5. 2022-2023 Schedule for the CCCD President/CEO Community Outreach and Recruitment Advisory Committee

A. Committee members agreed to the last Wednesday of each month at 5:00 p.m. through June 2023.

Commissioner Bruce Boyden recommended the child development consortium credential. It is a good avenue for high school students and can start as early as 10th grade and can make them employable by the end of high school. Dr. Keith Curry said we will follow up. Commissioner Boyden recommends starting to engage students at 8th or 9th grade. Tours are an excellent idea to show the environment of the college. Sheri Berger shared dual enrollment information. Commissioner Boyden said that since those programs are already in place, we should brainstorm on how to maximize the programs that exist, expand them, and engage more students.

Stephanie Leonor said it is important that Compton College is persistent, that basic information is given to the community, and recommends having accountability partners or a department that follows up on

incomplete applications. While attending a conference in Sacramento, Stephanie Leonor said there was discussion about colleges doing more social media advertising. Due to Covid-19, classes were only available online and there was a huge advantage to be enrolled in online classes. Stephanie Leonor highly recommends continuing with the online classes. Sheri Berger said that approximately 160 of 492 classes are online classes, so roughly a third of all classes are online classes. It is a goal of Academic Affairs to gather data on which programs are offered completely online. Stephanie Leonor congratulated employees at Compton College and how students can reach out and be heard. Stephanie Leonor is currently a student at University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), and feels that being a student at Compton College prepared her well for UCLA.

Paulette Gipson asked if we partner with Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) to attend Compton College before transferring to an HBCU. Dr. Curry replied that we have the caravan coming to our campus in a few weeks, we held a summer program at Clark Atlanta, and we are also working with Charles Drew University on a three-year bachelor's degree program that will start next fall.

Biviano Favela said debt is a concern, so people are looking for certificate programs and going straight to work. Audio/Visual Production could draw a lot of students, pays well, and is in demand in Southern California. Sheri Berger responded that we have applied for an apprenticeship grant through the Chancellor's Office of California Community Colleges, and we are waiting for approval. It is in the commercial music and audio recording department. We are working with industry partners to provide internship opportunities once the program commences.

Heather Parnock dropped a link in the chat to the complete list of degrees and certificates offered at Compton College on pages 71-73 of the 2022-2023 Course Catalog.

Follow up information from this meeting will be sent to the committee.

The next meeting will include a presentation on dual enrollment, information about potential new programs, follow up on the request for an early childhood education dual enrollment program, and potential jobs in the workforce data.

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
