Compton College Entering Student 30 Units Completed by the End of First Year



Stella and Charles Guttman Community College


- <u>Guttman Community College</u> was a new CUNY college designed around <u>Guided Pathways</u> <u>Principles</u>.
- All first-time students are required to attend a summer bridge program, to enroll full-time, and to follow a common first-year curriculum intended to help them explore careers and choose a major.
- Remedial instruction is embedded into collegecredit coursework.

Stella and Charles Guttman Community College

- Second year, students are required to choose a program of study in a limited number of fields identified as promising based on New York City labor market data.
- By August 2014, 28 percent of Guttman's inaugural 2012 entering class had completed an associate degree, and the college reported that it is on track to meet its three-year goal of graduating 35 percent of its students.
- The median three-year graduation rate for community colleges in large cities is 13 percent.

Compton College Accreditation

- Submit <u>Quality Focus Essay</u> to ACCJC for review and approval by November 30, 2017.
- Prepared a <u>timeline</u> for completion of our next and final step, which includes El Camino Community College District and the Compton Community College District submitting a substantive change proposal to ACCJC requesting the Compton District assume authority over Compton College.
- Receive notification from ACCJC regarding Substantive Change Proposal – Change in Control (Fall 2018/Winter 2019).
- Compton College offers summer term under the authority of CCCD (Summer 2019).
