

Age by Gender

Overall, about 36% more women than men attend ECC. The largest gender differences are among working adults (ages 40-54) with smaller differences among the high school (ages 15-19) and young adult populations (ages 20-24).





Ethnicity


El Camino College (ECC) is a broadly diverse campus which reflects the diversity of the district it serves. The college is considered a Hispanic-serving Institution, with Latinos representing the largest ethnic group on campus (49%). Sixteen percent of students are African-American, 14% are White and 15% are Asian.

Gender by Ethnicity

There are 39% more female than male African-American students that attend ECC. Looking at Latino students, there are about 12% more female than male students attending the college. On the other hand, 16% more male than female white students make up the student body.

Age by Ethnicity

The table below presents point measures of age for each ethnic group¹. Overall, ECC students have an average student age of 25, a median age of 21 and a mode of 19. The mean age tends to be considerably higher than the median due to a larger population of older-aged students. The mode ranges between 19 and 22, depending on the ethnic group.

In general, the American Indian/Alaskan Native, White, and unknown race tend to be older, while Latinos, Pacific Islanders, White, and students indicating two or more races are relatively younger than the ECC student population as a whole.



Age Distribution by Ethnicity (following page)

As suggested above, most ethnic groups at El Camino College represent varying percentages of the student body relative to age or age group. Latino students are more likely to be older while White students are more likely of traditional college ages and in their 20's and 30's. Less-pronounced variability is found among other ethnic groups.

The chart on the following page represents the *percentage* of students from each ethnicity within each age or age group. Smaller groups (American Indian/Alaskan Native) and unidentifiable groups (two or more races and unknown) were excluded from the chart but are found in the statistics table above.

¹ Definitions of descriptive statistics used to measure age: *mean* age is the average age, or the single age that best describes the ECC student body; *median* age is the age at which 50% of the ECC population lies above and below; and *mode* age is the single most common age.




^{*}This chart shows the percentage of each age group represented by the major ethnic groups at El Camino College. For example, 19 year-olds are 14% Asian, 14% African-American, 56% Latino and 11% White, compared with 30 to 39 year-olds who are 16% Asian, 22% African-American, 39% Latino and 17% White.

Citizenship and City of Residence

The majority of students at El Camino College are U.S. citizens. Over 96% of all students are officially California residents, and out of state residents comprise nearly 1%. The remaining 3% of the student body are international students from over 68 countries.

Forty-seven percent of ECC students reside in the El Camino Community College District. Thirty-three percent of students reside within 7.5 miles of the college while 20% live beyond a 7.5- mile radius of El Camino College.

Disability Status


About 5% of El Camino College students have a registered disability, with more females registered than males. The most common disability is mobility impairment, representing about 15% of disabilities registered, followed by psychological disabilities at 10%. Nearly half of students with a registered disability are categorized as "Other". This is due to changes in practices and consensus in the state of how to categorize certain disabilities.






Campus Enrollment Patterns

Courses at El Camino College are offered 7 days a week and during both daytime and evening hours to serve its district community. Fifty-one percent of students enroll in at least one daytime class, while 14% are enrolled exclusively in evening classes. There are about 10% of students enrolled in a combination of day and evening courses. The "irregular" percentage includes students enrolled exclusively in distance education courses.


On average, 17,412 students are on campus attending classes Monday through Thursday, with about less than half that number attending on Fridays.




Students on Campus by Day of the Week




Matriculation Educational Goal

The educational goal of enrolled students is captured on the initial application and may change over the course of a student's career. The largest percentage of students (51%) indicated an intention to transfer to a 4-year institution as their goal. Twenty-six percent of students indicated that they are undecided about their educational goal. Another 17% intend to earn a degree or certificate or be retrained or recertified in their respective fields.




Unit Load

Thirty-five percent of students are enrolled full-time (defined as carrying 12 units or more). Of the 65% of part-time students, 41% of those students are enrolled in fewer than 6 units.

Student Retention and Success

Student academic performance within a term can be measured in several ways. The most common methods are student *retention* (completing a course, regardless of final grade), *success* (completing a course with a C/Pass or better) and Grade Point Average (GPA).

Success and retention along with a course grade distribution are provided in the table below. In Fall 2014, students were retained at a rate of over 80%. About 68% succeeded by receiving a C/Pass or better in a course. The overall average term GPA is **2.67**.
