

Coyotes Sighted on Campus

On May 17, 2019, Chief Box was informed that coyotes were sighted at Compton College this morning. They were spotted near the Student Life Patio.

Students, employees and campus visitors are urged to stay away from the animals. Do not attempt to call, pet, or feed the coyotes.

Generally, coyotes are reclusive animals who avoid human contact. If you encounter a coyote:

- Do not turn your back on a coyote or run away from a coyote.
- If approached, make loud noises and make yourself look big. If this fails, throw rocks or other objects.
- Never feed or attempt to tame a coyote.
