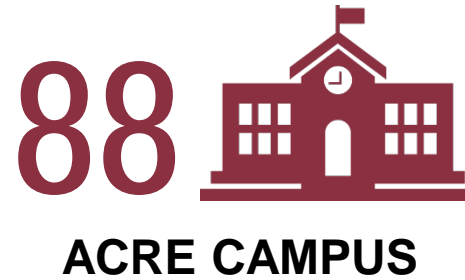
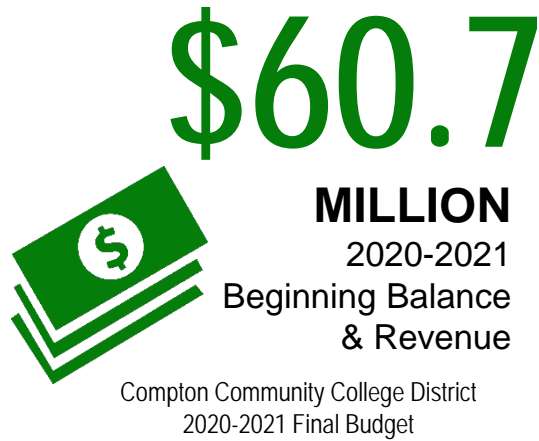

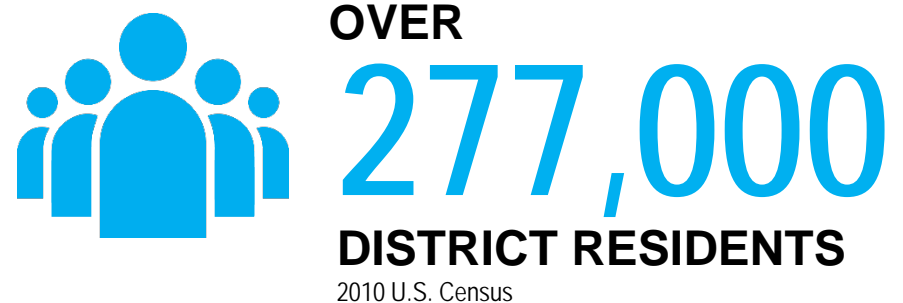

HISTORY OF HBCU'S

- **The first Historically Black Colleges (HBCUs) were established prior to the Civil War.**
 - Cheyney University of Pennsylvania (1837)
 - Lincoln University in Pennsylvania (1854)
 - Wilberforce University in Ohio (1856).
- However, most Historically Black Colleges and Universities were established after the American Civil War. By 1902, 85 HBCU's had been established.
- **Currently there are 105** Historically Black Colleges and Universities located mainly in the south and on the east coast.
- HBCU's were established because most colleges and universities denied admission to African Americans.
- **Quick Fact:** A few HBCUs have student populations that are not predominantly black, i.e. Bluefield State College in West Virginia reports 86% of its student body is white and about 10% identify as black.

WHY CONSIDER AN HBCU

- Low teacher to student ratio
- Most classes are taught by professors not teaching assistants
- Long term income earnings are higher for students who attended HBCUs. (Huffingtonpost.com 5/27/16)
- Memorable social experiences such as battle of the bands, step shows, and homecoming.
- Competitive Tuition Costs
- Longer Application Periods
- Graduate School Opportunities and Employment Opportunities
- Diversity – students from all over the US and the world

HBCU TRANSFER AGREEMENT PROJECT

Guaranteed Admission for any California Community College student who completes one of the following:



A transfer level Associate Degree* awarded by a California Community College with a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5

OR



A minimum 30 transferrable semester units with a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher.



*The degree must include both the completion and certification of lower division Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education Breadth pattern (CSU GE)

IGETC is a general education pattern that will meet all lower-division general education requirements at most California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) campuses. Completion of the IGETC is not a requirement for admission to the CSU or UC, nor will its completion guarantee admission to a CSU or UC campus. The IGETC pattern is not the only way to fulfill lower-division general education requirements; depending on the major or field of interest, it may or may not be advantageous to fulfill the general education breadth of the specific CSU or UC campus.

UC transfer minimum eligibility for admission: 1) Complete 60 UC transferable units, 2) Earn a minimum GPA of 2.4 (many UC campuses require a higher GPA to be competitive, consult with a counselor for details), 3) Complete a specific pattern of courses: two transferable English composition courses (UC-E), one transferable math course (UC-M), and four courses from two different areas in Arts and Humanities, Social and Behavioral Sciences, and Physical and Biological Sciences.

*****Please consult with a counselor to determine whether IGETC is appropriate for your educational goals.*****

General rules for using IGETC:

- Each course must have IGETC approval at the time it was taken. See www.assist.org for a list of certified courses and approval dates.
- All courses must be passed with a "C" or higher. A "P" (Pass) is acceptable, but UC permits no more than 14 transferable semester units to be completed on a Pass/No Pass basis. Note: P = "C" or better.
- Community college courses have limitations on the amount of credit awarded by the receiving university. See a counselor and www.assist.org for details.
- International records may not be used toward IGETC.
- For full certification, students must complete 12 units of General Education at Compton College (CC). Requests for certification should be submitted to the Admissions Office, during the students' final semester.
- Coursework (transcripts) from other regionally accredited universities and colleges must be on file at CC.

TRANSFER ADMISSION ELIGIBILITY:

A transfer student will be required to complete 60 CSU transferable units including a minimum of 30 semester/45 quarter units in general education (GE) courses with a minimum GPA of 2.0; this includes completion of Areas A1, A2, A3, and B4 (the "Golden 4") with a grade of C- or higher in each course (nine units from English composition, oral communications, critical thinking and three units from quantitative reasoning).

CERTIFICATION:

Compton College (CC) will certify students who have completed the lower division general education requirements. Certification is important as students who transfer without certification will be held responsible for the transfer institution's general education pattern. Students who have completed courses at other regionally accredited colleges are advised to see a counselor regarding "pass-along" of courses; transcripts from other regionally accredited universities and colleges need to be on file at CC. Foreign coursework not from a US-regionally accredited institution may not be used for certification on the CSU breadth requirements. For full certification, students must complete 12 units of General Education at CC. Requests for certification should be submitted to the Admissions and Records Office, during the student's final semester.

STUDENT NEXT STEPS

- ▶ Determine when you plan to transfer (min. 30 units or with Transfer Level AA/AS Degree).
- ▶ Meet with a counselor to evaluate all of your college transcripts.
- ▶ Obtain the promo code from counselor to complete the online Common Black College Application (CBCA)- ASAP
- ▶ For non-CBCA institutions – apply directly to the schools (on website).
- ▶ Mail all official transcripts immediately to each school that you have applied.
- ▶ Be sure to check the email account you provided on the application for updates and any additional requests.
