#### Campus Community,

This has been a long week. However, a lot has been accomplished this week at Compton College in support of our students and their success. I want to begin this President/CEO Message with a heartfelt thank you to the faculty, classified professionals, and the management team. Your continued support is not only appreciated but also crucial to our students' success.

Now, to some unfortunate news, in *August 2024*, several failures were uncovered within the Ellucian Banner CRM Advise platform, including emails and text messages that did not reach students. Dr. Rebekah Blonshine, acting vice president of student services, has been working with the Ellucian CRM Advise consultant in collaboration with Mike Tu, chief technology officer, to fix these issues and ensure they do not happen in the future. Faculty should continue to submit student progress reports and early alerts through CRM Advise in accordance with article 7.1 of the faculty bargaining agreement. Student services advisors have been and will continue to follow up with students and close out alerts in a timely manner. Through our collaborative governance structure, we will discuss our early alert practices at the Enrollment Management, Student Success, and Guided Pathways committees to ensure we are maximizing the capabilities of our CRM Advise system to provide intervention, support, and resources to our students. We will continue to provide updates on the CRM Advise Early Alert platform in future President/CEO Messages.

## Fall 2024 and Winter 2025 Enrollment Update

As of *yesterday, October 25, 2024*, Compton College has generated 1,688 FTES for the **Fall 2024** term. Our fill rate for Fall is currently 70%, and seats filled is 11,697.

Winter 2025 enrollment opened on *October 22*. Please encourage interested students to meet with a counselor to see if a five-week winter class (or two) might be a good fit for their academic and work/life goals. <u>The winter 2025</u> schedule of classes is available online in searchable and PDF formats.

# **High Altitude Weather Balloon Launch**

*Yesterday, October 24, 2024*, the STEM Club successfully launched their High-Altitude Weather Balloon (HAB) at 10:30 a.m. from just south of The Village. This balloon, designed and built last year, finally took flight thanks to improved landing site simulations and a few mid-course adjustments.

The pre-flight checks took a couple of hours, during which time many onlookers gathered to watch the process. The flight lasted approximately three hours, two hours ascending and one hour descending. The balloon landed as expected between Barstow and Needles along the I-40, based on NOAA weather predictions and Newton's Laws.

Throughout the flight, the HAB was tracked using two GPS transceivers, ensuring the group had a reasonable idea of its location at all times. After landing, a dedicated retrieval team successfully recovered the balloon. This event was the result of extensive preparation, including coordinating with the FAA, and training for the retrieval process. Members of the STEM Club are thrilled with the outcome and grateful for the support and interest from everyone who joined the event.

Participating colleges, including Compton College, California State University, Long Beach, and the University of Southern California, will receive grant awards for their involvement.

#### **New Policy Statement – Issuance of Business Cards**

A new policy statement regarding the issuance and use of Compton College business cards goes into effect today. The new policy applies to all departments, offices, and units within the Compton CCD and Compton College and excludes student workers and nonpermanent employees from being issued business cards.
