Subject: President/CEO Message - January 13, 2023

Campus Community,

On *January 10, 2023*, Governor Newsom released his <u>proposed budget for the 2023-24 fiscal year</u>. As anticipated, the proposal tackles a budget deficit while seeking to keep prior year promises.

For California Community Colleges, the budget proposal continues to be shaped by the <u>Roadmap for the Future</u>, introduced in 2022-23 and intended to advance equity, student success, and the system's ability to prepare students for California's Future. It includes roughly \$778 million in Proposition 98 augmentations over the prior year, with nearly all of it as ongoing spending. The proposal provides an 8.13% cost-of-living-adjustment and another round of investments in strategies to increase student retention and enrollment rates.

Please review the <u>2023-2024 Joint Analysis of the Governor's Budget Proposal</u> to assist your review of the recently released budget proposal. This detailed and comprehensive tool is crafted to serve as a common factual resource to aid further analysis or advocacy. The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) once again partnered with the Association of California Community College Administrators (ACCCA), the Association of Chief Business Officials (ACBO), and the Community College League of California to release this analysis. Winter and Spring 2023 Enrollment Update

As of *yesterday*, *January 12*, *2023*, Compton College has generated the following:

- 207 FTES for the Winter 2023 term. Our fill rate for Winter is currently 65%, and 1,787 seats are filled.
- 782 FTES for the **Spring 2023** term. Our fill rate for Spring is currently 34%, and 5,413 seats are filled.

Enrollment Trends

The College is beginning to see a flattening out of enrollment. Vice President Sheri Berger has shared that the College saw a 17% increase in headcount for winter 2023 compared to winter 2022 and a 6% increase in headcount compared to winter 2021. The seats filled also increased by 21.8% and 8.2%, respectively.

For spring 2023, the College is seeing a 12% increase in headcount compared to spring 2022 and a 4% over the spring 2021 headcount. Additionally, students are taking more classes than they were 1-2 years ago. The seats filled for spring 2023 compared to spring 2022 is up 12.8% and 5.1% compared to spring 2021. Vice President Berger has also reported that asynchronous classes fill faster than remote, synchronous, in-person classes. The deans continue to monitor enrollment and are adding classes as demand indicates when possible. These numbers are encouraging, but we all need to bring new and returning students to the College.
