Business and Industrial Studies	Care Packages for Students Taking In-Person Classes	Due to the COVID 19 pandemic, the majority of the Business and Industrial Studies classes were taught remotely during the summer 2020 term and fall2020 semester, except for Career and Technical Education programs that required in-person labs. Faculty and staff are working with students to make sure they have the correct supplies and equipment to complete their coursework remotely. To meet the needs of Business and Industrial Studies students, the Tartar Success Team wants to provide 'Compton College Care Packages'. The packages would include pencils, pens, highlighter, earphones, and flash drives. The packages would be distributed by Business and Industrial Studies faculty to students in need. 	Extra Cosmetology Kits	Cosmetology kits, on average, cost over \$1,200 each. Topics may include how to study, growth mindset, note-taking, etc. The virtual study jams will accommodate day, evening, and weekend students and provide them with a welcoming environment and virtual tutors. 	Health and Public Services Transfer and Career Conference	The Health and Public Services Virtual Transfer and Career Conference will provide workshops and career panels in each Health and Public Services majors, including transfer requirements and career pathways. 	Novelist Speaker and Workshop	The workshop will be scheduled with a novelist such as Sandra Tsing Loh, to introduce English 127 students to careers in creative writing. Guest speakers will share their career journey and discuss the concepts of the roles/relationships between student to author and moving from short story writer to novelist.	Approved	\$500	
	Voices of Compton Student Showcase Video	To accompany a printed version of Voices of Compton, the Fine Arts, Communication, and Humanities Tartar Success Team will develop a division-wide video showcase of student talent. This video would feature a variety of performances including spoken word, poetry, dance, music, persuasive speeches, and art. The video would be available on the Fine Arts, Communication, and Humanities Division webpage and serve as a marketing tool. Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM)	STEM Week	The Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Tartar Success Team will collaborate with the STEM Center and STEM faculty on the annual STEM Week (May 17-21, 2021). In the past, about 200 STEM students participated in the annual STEM Week. The spring 2021 STEM Week will include a transfer panel, professional panel, Zoomposium, and a virtual field trip. 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	Make it Happen: A Hands-On STEM Virtual Learning Project	This project will be a virtual academy and target all Compton College students enrolled in a STEM course. Students who participate in the “Make It Happen” project will be divided into teams to build their projects work on projects using Arduino as the main platform. Students will attend a series of Zoom workshops that will provide Arduino training and an overview of the engineering process. Students will be mailed Arduino kits and supplies to their homes and will be asked to present their final projects to the campus community.	Approved	\$3,850
