As we wrap up another eventful week, I want to extend my heartfelt congratulations to all our students who completed their finals. Your hard work and dedication are truly commendable, and we hope you achieved the results you aimed for. To our faculty, many of whom are concluding their duties for the year, we wish you a restful and enjoyable winter break. Your commitment to our students' success is deeply appreciated.

### Winter and Spring 2025 Enrollment Update

As of *December 12, 2024*, Compton College has made significant progress in enrollment for the upcoming terms:

- 284 FTES for the winter term. Our fill rate for Winter 2025 is currently 78%, with 2,496 seats filled.
- 815 FTES for the spring semester. Our fill rate for Spring 2025 is currently 35%, with 5,696 seats filled.

Although the fall semester ends tomorrow, and classes will not be in session next week, there is still time to register for the winter term, which begins on *January 6*. If any department needs marketing materials, extra Winter/Spring postcards and General Information brochures are available in the Community Relations Office (D-29).

### New Small Scholar Libraries

As a follow-up to the <u>President/CEO Message – October 5, 2024</u>, you may have seen the charming burgundy book-sharing libraries around campus. You can find them outside the Student Services Building, in front of the Library-SSC, and outside the Child Development Center. These libraries are part of the Little Free Library nonprofit organization, aiming to boost global literacy. They provide easy access to books for students and their children, supporting our Small Scholar Spaces initiative for Compton College student-parents.

### December 17, 2024, Annual Organizational Meeting

The Compton Community College District Board of Trustees will hold its annual organizational meeting on *December 17, 2024, at 5:00 p.m.* in the Student Services Building, Room 212, as prescribed by Education Code Section 72000. The agenda includes the election of officers, setting meeting dates for 2025, and appointing representatives to various organizations. The agenda will be available 72 hours in advance.

### **Input Needed for 2025 Legislative Priorities**

Yesterday in Sacramento, I met with state legislators' representatives and colleagues to discuss our legislative priorities. We focused on <u>Compton College's 2035 Comprehensive Master Plan</u>, implementing <u>Assembly Bill</u> <u>1705</u>, our status as a Black Serving Institution, and my request to increase our <u>Student-Centered Funding</u> <u>Formula</u> calculations. I emphasized the importance of requesting the state to increase the base, supplemental, and student success allocation calculations for the 2025-2026 year.

### **Compton College Bookstore Update**

On *December 10, 2024*, the Compton CCD Board of Trustees <u>approved</u> a two-year contract with Follett Higher Education Group to continue operating an on-campus store and accompanying website for Compton College. The director of Purchasing and Auxiliary Services and the Bookstore provider will attend an upcoming <u>Auxiliary Services Committee</u> meeting to collect feedback from students, faculty, and classified professionals regarding the future of the bookstore's operations at Compton College.

We need your input to determine if maintaining the on-campus store is worth the \$6,500/month management fee is the best option for Compton College. In the future, Follett prefers to transition to an online-only store, and we want to understand the potential unintended consequences of this change. Please note that we have not agreed to this transition, nor do we have a date or timeframe for potentially moving to an online-only store. The question we need to understand at this time is: would students support an online-only bookstore? How might this impact access to course materials, affordability, and the overall student experience?

Your creative input is crucial in helping us make an informed decision that best supports our community.

### **Student Housing Groundbreaking**

Everyone is invited to the Groundbreaking Ceremony for Compton College's new 251-bed student housing facility on *Friday, January 17, 2025, at 1:00 p.m.* This event will be held at the northeast corner of campus, near IB1 and 2. This milestone makes Compton College the first community college in Los Angeles County to offer on-campus housing for students.

### **Final Thoughts**

As we look ahead, I want to remind everyone that our campus will remain open through *Monday, December* 23, 2024, to assist students with the <u>Steps to Enrollment</u>. Additionally, there are still <u>classes available for the five-week winter term</u>—a fantastic opportunity to get ahead. On *Wednesday, December 11, 2024*, we celebrated our fall nursing pinning ceremony, where we heard inspiring speeches from alumni and current graduates. This week, you'll also notice fencing going up around the <u>student housing construction site</u>, marking another step forward in our campus development.

Yesterday, in between meetings in Sacramento, I attended the Compton College and California State University Sacramento Memorandum of Understanding Agreement Signing Ceremony. This new partnership, <u>approved by</u> <u>the Board of Trustees at their June 18, 2024 meeting</u>, will guarantee our students admission into the Black Honors College at California State University, Sacramento if they satisfy the following requirements.
