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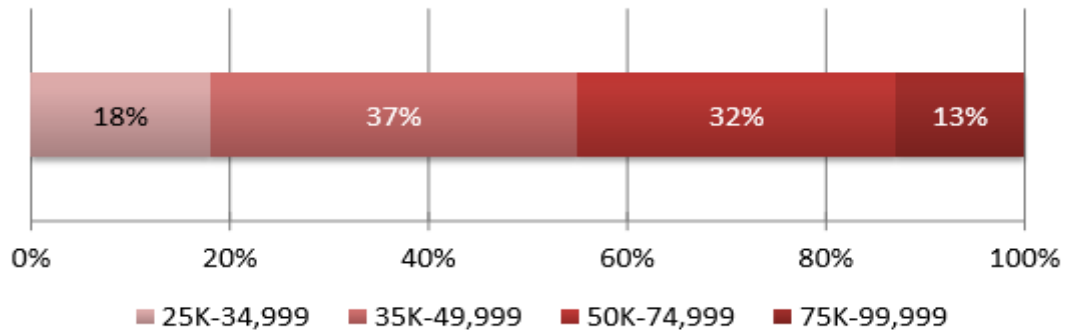
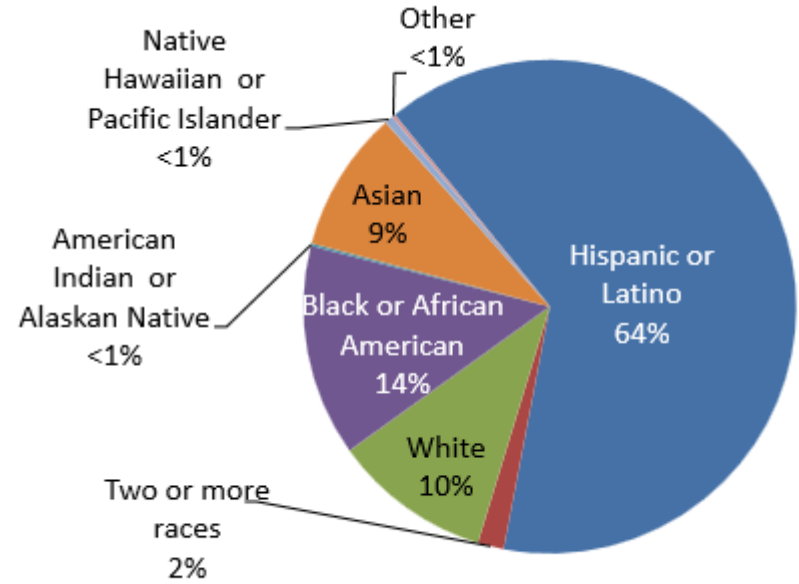
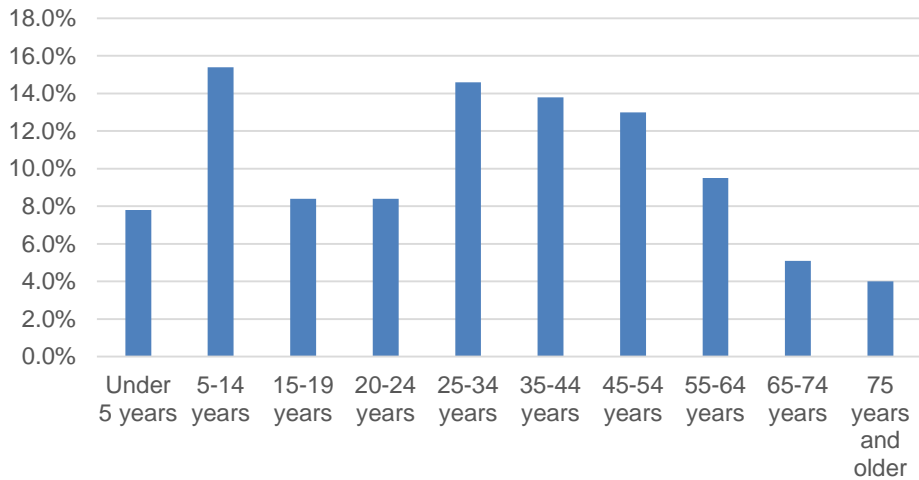
Compton College Glance

- Compton College is the 114th California Community College and achieved accreditation on June 7, 2017.
- Compton College serves the following communities Compton, Lynwood, Paramount and Willowbrook, as well as portions of Athens, Bellflower, Carson, Downey, Dominguez, Lakewood, Long Beach, and South Gate.
- Compton College offers 41 associate degrees and 38 certificates.
- Compton College enrollment reached 11,510 students in 2018-2019.



CCCD Demographics

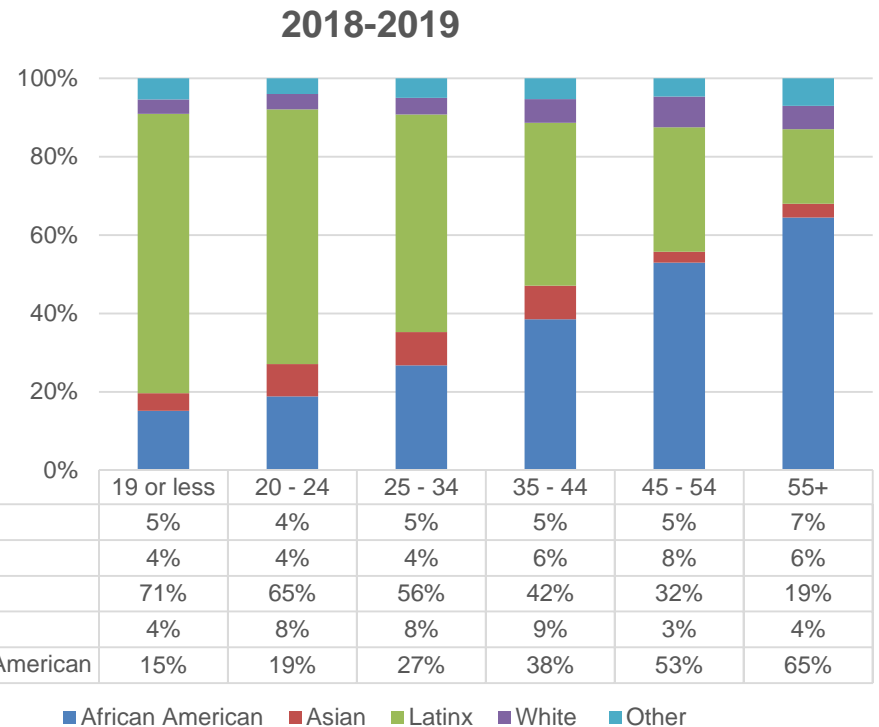
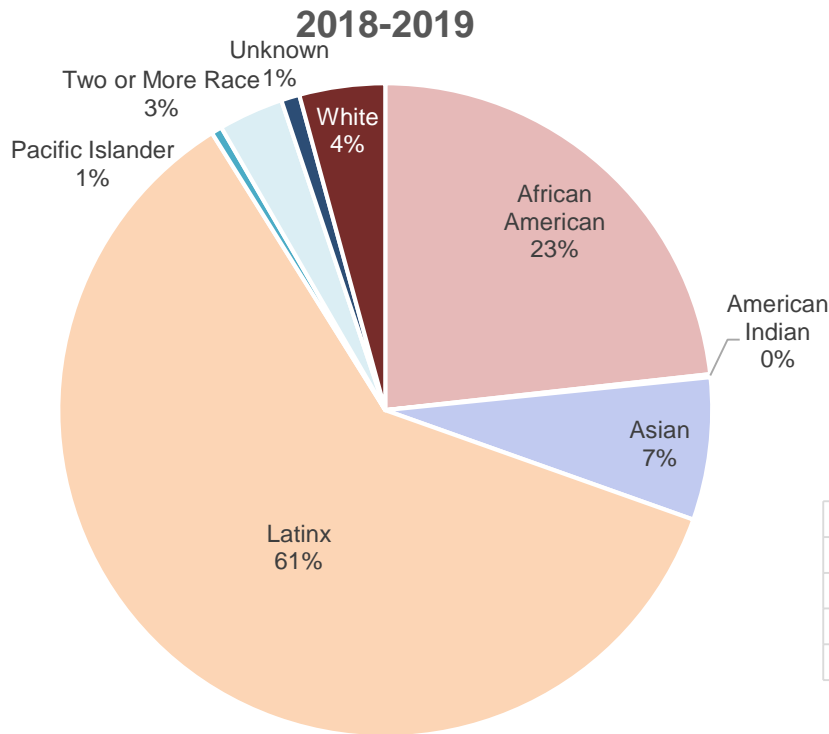
Service Area Population

Compton College Ethnicity



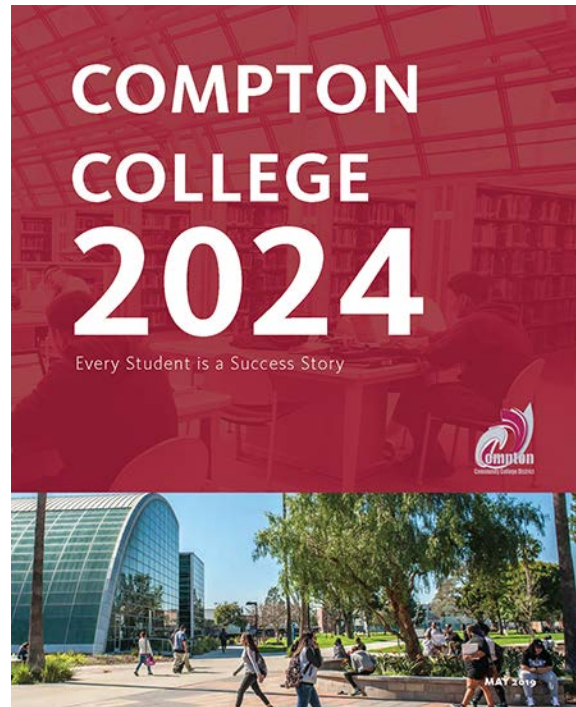

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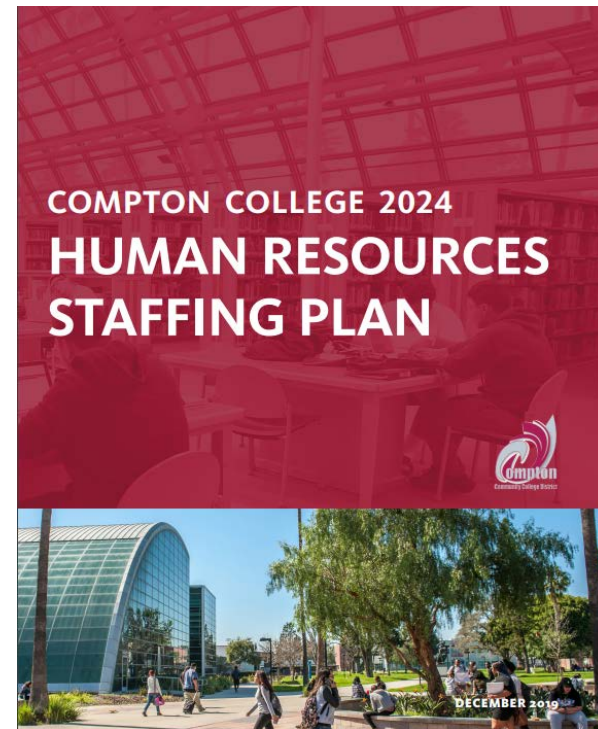

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2020-2021 Compton College Goals

1. Implement Tartar Completion by Design to ensure all students complete more quickly with less units, transfer, and are employed in their field of study.
2. Maintain Student Enrollment at 5,980 Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) for the 2020-2021 year.
3. Complete all Compton College Accreditation efforts.

2020-2021 Compton College Goals

4. Continue to improve facilities to support student learning and success.
5. Continue to develop and enhance partnerships with schools, colleges, universities, businesses, and community-based organizations to respond to the educational, workforce training and economic development need.
6. Create a stronger sense of connection among employees, students, college, and the community.



2020-2021 BUDGET



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2021 California State Budget

- No Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) in the 2020-2021 Budget.
- State budget preserves funding for most categorical programs at 2019-2020 levels.
- A new \$120 million block grant to help Districts cover costs related to COVID-19 pandemic.
- \$10 million funding for legal services support for immigrant students, faculty and staff.
- \$5.8 million to fund Dreamer Resource Liaisons services.
- Compton College Physical Education Complex Replacement was included in the 2020-2021 Budget.



FACILITIES UPDATE



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Completed Facilities Projects

The Compton Community College District grounds continue to improve thanks to funds from Measure CC and Measure C supported by voters in 2002 and 2014, respectively. Projects completed in the last three years include:

- **Student Health Center:** installation of a modular building to house the Student Health Center. Completed: March 2017.
- **Music Building North Wing & Little Theater:** the \$3 million Music Building renovation project included upgrades to the 220-seat Little Theater. Completed: December 2016.
- **Cosmetology Facility:** installation of a modular building in Tartar Village to house the new cosmetology program. Completed: August 2016.

Completed Facilities Projects

- **Allied Health Building:** construction on a new \$12 million, state-of-the-art Allied Health Building to house the nursing and child development programs. Completed: December 2015
- **Football Stadium and Track:** renovation of the existing football field and track and installation of new synthetic turf on the field. Completed: September 2015
- **Public Safety Building:** a groundbreaking ceremony occurred in July 2018 for construction of a \$4.7 million, all-new building to house the Compton District Police Department. Estimated Completion: July 2019.

Current Construction Projects

- **Instructional Building 1:** The \$18.8 million project includes the removal of Row Buildings G, half of F, two-thirds of E, and Modular Buildings M1 and M2 (total of six structures) and replace them with a new, state-of-the-art instructional building. Estimated Completion: Spring 2021
- **Instructional Building 2:** this \$25.6 million project involves the removal of Row Building D, and the remainder of Row E and F buildings, and construction of a second state-of-the-art instructional building on campus. Estimated Completion: Fall 2021
- **Student Services Building:** a \$20.4 million facility will become a one-stop hub for all student services. The project involves the demolition of the old Library building, and construction of the new Student Services Building. Estimated Completion: Winter 2021

Promise students will:

- *Receive **Guaranteed Admission***
- Receive **waived enrollment fees** during the first two years of college for enrolling in 12 units at Census
- Receive **up to \$400 a year for books and course supplies** during their first two years
- Receive a **free tablet/laptop** upon successful completion of their first year at Compton College and enrollment in 12 units at Census during their third semester
- Be eligible to receive support services through the **Compton College Graduate Advantage** if they meet the specific requirements for admission to UC Irvine through the Transfer Admission Guarantee



The Pledge continued...

- Assistance to complete the required **Registration Steps**
- **Priority Registration** at Compton College before graduating from high school
- Participation in **Support Programs** such as First Year Experience and Extended Opportunity Programs and Services
- **Financial Fit Plan** to assess all available **Financial Aid**
- **Summer Bridge** classes to assist with college-level English and math placement
- Receive **Early College & Career Planning** beginning in the 6th grade
- **“To & Through Pledge”** in middle school students with the support of their parents
