I hope everyone had an enjoyable first two weeks of the semester, as I know it has been very busy for everyone. First, I would like to thank everyone for their work and support of the Compton College Accreditation efforts, especially with the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) visit that occurred this week. I am truly proud of the outcome of the visit and look forward to the next steps. More information is included in this President/CEO Message.

Now for some not-so-positive news: on *February 20, 2024*, the <u>California Legislative Analyst's Office</u> (LAO) released the <u>2024-2025 Budget Deficit Update</u>, which projects the state deficit for 2024-2025 at *\$73 billion* and mentions that "[the] Budget problem is likely to be higher at the time of the May Revision." In addition, the LAO released the <u>2024-2025 California Community Colleges Brief</u>, which analyzes Governor Gavin Newsom's budget proposals relating to California Community Colleges enrollment, apportionments, and nursing education. I am very concerned about the California state budget deficit, and therefore, we will make several adjustments to the <u>Compton Community College District Five-Year Fiscal Management Plan</u>. The adjustments will be reflected in the 2024-2025 Compton CCD Budget Assumptions, which will be completed in *March 2024*. Spring 2024 Enrollment Update

As of *yesterday, February 22, 2024*, Compton College has generated 1,378 FTES for the Spring 2024 term. Our fill rate for Spring is currently 62%, and seats filled is 9,714.

February 24, 2024, Community Health Forum

The <u>Compton Community Health Professions Partnership</u> (CCHPP), established to address the disparities in healthcare access and improve educational attainment for Compton area residents, is holding its first public forum *tomorrow*, *February 24*, *2024*, from 9:00 a.m. to noon. The forum will focus on health issues and concerns.

Compton College and other agencies in the community, including Compton Unified School District (CUSD), Charles R. Drew University (CDU), California State University, Dominguez Hills (CSUDH), St. John's Community Health, and Kedren Health, have been working to create a seamless pipeline for health profession education and training. The pipeline will start with students in CUSD, who will go into health profession degree programs at Compton College, CSUDH, and CDU, while the healthcare partners (St. John's and Kedren) provide clinical training/rotation sites and eventual employment opportunities for the CCPHH graduates.

Last *Saturday, February 17, 2024*, we kicked off the Compton College Faculty Prep Academy in partnership with the <u>University of Southern California Race and Equity Center</u>. I want to acknowledge Jennifer Burchett, Director of Diversity, Compliance and Title IX, for her work on the implementation of this program, and Dr. Minodora Moldoveanu, President of Compton College Academic Senate, for working to identify Compton College faculty to participate on the Faculty panel last Saturday; and for working to identify Compton College faculty to serve as mentors for the program participants. The Compton College Faculty Prep Academy has a cohort of 30 California community college graduates who are currently enrolled in a master's or doctoral program and who will participate in a series of workshops from *February through September 2024* to help prepare them on how to become a community college faculty member.

We intend to keep the campus community informed on the Compton College Faculty Prep Academy with updates in future <u>President/CEO Messages</u>.
