Los Angeles County COVID-19 Update

End of the Federal Public Health Emergency for COVID-19

Summer 2023 Enrollment Update

As of *yesterday, May 4, 2023*, Compton College has generated 147 FTES for the Summer 2023 term. Our fill rate is currently 22%, and 1,121 seats are filled. Please encourage your current students to register for their summer classes now. Summer courses offer several benefits, including a reduced workload for future semesters.

2023-2024 Compton College Recruitment Update

- 1. The resolution to expand the Oliver W. Conner Promise Program to all first-time Compton College students will be on the *May 16*, *2023*, Compton CCD Board of Trustees' agenda. Compton College will offer two years of free enrollment fees to all eligible new students, regardless of age or whether they live within the Compton CCD or not, beginning with the fall 2023 semester.
- 2. In line with <u>California's Roadmap for California Community Colleges</u> and the <u>California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office's Vision for Success</u>, Compton College will launch a new enrollment campaign called "12-in-4" to encourage local 9-12 graders to complete 12 units of college-level coursework in four years. A letter will be sent to the parents of our in-District high school students notifying them of their eligibility to participate in one of our current dual enrollment programs, such as Early College, AB 288 Courses, and Afternoon College. Compton College's Department of Educational Partnerships is developing the implementation timeline and campaign details. Food Pantry Reopens on Campus

The Tartar Pantry reopened on *May 1, 2023*, to assist students who need additional support addressing food insecurity. The hours are Monday-Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to Noon and 3:00-5:30 p.m. The food pantry is located in the Multipurpose Room near the Everytable Cafeteria. Students registered in the current semester are allowed to take home one full grocery bag bi-weekly and have the option to take "grab & go snacks" twice a week from the pantry. Items vary and are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

2023 Compton College Commencement

The first of four Grad Info Sessions was held yesterday afternoon via Zoom. All 2023 Graduates are invited to join the virtual information sessions to ask questions about the *June 9*, 2023, Commencement Ceremony, which will be held at Dignity Health Sports Park in the Tennis Stadium at 6:00 p.m. Grads were reminded to stop by the <u>Bookstore</u> and purchase their caps and gowns, and to check the <u>Commencement Information webpage</u> for the most up-to-date information.
