What can you expect in the first year?



Develop guiding structures; use qualitative and quantitative data to identify barriers and gaps (Fall-Winter)



Assess progress to date and institutional capacity (ICAT) for whole-college change (Winter-Spring)



Develop an action Plan with specific priorities, required resources and measurable goals (Late Spring)



Engage in coaching visits (Fall-Spring)





The Institutional Capacity Assessment Tool (ICAT) and Capacity Café Event



- Input from broad range of stakeholders
- Identify Institutional Strengths and Areas for Improvement
- Develop a common language to discuss institutional issues and focus the conversation
- Identify gaps in communications and perception



ICAT Survey Responses

- 157 responses
 - 25 administrators
 - 41 full-time faculty
 - 14 adjunct faculty
 - 71 staff member
 - 6 other

- 37% overall response rate (n=429)

83%- Clear and compelling vision
83%- President support for student success
83%- Institution addresses basic needs
77%- Measurable goals to advance equity
75%- Clear and compelling definition of equity
75%- Vision communicated regularly
