# STEPS TO ENROLLMENT

Starting February 2, 2024, CCCApply will use ID.me for identity verification to protect student identities and prevent fraud at Compton College.

Verifying your identity through ID.me is the fastest way to enroll and register for classes. Acceptable documents include:

- Government-issued ID such as a current Driver's License or State ID card
- Passport or Passport Card
- Permanent Resident Card
- Employment Authorization Document

## Academic Freedom

### Board Policy 4030

The Compton Community College District recognizes that the search for the truth and the expressions of diverse opinions are essential to a democratic society, learning, and excellence in education, will encourage and protect academic freedom. Academic freedom is fundamental for the protection of the rights of the faculty member in teaching and of the student in learning. It carries with it responsibilities correlative with rights.

## Admissions Requirements

Any person over the age of 18 or possessing a high school diploma or its equivalent from the USA or other nation shall be admitted unless prohibited by law. If under the age of 18, students will qualify if they have 1) graduated from high school or 2) passed the California High School Proficiency Examination. Compton College may admit as a special part-time or special full-time student anyone in grades 11 or 12 who, in the opinion of the college president, may benefit from instruction.

Concurrently enrolled 11th- and 12th-grade students must comply with all policies, follow all procedures, and meet all requirements by the published deadlines for each semester and/or term.

## California Nonresident Tuition Exemption

California State Assembly Bill 540 (AB540) allows any student who meets all of the following requirements to be exempt from paying nonresident tuition at California Community Colleges, the California State University (CSU), and the University of California (UC).

1. The student must have attended a high school (public or private) in California for three or more years or have attained credits equivalent to three or more years of high school coursework and a combination of three or more years at a California elementary or secondary school and
2. The student must have graduated from a California high school (public or private) or attained the equivalent (e.g., General Educational Development - GED or California High School Proficiency Exam) prior to the start of the term at Compton College.

A student who meets the above requirements must file an affidavit with the Admissions & Records Office at Compton College stating that he/she has an application to legalize his/her immigration status or will file an application as soon as he/she is eligible to do so. In addition to the affidavit, the student must also provide an official high school transcript that clearly shows attendance in all semesters and the date of high school graduation. If the student attended more than one California high

school, then official transcripts from all high schools must be provided. If the student graduated through equivalency as mentioned above, then proof must be provided.

Student information obtained in this process is strictly confidential unless disclosure is required under the law. Students who meet the criteria will be exempted from the payment of nonresident tuition but will not be classified as "California Residents." Students will continue to be classified as "Nonresidents." Students who are in the United States under a student or visitor visa are not eligible.

## Equivalent Courses

Courses completed at other colleges and universities may be used to meet a prerequisite. Some high school courses, as stated in the catalog, may also be used to meet a prerequisite. Students who have completed equivalent courses at another college or in high school must have copies of necessary transcripts. Do not delay. Order transcripts and clear prerequisites prior to registration. Clearance for an equivalent course may be obtained electronically. ## Open Enrollment

Unless specifically exempted by statute, every course, course section, or class, wherever offered and maintained by the District, shall be fully open to enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to Compton College and who meets such prerequisites as may be established pursuant to Article 2.5 (commencing with Section 55200) of Subchapter 1 of Chapter 6 of Division 6 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.

## Student Records

Congress has provided in the "Family Education Rights and Privacy Act" (FERPA) that students have certain rights of access to their education records. A copy of the Act is located in the Library. Please contact the Admissions and Records Office for any information regarding your rights under the Act.

## Unit Limitations

The student's program of studies will vary according to individual needs and objectives. The maximum full-time student program for a semester is 20 units. The maximum program of study for a summer session is nine units. For the winter term, the maximum program of study is seven units. A student wishing to take more than the maximum units may file an Overload Petition through the Admissions & Records Office. Dual enrollment students have further limitations identified in Administrative Regulation 5900.

Students must have completed at least 12 units in one semester at Compton College or another accredited institution of higher education with an overall grade-point average of 2.5 or higher to be eligible for an overload.

## Cross Enrollment at CSU Dominguez Hills

Compton College students may enroll at California State University, Dominguez Hills without a formal admission offer. Enrollment is on a space-available basis; students can enroll in a maximum of one course per semester at CSUDH for \$10 per course. All students must meet cross enrollment eligibility requirements. ## First Year Experience (FYE) Program

Start strong at Compton College with the First Year Experience (FYE) Program—designed to support first-time college students as they transition into college life. Whether you're coming straight from high school or returning to education, FYE offers a welcoming environment with priority registration, a two-week Summer Bridge program, and access to dedicated FYE counselors who help you build a personalized educational plan. Students also benefit from workshops, academic support, and peer mentoring (launching Fall 2026) to build confidence and community.

FYE students participate in linked courses, receive ongoing counseling, and engage in activities that promote success in college and beyond. To join, students must attend the mandatory FYE Orientation and Summer Bridge, complete

the FAFSA or CA Dream Act application, and enroll in key courses during their first year. For more information, visit [compton.edu/academics/first-year-experience](http://compton.edu/academics/first-year-experience) or stop by the FYE Office in the Student Services Building (SSB), Room 144.

## High School Students

K-12 students may enroll in Compton College classes with school counselor and parent permission. Compton College will grant college credit for completed coursework. Students should consult their school counselor and/or school district policy on enrolling in college classes to earn high school credits or dual credit.

Students - When you enroll in classes at Compton College, you are considered a college student and are expected to act accordingly. Please familiarize yourself with Compton College policies, procedures, the college calendar, and your rights as a student by reading the class schedule and purchasing a college catalog from the Bookstore.

Parents - when your child enrolls in classes at Compton College, you lose some rights afforded you by the K-12 system. As per FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act), any business you conduct on behalf of your college student must be with the student's written consent. You, the parent, will need a note from your child to access private educational records or to act on his or her behalf.

## Register Online

**Your Compton College student email is your login to the MyCompton portal.**

You will need to use the following temporary password to get access: AaYYMMDD! (YY=last two digits of birth year, MM=two-digit month, DD=two-digit day) **followed by an exclamation (!) mark.** You will be prompted to create a new password and to authenticate your account.

## Waitlist

Students on a waitlist for a class must check their @compton.edu email daily to find out if a space becomes available in the class. If a space becomes available, an email is sent to the student with a specified time to register for the class. Students will not be automatically added to the class.

The waitlist time periods are listed below:

- 48 hours to add the class for Winter and Summer terms; and

- 72 hours for Spring and Fall semesters.

Log in to the **MyCompton** portal and select "Register" to add the class to your schedule. If you do not register for the class within the allotted time you will be removed from the waitlist. Waitlisted students admitted to the class must pay those class fees by the posted deadline.

## Add or Drop Classes

### TO ADD A CLASS

Students can add classes online without an add code until the day before the first class meeting. After the first class meeting, an Add Authorization Code is needed to register for the class. Classes are added through the **MyCompton** student portal:

1. Go to [www.compton.edu](http://www.compton.edu), click on MyCompton (top right corner)
2. Log in with username and password
3. Click on the STUDENT SERVICES button
4. Select the REGISTRATION AND PLANNING link on the left-hand side
5. Click REGISTER FOR CLASSES link
6. Search for classes by a variety of options (Subject, CRN, Day, Time, etc.)
7. Select a class to add to your schedule by clicking the ADD button
8. Click the SUBMIT button on the bottom right to add the class to your schedule
9. When adding the class with an Add Authorization Code, you will be prompted to enter the Add Code. Before adding, drop the classes you are no longer taking. If you have a time conflict (e.g., a class you are enrolled in overlaps by one minute or more with a course you are trying to add), you will not be able to add the new class. An Add Code only works for one student
10. Students have until 11:59 p.m. on the date(s) listed in the Calendar, available on page 3 of this schedule, to add or drop classes.

### TO DROP A CLASS

1. Go to [www.compton.edu](http://www.compton.edu) and click on MyCompton
2. Login with username and password
3. Click on the STUDENT SERVICES button
  1. Click DROP CLASS or REMOVE SECTION FROM WAITLIST
  2. Check the box of the class you wish to drop
  3. Click DROP from the drop-down menu
  4. Click SUBMIT (Note: once you click submit there is no going back. If you drop a class in error, you will need to contact the instructor as soon as

possible to request a reinstatement.)

5. Once you successfully drop the class, review your class schedule (scroll to the bottom of the screen to view the updated schedule) to make sure the class was dropped. ## Drops and Withdrawals

It is the student's responsibility to process an official withdrawal from class. Failure to do so may result in a letter grade of A through F. A student who fails to properly register or add a class will NOT receive credit for that class. Adding after the deadline is prohibited. If a student drops after the refund deadline, fees for the classes are forfeited. Any class subsequently added will require additional fees.

Students who want to transfer to a different section must complete a Section-Level Transfer form located online at [www.compton.edu/admissions-aid/admissions-records/forms](http://www.compton.edu/admissions-aid/admissions-records/forms).

## MyCompton Portal and @compton.edu Email

As a Compton College student, you are assigned a free student email account through Microsoft Office 365 for Education. Your student email address acts as your login to your Office 365 account and the **MyCompton** portal. **MyCompton** is our online portal that allows you to view your registration date, register for classes, access your student email, add or drop classes, purchase a parking permit, pay fees, view your financial aid status, and much more.

You are required to activate your Office 365 account in order to log in to the **MyCompton** portal, where you may register for classes and access additional student services. Click on the **MyCompton** icon to activate your Office 365 account.

## Attendance

Students who enroll in a class but do not attend the first scheduled class meeting may be dropped from the roster. Additionally, their place in the class will be given to students on the waiting list.

If an illness or emergency prevents a student from attending the first class session, the student must contact the instructor. A student who registers for a class and never attends is still responsible for dropping the class. Failure to properly drop a class by the appropriate deadline may result in a "W" and may hold the student responsible for any and all fees associated with the class. The burden of proof is on the student.

## Fees and Holds

Enrollment and other required fees are charged at the time of registration. Payment is due in accordance with the published payment deadlines established by Compton College for each term.

Students who fail to pay required fees by the published deadline may be subject to consequences for non payment, which may include being dropped from classes prior to the start of instruction and/or having a registration hold placed on their account. Registration holds may prevent enrollment in future terms and may restrict access to certain College services until the outstanding balance is resolved.

All required fees, as well as any optional fees requested at the time of registration (such as the Student Activities Fee and Student Representation Fee), must be paid by the applicable deadline.

Students who are placed on a waitlist are responsible for monitoring their Compton College email account daily. If a student is admitted to a class from the waitlist, the associated fees must be paid by the next published payment deadline. Failure to pay required fees by the deadline may result in the student being dropped from one or more classes and/or being subject to registration holds, consistent with College policy.

### REMOVING A FEE HOLD

To register for classes in an upcoming semester or intersession, all fees must be paid before registration begins. A fee hold is automatically removed once the balance is paid in full.

## Refund of Fees

Students must drop their classes through the online system, at **MyCompton** according to the following schedule:

- **First Six-Week Session:** Monday, June 29 2026
- **Eight-Week Session:** Monday, June 29, 2026
- **Second Six-Week Session:** Monday, July 13, 2026

The Student Activities Fee and Student Representation Fee (collected during fall and spring semesters) are non-refundable after the second week of the semester.

## Non-Resident Refunds

To receive a refund of your non-resident tuition, you must drop your classes through the online system at **MyCompton** according to the following schedule:

## Health Fee

Students enrolled in credit and/or noncredit classes pay \$19 each fall and spring semester (and \$16 per winter and summer intersession) to cover the operation, supervision, programs, and services of the Student Health Center.

In accordance with California Education Code 76355, students may submit a petition to the Vice President of Student Services to waive the health fee based on the following conditions:

- Students who depend exclusively upon prayer for healing in accordance with the teachings of a bona fide religious sect, denomination, or organization.
- Students who are attending a community college under an approved apprenticeship training program

**Exemptions:** Part-time dual-enrolled high school students are not required to pay the Health Fee.

**Refund:** Students who withdraw from all courses prior to the close of the second week of the term will be eligible for a refund of the Health Fee. Forms to request a refund may be obtained by emailing the Office of Student Development at [studentdevelopment@compton.edu](mailto:studentdevelopment@compton.edu).

## Student Activities Fee

All students are charged the \$10 Student Activities Fee when they register for fall and spring classes. Students may opt out of the Student Activities Fee within the first two weeks of the semester.

Students who pay the Student Activities Fee are entitled to Associated Student Government (ASG) incentives, including free or discounted admission to ASG-sponsored events, and free entry to all

athletic home events. Students who pay the Student Activities Fee are also eligible to receive exclusive ASG promotional items.

All students may opt out of this fee at the time of registration or by notifying the Office of Student Development at [studentdevelopment@compton.edu](mailto:studentdevelopment@compton.edu).

Students who opted out of the fee can pay the fee at any time during the semester and receive an ASG sticker at the Bursar's Office (SSB-161).

## Student Representation Fee

The Student Representation Fee is a \$2 charge collected at the time of registration (fall and spring semesters only) for each enrolled student for purposes of providing student governmental affairs representatives the means to express their positions and viewpoints before city, county, district, state, and federal government as well as other public agencies. The \$2 Student Representation Fee is used by the Compton College Associated Student Government and the Student Senate of California Community Colleges to advocate and lobby for legislative issues that affect and benefit community colleges and community college students both at the state and federal level. The fee is regulated by the California Education Code 76060.5.

All students may opt out of this fee at the time of registration or by notifying the Office of Student Development at [studentdevelopment@compton.edu](mailto:studentdevelopment@compton.edu).

## College Corps Fellowship

College Corps is a state-funded service program that provides eligible students, including AB 540 Dreamers, with a living stipend and an education award in exchange for completing community service. Students serve in areas such as climate action, K-12 education, food insecurity, and local technology support, while gaining professional experience and training.

Participants commit to one year of service, complete 450 service hours, and serve with local nonprofit organizations in Compton, Lynwood, and Paramount. Students may receive up to a \$7,000 living stipend during the service term and a \$3,000 education award upon successful completion.

### Return of Title IV Funds (R2T4) and Unofficial Withdrawal

If you withdraw from all classes or stop attending during a term, federal law may require Compton College to return a portion of your federal financial aid (Pell Grant, FSEOG, Direct Loans). The amount is based on how much of the term you completed (generally, before the 60% point).

- Official withdrawal: you drop all classes.
- Unofficial withdrawal: you receive all non-passing grades (e.g., W, F, NP) and there is no documented last date of attendance; the college must determine your last academically related activity and may have to return funds.

Returning funds can create a balance owed to the college and may place a hold on future registration. If you are considering dropping or withdrawing, speak with Financial Aid first to understand the impact.

### Parking & Traffic Enforcement

The Vehicle Code Laws of the State of California, the ordinances of Los Angeles County, and the Traffic and Parking Regulations of the Compton Community College District (CCCD) are in effect 24 hours per day, seven days per week including weekends and holidays, unless otherwise specified\*, and are enforced by the Compton College Police Department pursuant to section 21113 (a) (c) (f) of the California Vehicle Code. Compton College Police will issue citations to violators of these regulations. Parking violations are a minimum of \$40.

*\*Effective July 1, 2022, current students may park for free on campus with a college-issued parking permit. Details available at [www.compton.edu](http://www.compton.edu).*

- Parking availability is subject to change, and lots may be closed or restricted for special events.
- The basic speed limit is 15 mph in all posted areas.
- The use of skateboards, scooters, roller skates and bicycles is not permitted on campus. It is a violation of California Vehicle Code section 21113(F) to

operate those items (motorized or nonmotorized) on campus.

- The CCCD shall not be liable for the loss or damage caused to any vehicle parked in a district parking lot.

### DISABLED PERSONS PARKING

Students/visitors with disabilities who have been issued a Disabled Person (DP) placard may park in any student space or faculty/staff space and **MUST DISPLAY** the DMV disabled person placard plates AND a valid Compton College semester permit when parked on campus.

To avoid receiving a parking citation, students must display both the disabled placard/plates and the Compton College semester permit. Temporary medical parking arrangements can be made at the Compton College Police Department. See California Code of Regulations - Title 5, Section 54100; Ed Code 67301(a).

### LOST PROPERTY

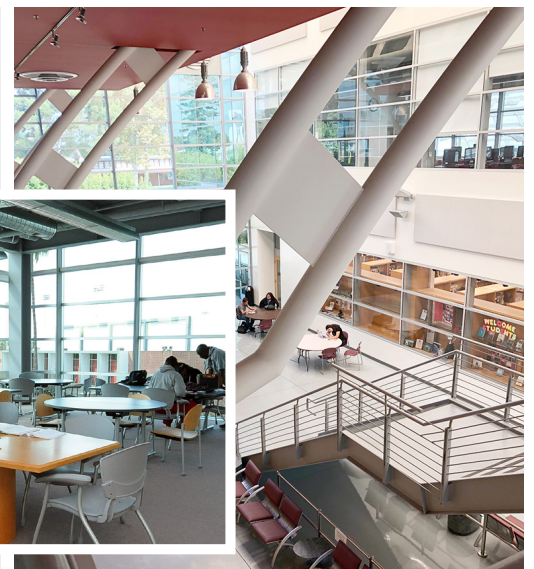
