# Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) WORKSHOPS

The SAP workshop offers help to students in understanding the institution's policy with maintaining satisfactory academic progress. In the workshop, we explain the difference between qualitative and quantitative measurements of satisfactory academic progress. We also explain the difference between term calculations and cumulative calculations. Finally, we explain SAP progression from satisfactory status to warning status to disqualified status.

Students will learn how to calculate their own completion rate and GPA. They will learn that minimum threshold requirements to remain in satisfactory status and they will also learn the maximum time frame lock-in-list component of SAP.

This series of workshops are not only for students who must appeal to determine their financial aid eligibility, but also for those who wish to gain a better understanding of the institution's SAP policy.
