Campus Community,

As the president/CEO of Compton College and Compton Community College District, I would like to express my gratitude to the Faculty, Classified Professionals, and Managers/Supervisors for your dedication and contributions to our students' success. Over the past couple of weeks, at the many student celebrations, students shared their appreciation of this institution, which included their interactions with their instructors, their participation in a particular student support program, and the basic needs support they receive from Compton College. In addition, students shared how many of you *go above and beyond* to support student success. *Thank you!*

Today, I had the opportunity to attend the Compton College Academic Senate meeting, which was Dr. Minodora Moldoveanu's last meeting as the Academic Senate President. Dr. Moldoveanu has served as the President of the Academic Senate since *July 1, 2020*. On behalf of the Board of Trustees and the District Administration, we want to thank Dr. Moldoveanu for her service and commitment to Compton College and Compton Community College District.

As we approach *tomorrow's June 7*, *2024*, Commencement Ceremony, I extend my heartfelt gratitude to the Commencement Planning Committee for meticulously organizing this year's graduation. Your tireless efforts contribute significantly to the annual celebration of our students' remarkable achievements. June 7 is a significant date for Compton College.

- Compton College achieved initial accreditation from the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges on *June 7, 2017*.
- We held our first commencement ceremony at the 114th California Community College on *June 7*, 2018.
- Compton College separated from El Camino College at midnight on *June 7, 2019*.
- June 7, 2024, is our seventh anniversary as an independently accredited college—congratulations to everyone!

Summer and Fall 2024 Enrollment Update

As of *today*, *June 6*, *2024*, Compton College has generated:

- 498 FTES for the **Summer 2024** term. The fill rate is currently 70%, and the seats filled is 4,047.
- 599 FTES for the **Fall 2024** semester. The fill rate is currently 21%, and the seats filled are 3,551.

We are in the range of 525 - 550 Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) for Summer 2024, which is above our goal of 474 FTES. Please encourage students to register for the summer sessions and fall classes. Last week, a postcard was mailed to all in-district residents promoting summer and fall registration. His competitiveness in baseball, his knowledge of multiple sports as a game day staff member, and his bravery as a campus police cadet are appreciated.

AB 928 – Student Transfer Achievement Reform Act of 2021 Implementation at Compton College

Assembly Bill (AB) 928 was signed into law on *October 6, 2021*. AB 928 established the provision for a singular general education pattern, now referred to as Cal-GETC. Cal-GETC will go into effect in the fall of 2025 and replace the current CSU General Education and IGETC Patterns. By *May 2025*, ASSIST.org will publish the College's approved Cal-GETC classes. To facilitate the transition to Cal-GETC, the Chancellor's Office has provided one-time funding through *June 30, 2026*, of \$565,217 to support the College's work. The funds are allocated in five categories (shown below), with the majority of the funding used to support technology changes and for provisional hires, including a provisional evaluator. Funding is also provided to support the additional work faculty and staff will need during this time, including updating program maps, Degree Works, Comevo, Banner, Curriqunet, and other systems.

- My responses to the <u>Academic Senate</u> Summary of Decisions made at the *May 2, 2024*, and *May 16, 2024* meetings are available <u>here</u>.
- Regarding the 2035 Compton College Master Plan and the updated Facilities Master Plan, we are exploring the possibility of constructing a new state-of-the-art Instructional Building 3 to house all science programs, including Biotechnology. This new facility, potentially funded by a new bond measure, would allow the Math/Science Building to be repurposed as a regular classroom building that would house math and other instructional programs. We currently have some funds available in the Compton CCD Measure C Bond Funds for revonations to the Math/Science Building. We are seeking your creative input or recommendations on the proposal for a new Instructional Building 3 to Amari Williams, Dean of Institutional Effectiveness, at awilliams22@compton.edu. At the June 18, 2024, Board of Trustees Meeting, we will provide a presentation to the Board of Trustees on the 2035 Facilities Master Plan.
