

GP Journey Template

CEO Leadership Conference Session:

Equity at the Heart of Guided Pathways

A GP journey slide that visually communicates the journey your college has taken to implement Guided Pathways can serve as an institutional artifact to support sensemaking and implementation.

As you think about what to share, consider your audience (avoid jargon if it will be public). Also, consider all the efforts that fall within any of the four GP pillars. Not all efforts to increase equitable outcomes may be thought of as "Guided Pathways" but making connections between efforts clear is essential to implementation & integration. Think about how you will include these various efforts (i.e. AB705, Equity, etc.).











GP Journey Template

Consider sharing

- How the student experience has transformed since implementation
- Problems the institution is trying to solve (i.e., GP goals that link to increasing equitable outcomes for students, Vision For Success)
- Efforts to engage stakeholders (i.e., student voices, cross functional teams, de -siloing communication/ collaboration)
- How GP pillars have been addressed so far
- Tools, resources & innovations (existing or developed that have been utilized to aid GP implementation)
- Early indicators (Data on implementation efforts so far)
- Biggest lessons learned (What's gone well, challenges you've faced, how they've been addressed)
- Next steps
- Advice for other colleges











GP Journey Template

Visualizing Your Guided Pathways Journey:

- A visual representation of your college GP journey may take the form of a mind map, a flow chart, etc. Feel free to be creative while also maintaining clarity.
- You may choose to design the visualization in chronological order (prior to GP, year 1, year 2, Year 3, etc.) or you can organize it in a way that reflects your college process/ experience.
- Resource:
 - Canva offers multiple options for infographics and presentation slides. Once in Canva, a search for templates on Roadmap or Process Flowresults in lots of examples. A search for infographics can provide images you may consider useful.






