We're getting closer and closer to commencement and the end of the spring semester. The Class of 2023 includes 347 students earning associate degrees and 180 certificates. Among our graduates, we are proud to have 83 Compton Unified School District Early College students and 24 Paramount Unified School District College and Career Access Pathways students join the *June 9, 2023,* commencement ceremony as members of the Compton College Class of 2023. These graduates earned an associate degree or certificate while still enrolled in high school.

#### Summer and Fall 2023 Enrollment Update

As of Wednesday, May 24, 2023, Compton College has generated:

- 307 FTES for the **Summer 2023** term. The fill rate is currently 45%, and seats filled are 2,452.
- 264 FTES for the Fall 2023 semester. The fill rate is currently 9%, and seats filled are 1,580.

### **FTES Forecast**

As of *May 11, 2023*, the College is projecting at least 2,989 FTES to be reported for 2022-2023, which includes any positive attendance still to be reported for spring 2023. This is a 6.1% increase over the 2021-2022 reported FTES of 2,818. Of the 2,989 FTES, 585 FTES (19.6%) is from dual enrollment. Dual enrollment students comprise over 30% of the students enrolled at Compton College.

Looking ahead to next year, the College is off to a great start for summer 2023. As of *May 24, 2023*, the summer headcount is up 0.8% compared to last year at this time and 3.2% compared to summer 2021 at this same time. The seats filled (2,452) are up 6% and 16%, respectively, and FTES (307) is up 7% and 6%, respectively. Admissions and records are still registering the dual enrollment students into summer. Dual enrollment continues to be an equity strategy and an enrollment management strategy. The fall 2023 enrollment is also doing well, with 653 registered students totaling 1,580 enrollments and 264 FTES.

## 2023 Commencement Keynote Speaker

Compton College will hold its 2023 Commencement Ceremony on *Friday, June 9, 2023, at 6:00 p.m.* The commencement ceremony will occur at the Dignity Health Sports Park Tennis Stadium, 18400 Avalon Boulevard, Carson, CA 90246. For those unable to attend in person, the ceremony will be live-streamed on Compton College's <u>YouTube Channel</u>, which is also accessible via a link from the college website at <u>www.compton.edu</u>.

The keynote speaker for the ceremony will be <u>Su Jin Jez</u>, CEO of <u>California Competes: Higher Education for a</u> <u>Strong Economy</u>. This organization develops nonpartisan and financially pragmatic recommendations for improved higher education and workforce policies and practices across California.

The venue for the Commencement Ceremony will open at 4 p.m. on June 9, 2023, for graduates and guests. Free parking is available in Lots 10 and 11 at the Dignity Health Sports Park.
