#### Narcan and Fentanyl Test Strip Training

As required by Assembly Bill 461 – Student Safety: fentanyl test strips, a statewide effort to reduce fentanylrelated deaths in all of California's public universities and colleges, nearly 20 employees completed in-person training this week courtesy of St. John's Community Health and the Health, Safety and Parking Committee. Upon completion of the training, participants received a free Narcan kit. AB 461 also requires us to include information in our new student orientation, on the website, and in the Student Health Center.
