- 227 FTES for the Winter 2023 term. Our fill rate for Winter is currently 66%, and 1,948 seats are filled.
- 651 FTES for the **Spring 2023** term. Our fill rate for Spring is currently 29%, and 4,524 seats are filled.

2021-2022 Compton CCD Financial Audit Report

EideBailly LLP, our independent external auditing firm, completed the <u>2021-2022 Compton Community</u> <u>College District Financial Audit Report</u>. The Compton District Annual Financial Audit was completed and submitted to the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office with an unmodified opinion of the financial statements (see page 90). Below is a summary of the results of the 2021-2022 Annual Financial Audit Report.

- 1. Compton CCD's general fund ending balance was \$20.4 million, above the 10% minimum reserve requirement pursuant to <u>Compton CCD Board Policy 6200 Budget Preparation</u>.
- 2. Compton CCD reported two audit findings for the 2021-22 fiscal year compared to seven findings in the prior year.
- 3. Compton CCD complied with the 50 Percent Law for the ninth consecutive year.

Weekly Farmers' Market on Wednesdays

All current Compton College students are eligible to receive \$20 each week in farmers' market vouchers. Students may stop by the farmers' market between 3:00 and 7:30 p.m. on Wednesdays with their Compton College Student ID card and receive \$20 vouchers to spend at the market. The farmers' market is located along the Main Loop, near the north entrance to the Math/Science Building, east of the Library-Student Success Center.

The weekly, on-campus farmers' market is managed by Sustainable Economic Enterprises of Los Angeles (SEE-LA). It provides an opportunity for students, employees, and the community to purchase locallygrown fruits, vegetables, and other food items. CalFresh EBT cards are accepted, and the Compton College/SEE-LA Famers Market offers Market Match.

City of Compton Artesia Bridge Update

An update provided by Assistant City Manager Triphenia Simmons announced the design to repair the Artesia Bridge is due to the City of Compton in *April 2023*. There will be security enhancements for the area, and an RFP for construction will be released in early *Summer 2023*. Construction to repair the bridge will take 6 to 9 months, and the bridge should be reopened by *Spring 2024*. If we receive additional updates on the City of Compton Artesia Bridge, we will share them with the campus community.
