On Wednesday, I had the pleasure of visiting the market, greeting our dedicated vendors, and chatting with students about their favorite items. From delicious snacks and freshly prepared foods to an array of fresh fruits and vegetables, our market offers something for everyone.

I'm excited to remind you that current students are eligible to receive \$20 in free farmers' market <u>vouchers</u> each week! (As Lydell Willis, director of Basic Needs & Student Success continues to remind everyone, it's vouchers, not cash.) This initiative, now approaching its second anniversary, is a proud partnership with <u>Food Access Los Angeles</u>. It has proven to be an invaluable resource, ensuring our students have access to fresh, nutritious food. Just today, I had a conversation with a college president from the state of Colorado regarding all of our food resource programs, including the farmers' market.

I'm also thrilled to announce that our <u>partnership with Food Access Los Angeles</u> (formerly known as <u>SEE-LA</u>) <u>has been extended through June 2026</u>! This extension will allow us to continue providing this essential service to our students for years to come. I am hopeful we will secure a donor to support the farmers' market vouchers in the future.

## Fall 2024 Enrollment Update

As of *yesterday*, *September 5*, *2024*, Compton College has generated 1,643 FTES for the **Fall 2024** term. Our fill rate for Fall is currently 68%, and seats filled is 11,187.

Students have until 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, September 8, 2024, to add full-semester courses. An "authorization code" from the class instructor is required to complete the online registration process. Please refer interested students to the list of open classes at <a href="www.compton.edu/admissions-aid/docs/Open-Sections.pdf">www.compton.edu/admissions-aid/docs/Open-Sections.pdf</a>. There are also many second eight-week midterm classes with seats available. Students can search for those specifically via the <a href="Online Searchable Class Schedule">Online Searchable Class Schedule</a>.

As a reminder to faculty, students who never attended ("no show") or are no longer participating in the class as of census, must be excluded prior to the census date. Even though students are responsible for dropping themselves after census; faculty should drop student who are no longer participating in the classes.

## **Men's Cross Country**

- Ten student-athletes are participating this season, led by Head Coach David Austin.
- The team participated in three events in 2023, with a top finish of 16th place at the San Diego Mesa Invite.

## Women's Cross Country

• Six student-athletes are planning to participate in 2024, led by Head Coach David Austin.

## Men's Football

• 51 student-athletes are preparing for the 2024 football season. This is a huge accomplishment, and special thanks to everyone involved, but most importantly, Dr. Timothy Harrison. As some may recall, last year, Dr. Harrison arrived on campus prior to the beginning of the football season, and we struggled with student participation. Over the last year, working with the Football coaches, he made fielding a team his number one priority. Great job, Dr. Harrison and the entire athletic department staff.

## Women's Soccer

- Twenty-four student-athletes are participating this season, led by Head Coach Jose Garcia.
- The overall record is 1-1, with a recent victory over Imperial Valley College.
- The 2023 record was 4-13-1 (1-8 in SCC), with a playoff loss at LA Harbor to finish the season.

# Men's Soccer

- Twenty-nine student-athletes are participating in the fall season, led by Head Coach Jose Garcia.
- The 2023 record was 7-9-3 (2-6-1 in SCC), with a playoff loss at Pasadena City to finish the season.

# Women's Volleyball

- Head Coach Monique Scott (Guyton) brought in a great class of 13 student-athletes for the Fall 2024 season.
- The overall record is 0-3, with some solid performances so far while playing strong competition at the beginning of the year to get ready for conference play.

## Men's Basketball

- Twenty-three student-athletes enrolled this fall, led by Head Coach Keith Holliman and assistant coaches Idris Jones and Ronnie Winbush.
- The 2023-24 competitive year ended with a 9-19 final record overall and 3-7 in conference play.

#### Women's Basketball

- Head Coach Lewis Nelson is preparing for the 2024-2025 season with fifteen players in the program.
- The 2023-24 season ended with a 1-22 overall record, 0-8 in the South Coast Conference.

## **Spring Sports**

## Women's Softball

- Fifteen student-athletes completed the Spring 2024 season with a historic playoff appearance, the first in school history.
- The overall record was 21-18 (9-12 in SCC, 5th place).
- Head Coach Victoria Castillo returns for 2024-2025 with a new group of Compton College stars.

#### Men's Baseball

- The 2024 overall record was 16-24 (10-14 in conference, 5th place).
- Approximately seventy-five student-athletes are in the program this fall, led by Head Coach Shannon Williams.
- A committed and competitive group of student-athletes this year.

## Women's Badminton

- Head Coach Jose Garcia led the team in Spring 2024.
- Recruitment is underway for an assistant coach to help grow the program.
- The team finished the season with a 0-8 overall record, with five student-athletes completing the season.

## Men's and Women's Track and Field

• Eight student-athletes (two women and six men) participated in 2024 at six meets led by Head Coach David Austin.

## Men's and Women's (Co-ed) Esports

• We are in the process of hiring a new Head Coach with plans to have a season in Spring 2025.
