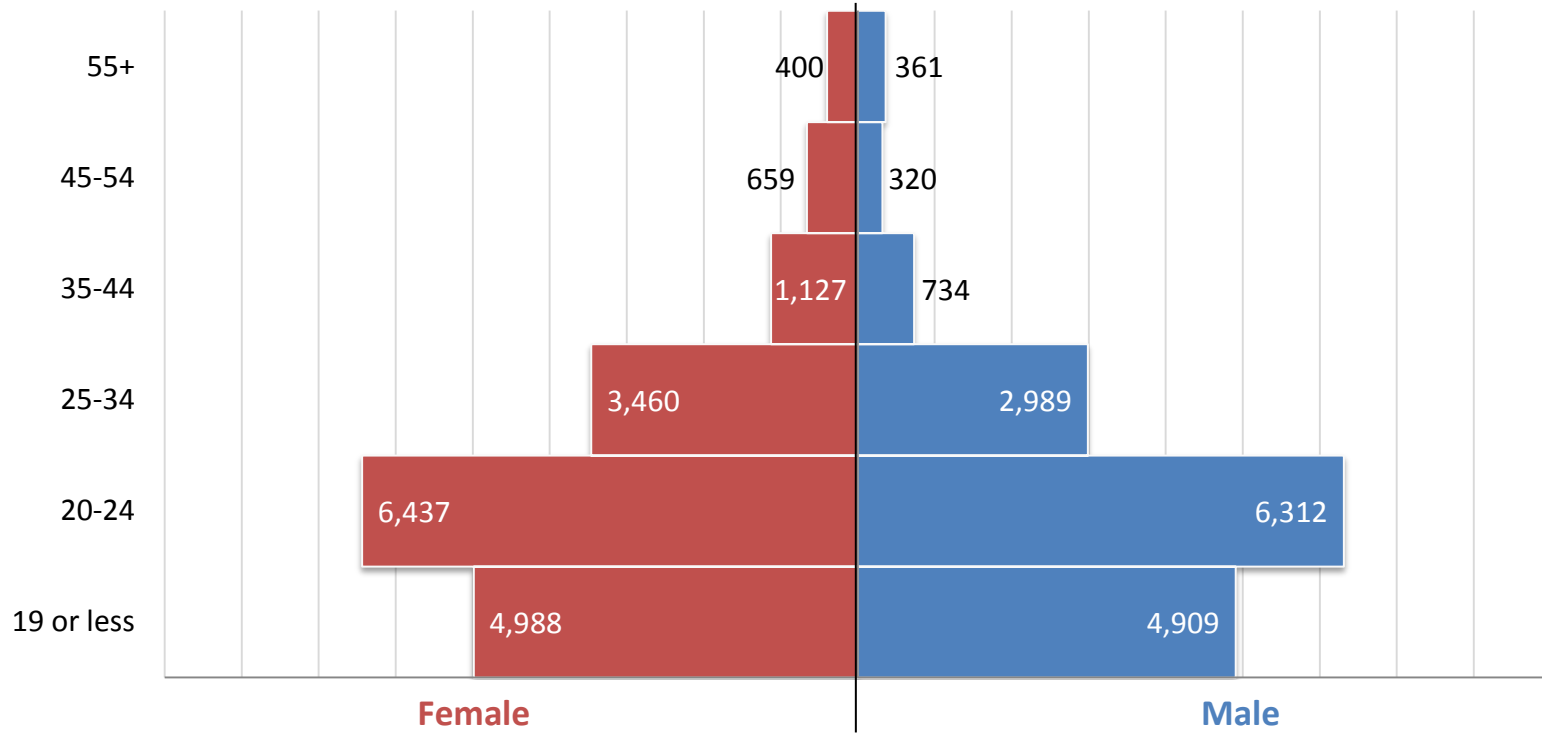
Enrollment by Gender

Enrollment – Gender by Age

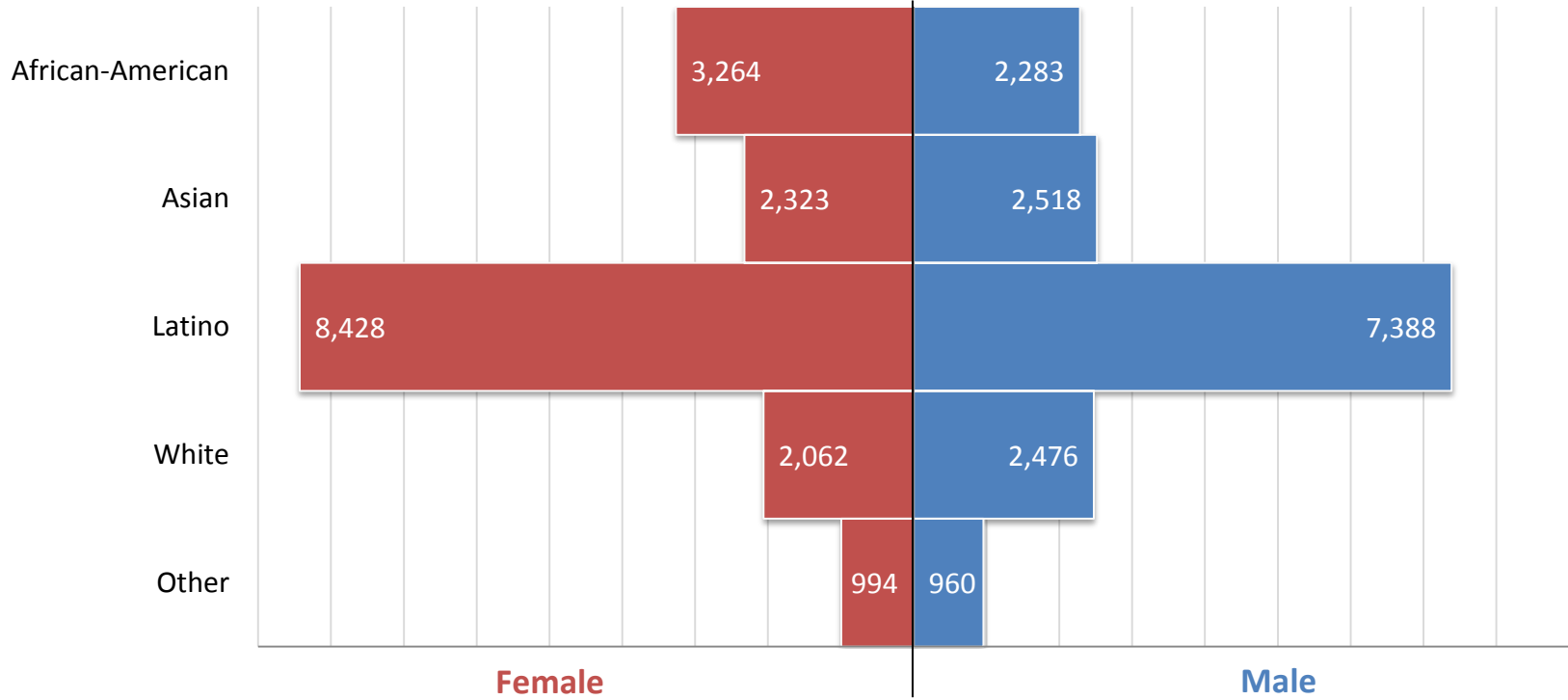

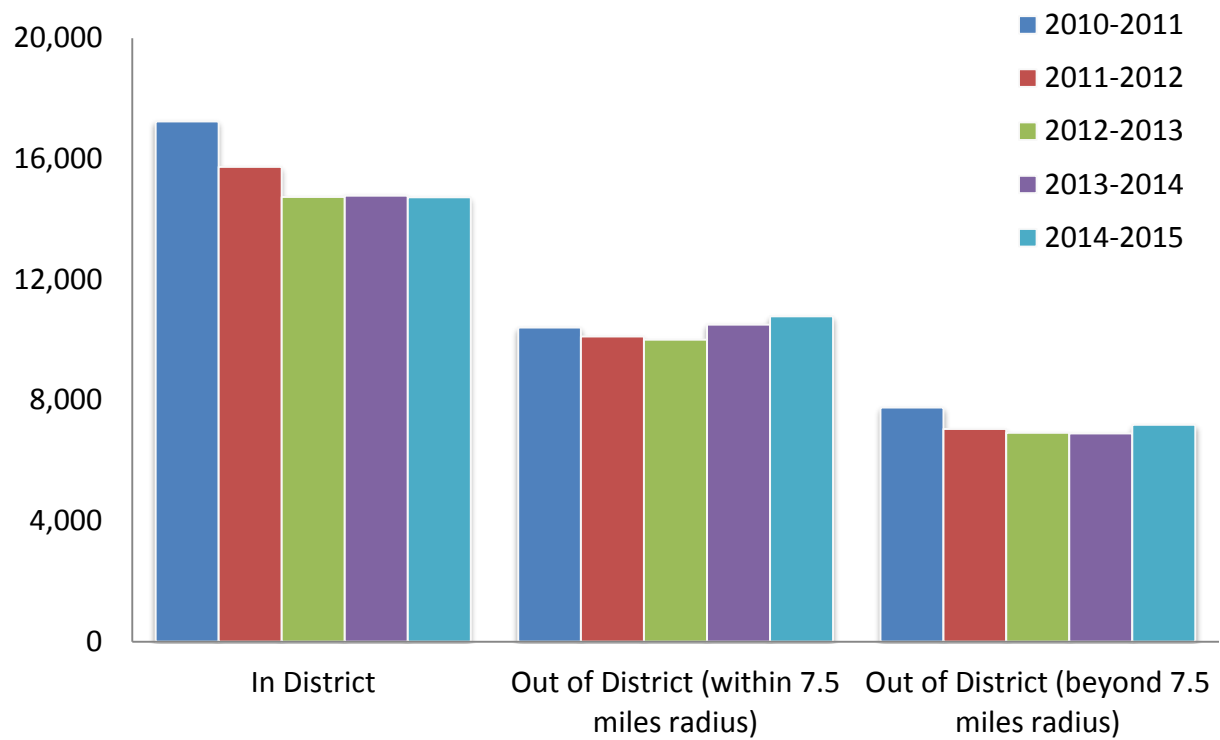
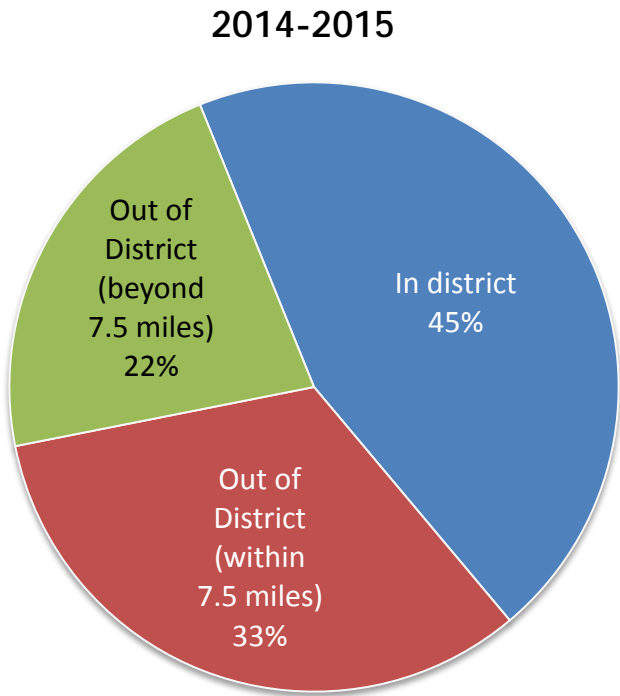
Enrollment – Gender by Ethnicity

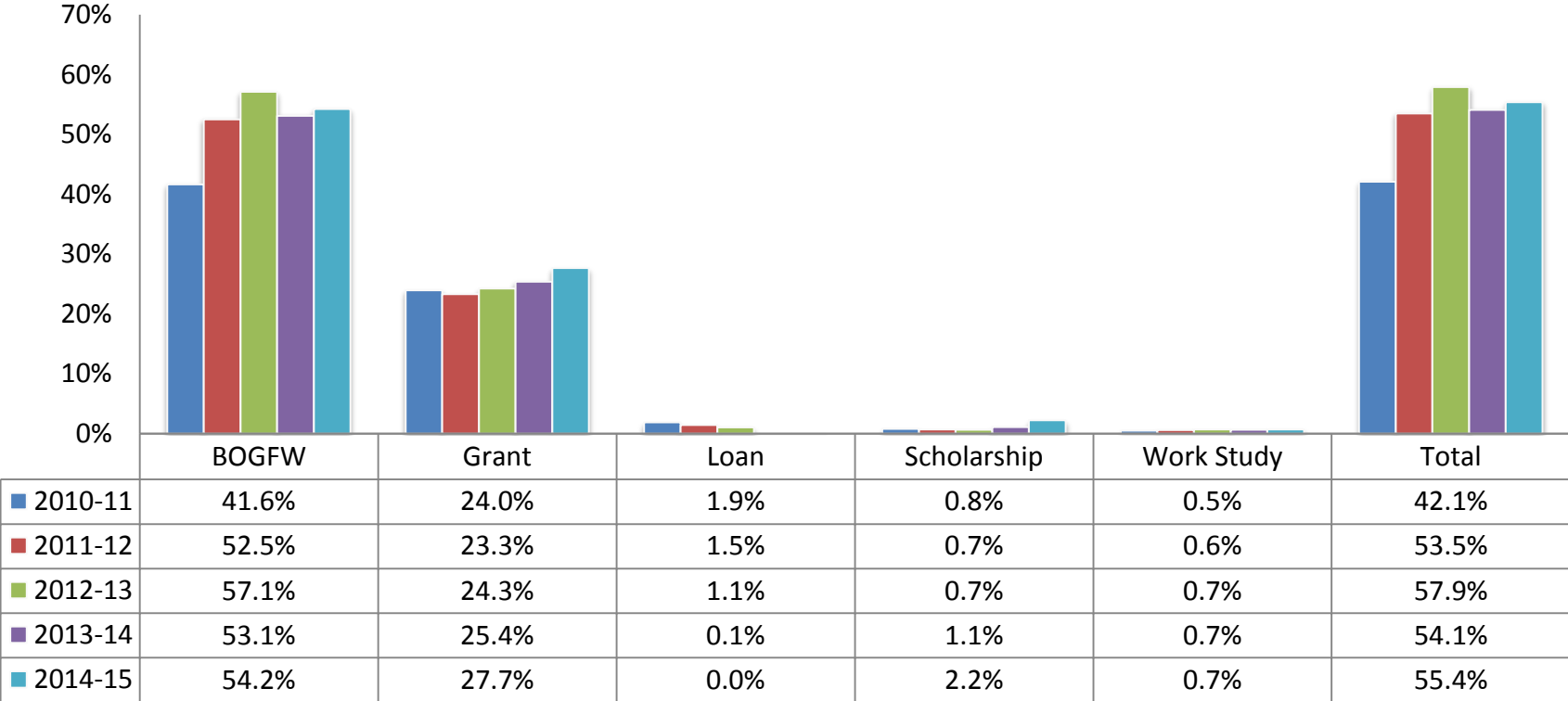

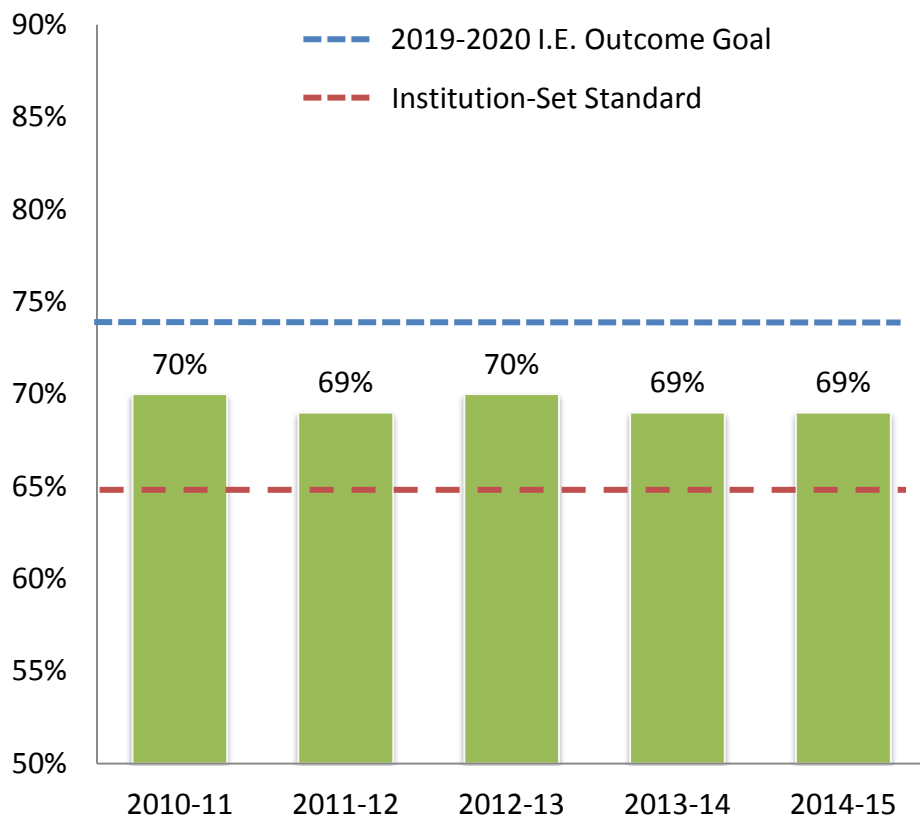

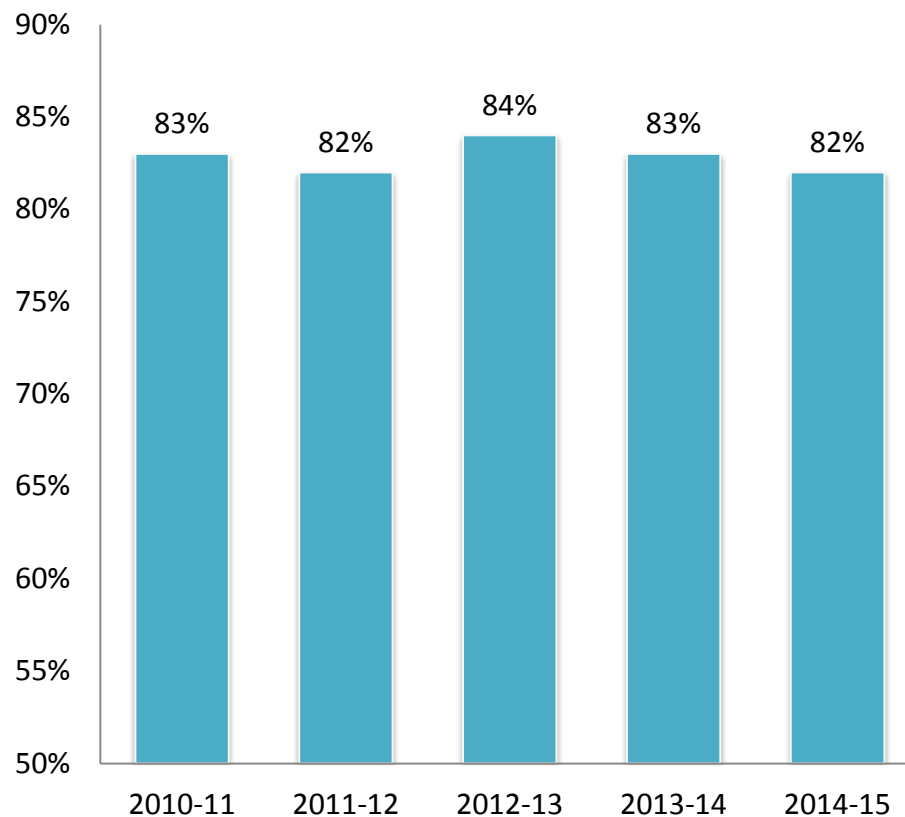
ECC has an ACCJC Institution-Set Standard of 65% and an Institutional Effectiveness Outcome goal of 74% by the year 2019-2020.

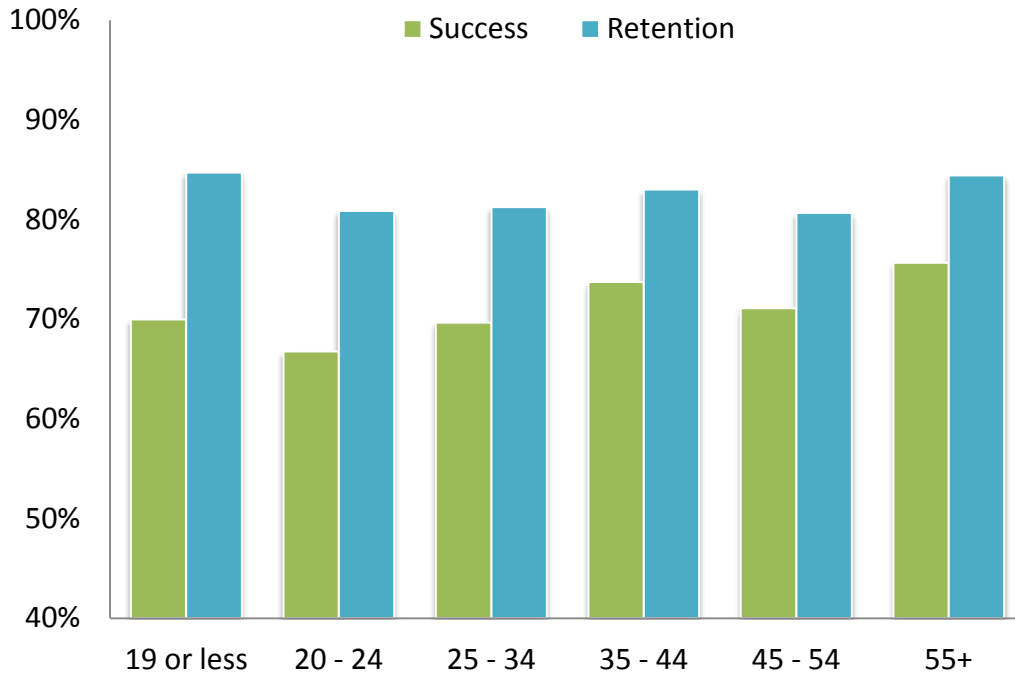

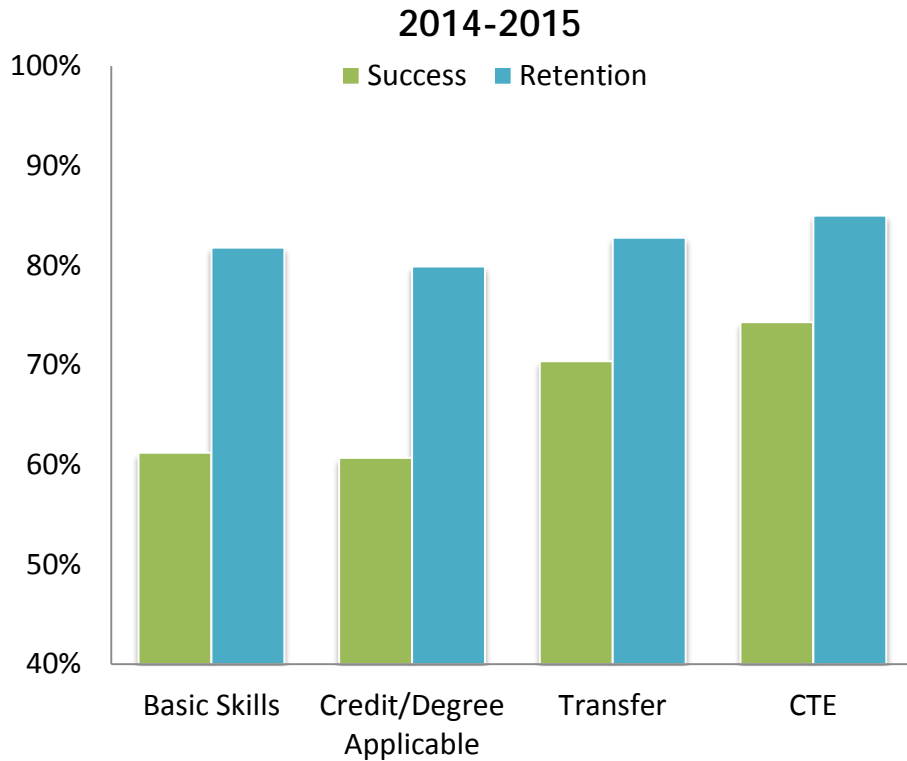

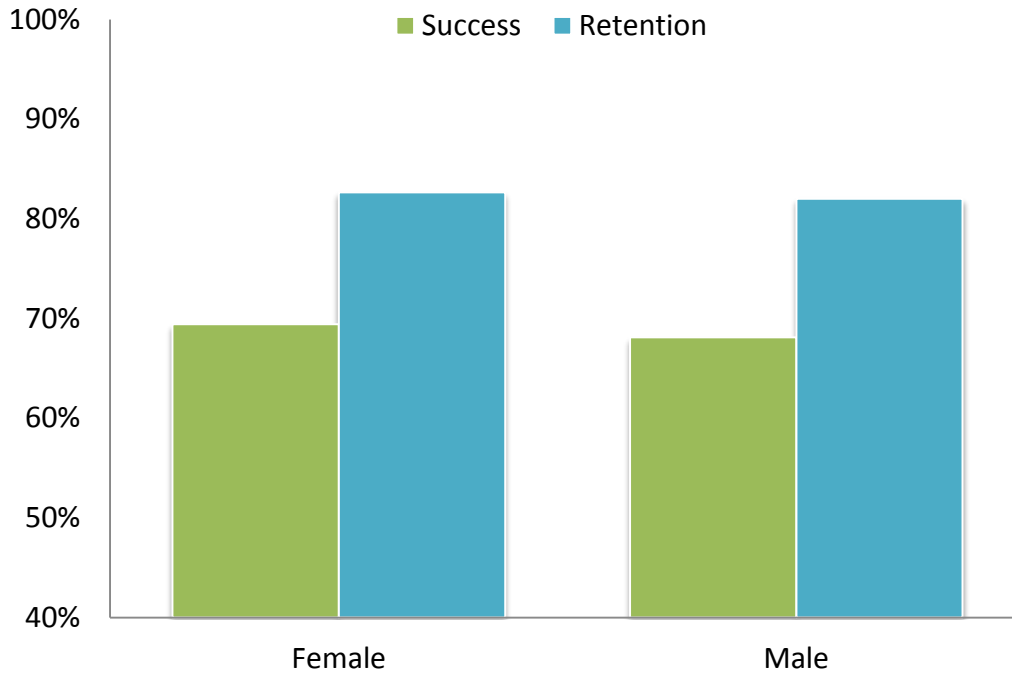
