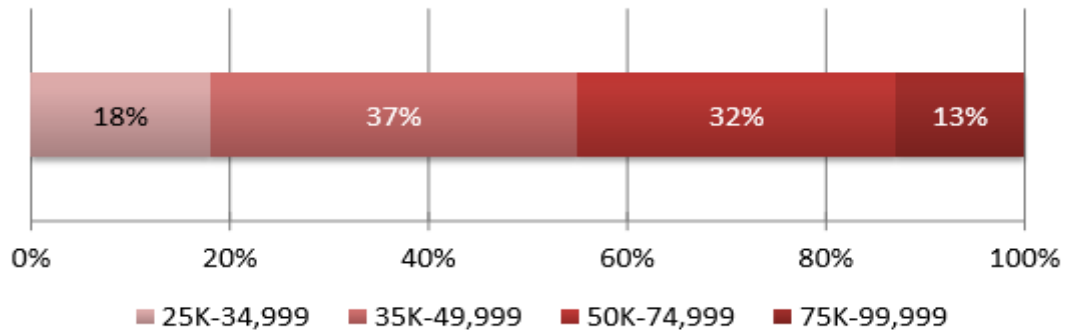
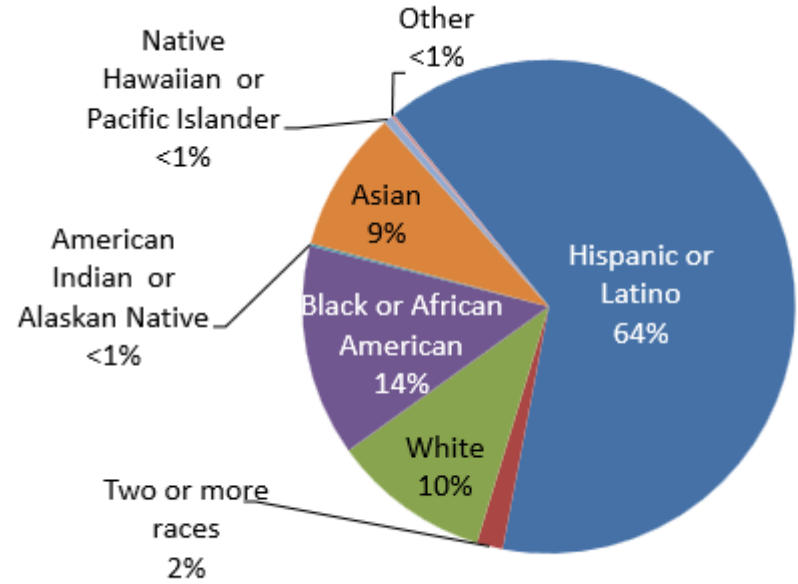
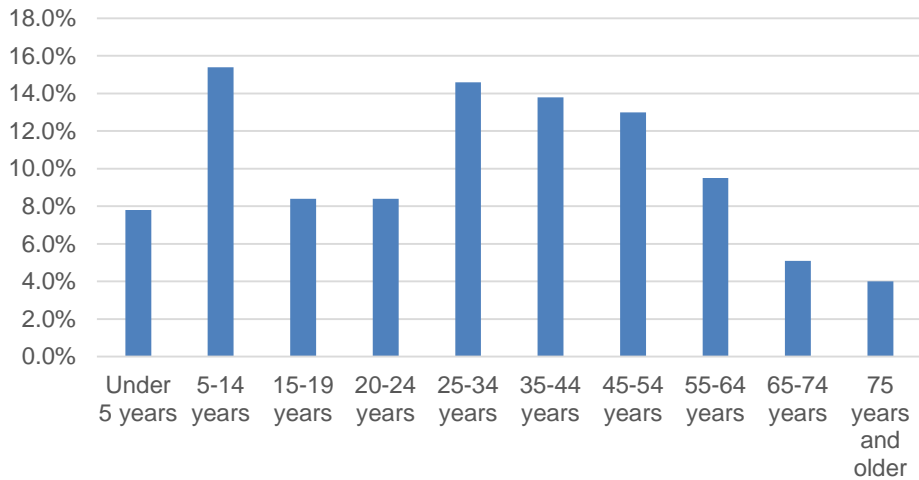
# Compton College Glance

- Compton College is the 114th California Community College and achieved accreditation on June 7, 2017.
- Compton College serves the following communities Compton, Lynwood, Paramount and Willowbrook, as well as portions of Athens, Bellflower, Carson, Downey, Dominguez, Lakewood, Long Beach, and South Gate.
- Compton College offers 41 associate degrees and 38 certificates.
- Compton College enrollment currently averages 12,000 students.



# CCCD Demographics

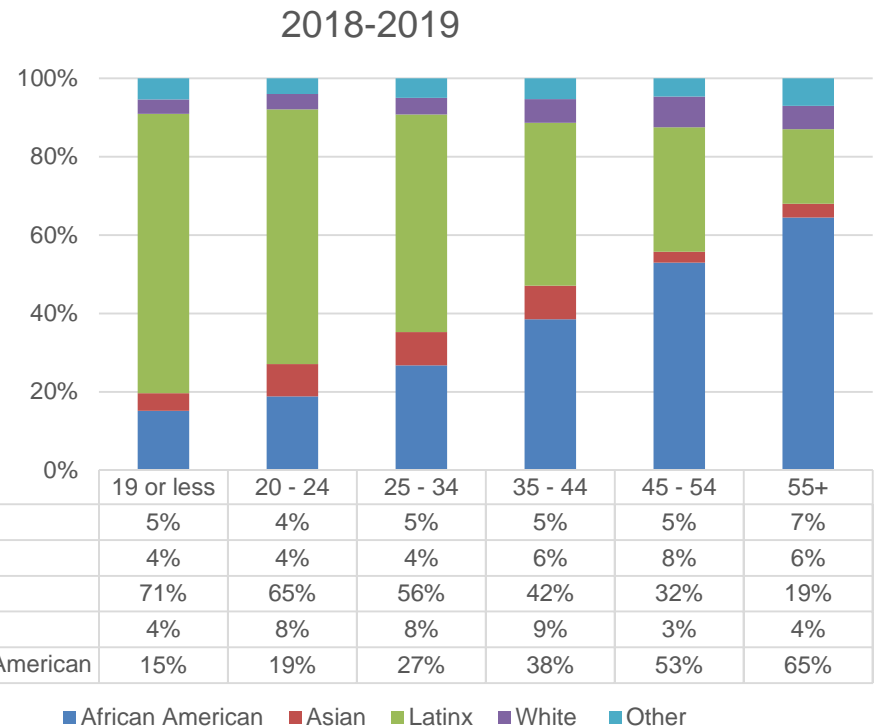
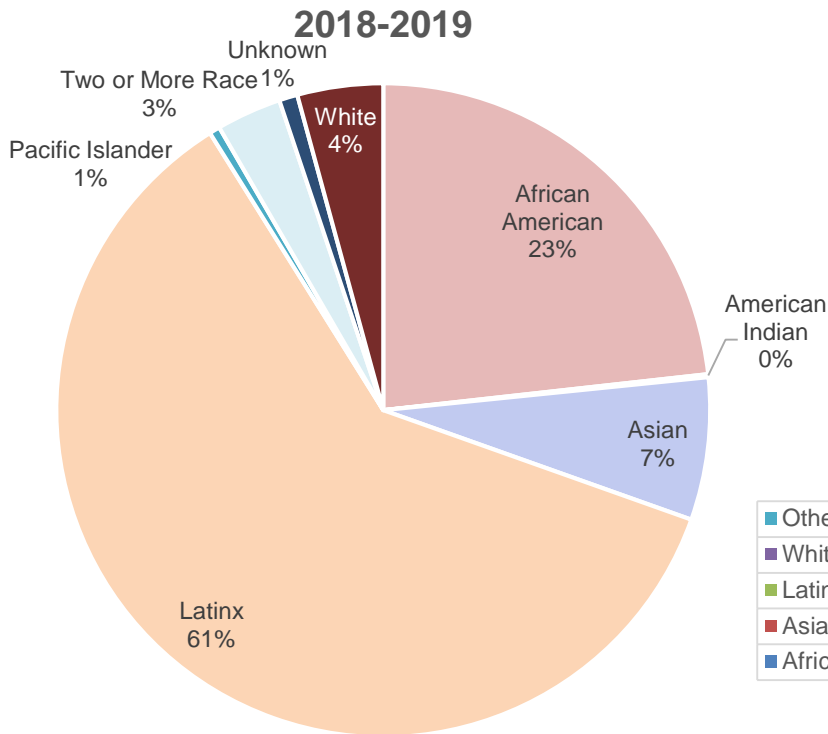
Service Area Population



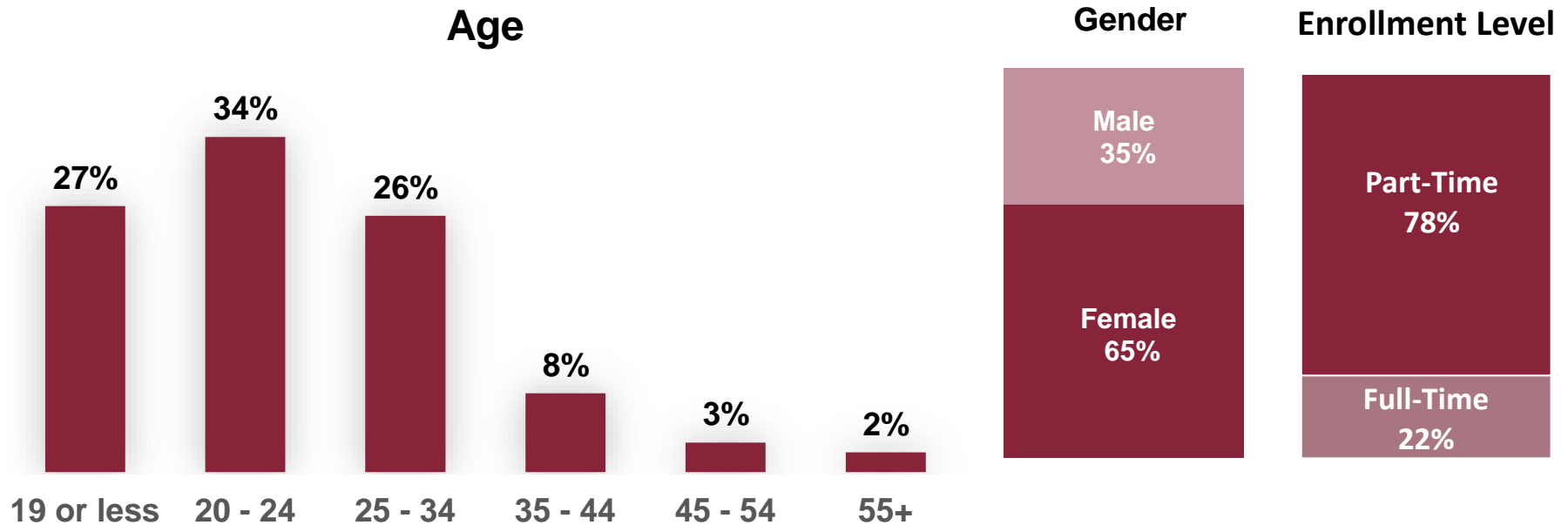

# Compton College Ethnicity

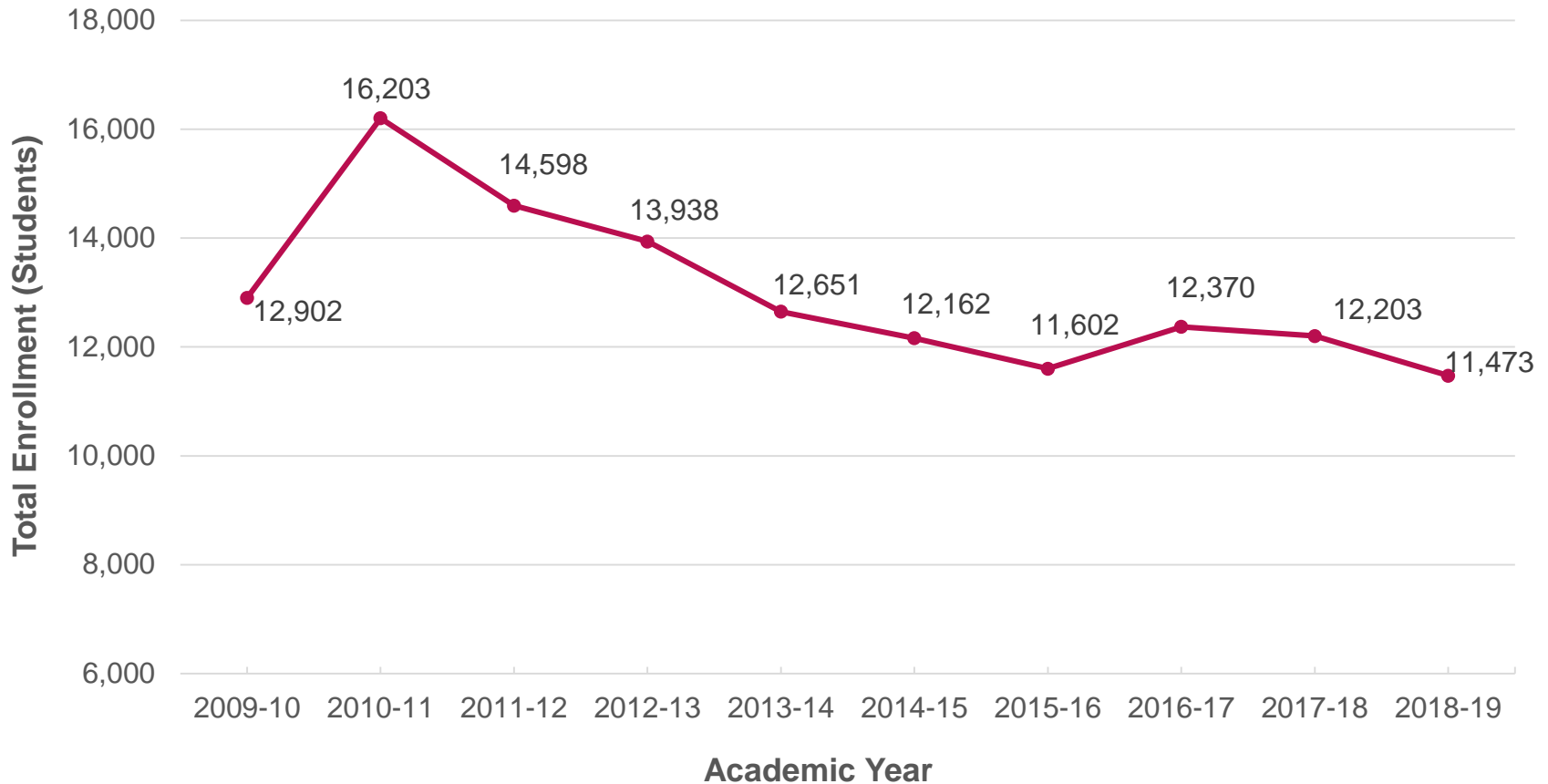

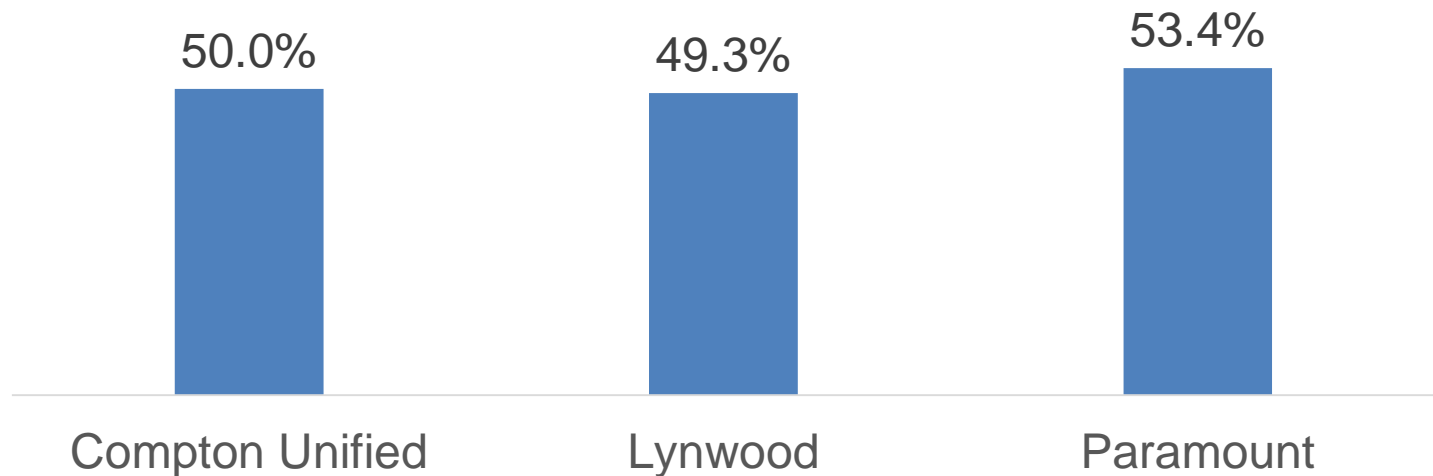
# 10-Year Enrollment Trend

2009-2010 through 2018-2019



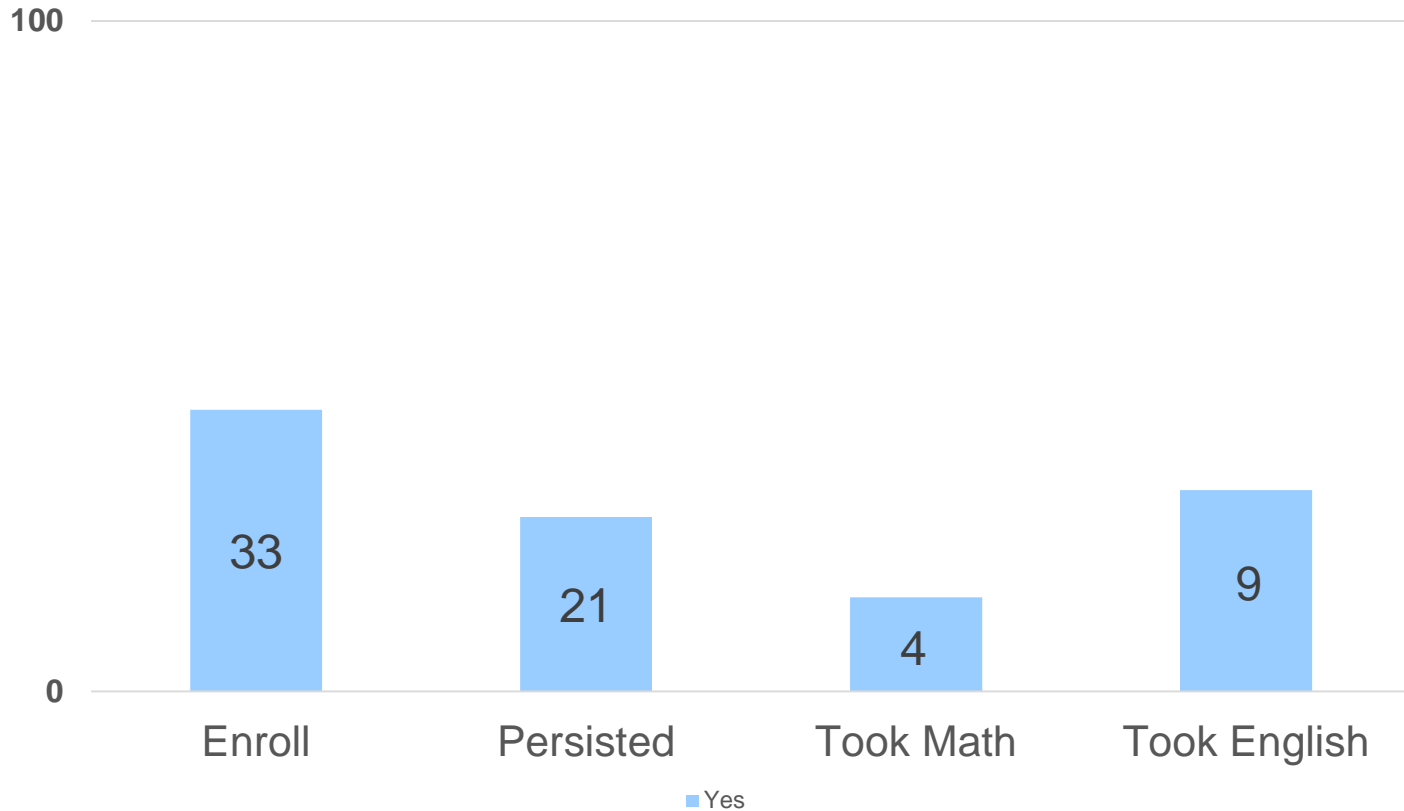
# College-Going Among Our Feeders

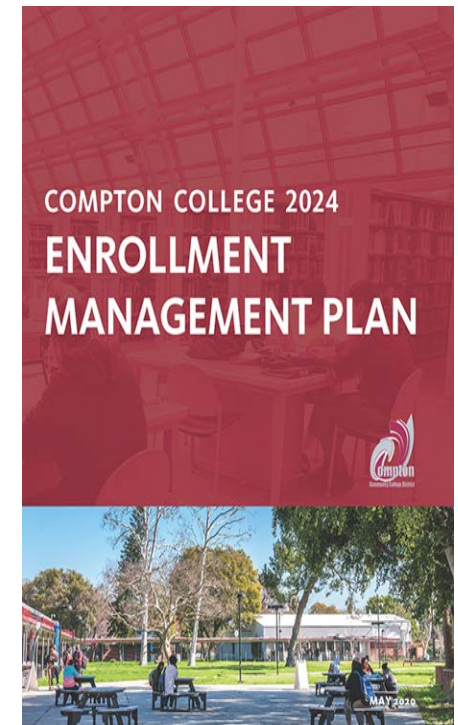
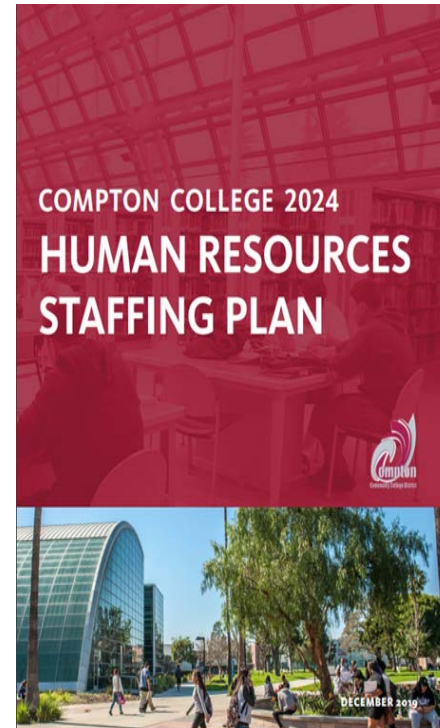
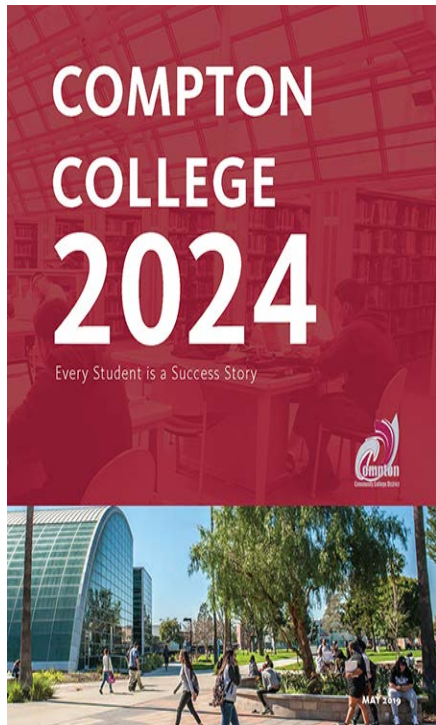
