# Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drill - Thursday, October 19, 2023

Earthquakes are a normal occurrence in Southern California, but that doesn't mean we should take them lightly or assume we're prepared. That's why Compton College will join millions of people across California and beyond in this year's Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drill. This is our chance to practice how we will <u>protect</u> <u>ourselves</u> and for all of us to become better prepared. The goal is to save lives and prevent natural disasters from becoming catastrophes.

The annual statewide earthquake drill is planned for *Thursday, October 19*. When the alert sounds at 10:19 a.m., everyone on campus will be directed to:

- DROP to the ground
- Take COVER by getting under a sturdy desk or table
- HOLD ON until the shaking stops

Those who are inside should remain indoors, while those who are outside should remain outdoors.

#### **Final Thoughts**

Last month, the Community College League of California CEO Affordability, Food & Housing Access Taskforce, and the RP Group released its 2023 report, <u>Basic Needs Among California Community College Students</u>. Findings include that **two of every three** California community college students face **at least one basic needs insecurity, including lack of food and housing,** according to the study. Below are some of the general findings from the past and new reports:
