Accreditation Update

The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) has confirmed the dates for our comprehensive review to determine the reaffirmation of accreditation, as well as the chair and vice chair of the peer review team. Dr. Henry Shannon, Superintendent/President of Chaffey College, has been appointed Chair of the Peer Review Team, and Dr. Torence Powell, Superintendent/President of Napa Valley College, has been appointed Vice Chair.

The Focused Site Visit will take place during the week of *February 19, 2024*. This will be an on-site visit to Compton College in which the team will gather additional information via interviews, data requests, and meetings to discuss the Core Inquiries. The ACCJC anticipates the Focused Site Visit will be a shorter visit with a smaller team; nevertheless, we ask you to hold the entire week for flexibility in scheduling meetings.

To allow the team adequate preparation for the visit, the Institutional Self-Evaluation Report must be submitted no later than **August 1, 2023**. In order to kick off the college's review process, the Team Chair will contact us to schedule a virtual meet and greet session between the team and college personnel, as well as an open forum before the Team ISER Review scheduled for *October 18, 2023*.
