Subject: President/CEO Message - May 23, 2025

Campus Community,

This week, I had the opportunity to present to the California State University (CSU) Board of Trustees on behalf of the Strategic Enrollment Advisory Council, which I currently serve on. During my presentation, I shared insights on student transfer, basic needs, and the direction our college is heading in terms of transfer initiatives. Thanks to the support of the Ballmer Group grant, mentioned in the President/CEO MessageNovember 15, 2024—we are now positioned to develop a new regional transfer strategy. As we continue aligning our programs with student needs and institutional capacity, we will shift our focus toward strengthening local partnerships and streamlining transfer pathways with colleges and universities within a 50-mile radius of our campus.

To lead this effort, I have asked Dr. Maria Garcia, Interim Dean of Counseling and Guided Pathways, to coordinate the development of this strategy. Dr. Garcia will work in collaboration with the Transfer and Career Center faculty and classified professionals, the Counseling Department, and the Guided Pathways and Student Success committees.

This new regional strategy aligns with the goals outlined in <u>Compton College 2035</u>, <u>Comprehensive Master Plan</u>, and represents a strategic shift toward creating more accessible and sustainable opportunities for our students. As part of this approach, we are also working closely with Compton, Lynwood, and Paramount Unified School Districts to explore Direct Admissions partnerships with CSU campuses.

Our goal is to establish Direct Admissions agreements with the CSU campuses located within a *50-mile radius* of Compton College and with CSU-designated Black-Serving Institutions outside of the *50-mile radius*. Additionally, as part of the development of our First Year Experience Program, students from our partner districts who are not directly admitted will have the opportunity to pursue dual admission through Compton College and a selected CSU campus.

We are in the early stages of this work. If you have creative ideas or recommendations related to this new regional transfer strategy, please share them with Dr. Maria Garcia at mgarcia74@compton.edu.

Enrollment Update as of May 22, 2025

- 424 FTES for the **Summer 2025** term. 3,448 (61%) of the available summer seats are currently filled.
- 473 FTES for the **Fall 2025** semester. Our fill rate for Fall is 17% with 2,957 seats filled.

Please encourage your students to register for the summer and fall classes. Every enrollment counts, and if students need registration assistance, they can visit the Welcome Center located in the Student Services Building. If they need to see a counselor, they can drop in or <u>schedule an appointment</u>.

Campuswide Forum Recap – May 20, 2025

Thank you to everyone who joined the Campuswide Forum on *May 20, 2025*. I want to share a brief recap of the key topics we covered during the <u>presentation</u>. We began with an update on enrollment, where we're seeing encouraging growth across terms. Our FTES numbers are steadily rising, with Spring 2025 showing a 10% increase over last year and Summer and Fall 2025 also trending upward. These gains reflect the hard work of our faculty, staff, and outreach teams.

The 2025–2026 tentative budget was reviewed. It highlights a projected \$54.45 million in revenue and strategic investments in student support, technology, and new faculty positions. We're also setting aside funds for key initiatives like Guided Pathways and our ERP system.

Looking ahead, <u>Compton College 2035</u> remains our guiding vision. This semester, we've launched several implementation activities, including the development of a new <u>Institutional-Set Goals Dashboard</u> and updated student success targets for 2035. These efforts are grounded in our commitment to equity, access, and completion.

We also explored how artificial intelligence tools like ChatGPT and Google's NotebookLM can support our work, from document drafting and data analysis to outreach and communication.

Legislative and Policy Update – State and Federal

Staff continues to monitor state and federal legislation that may impact Compton College and the broader California Community Colleges system. At the state level, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office is currently tracking 96 Tier 1 bills for the 2025–2026 Legislative Session. These bills address key areas such as dual enrollment, credit for prior learning, student housing, and childcare for student parents. A full legislative matrix is available on the Tracked Legislation webpage.

Federally, recent executive orders—particularly those related to accreditation—are drawing attention from national and state-level organizations. These orders propose significant changes, including the removal of DEI standards from accreditation criteria and the introduction of experimental accreditation models. Organizations such as the <u>Association of Community College Trustees</u>, the <u>Community College League of California</u>, and the <u>Association of California Community College Administrators</u> are actively responding and advising institutions on potential implications.

Staff will continue to provide monthly updates and guidance via the <u>Compton Community College District</u> Board of Trustees Agenda as new developments emerge.

Final Thoughts

Last night, we celebrated a remarkable milestone at our annual Transfer Admit Celebration. I want to extend my heartfelt congratulations to all of our students who have been admitted to four-year universities. One of the evening's highlights was a moving speech by Stephanie Lopez, a graduating student who has earned two associate degrees and a certificate. Her words captured the spirit of what it means to pursue higher education in today's world. She reminded us:

"With education, we unlock everything.

We gain the tools to solve problems, to lift up our communities, to challenge injustice, and to dream bigger than the world we were born into. Because when you have knowledge, you have power.

And when you have power, you have the ability to create change."
