25% completed orientation online

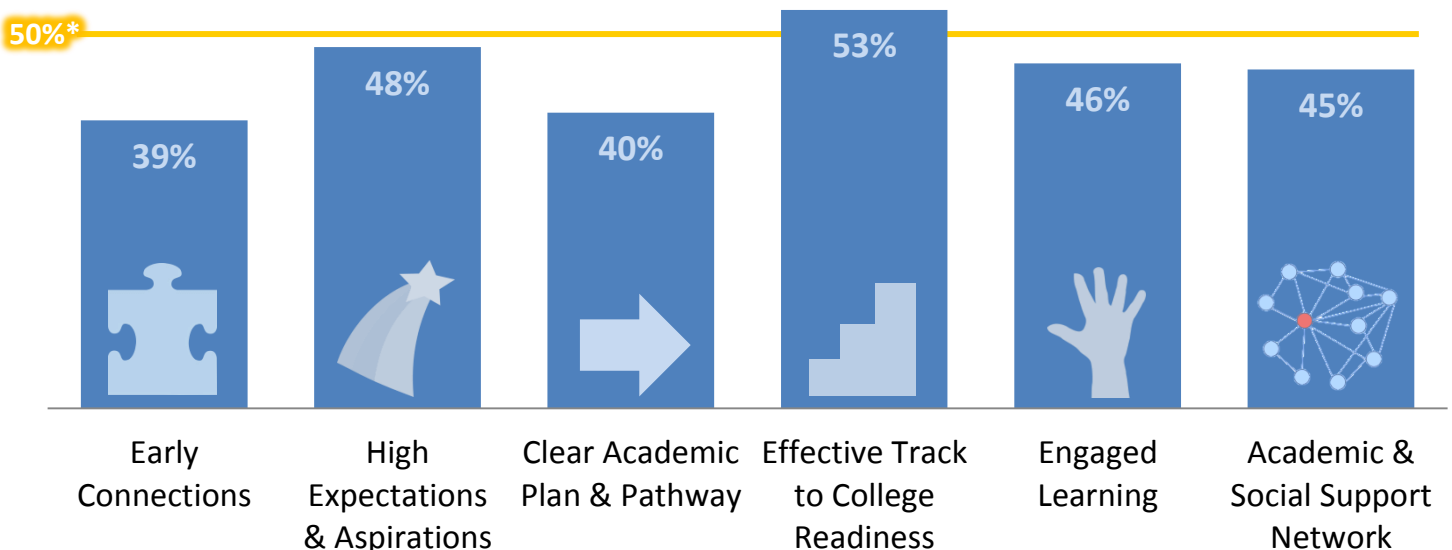
