Coyotes Sighted on Campus

Multiple coyote sightings were reported yesterday, October 31, 2022, and this morning. The three coyotes were spotted near the Library-Student Success Center, and Math/Science and Administration buildings.

There are at least three coyotes, and they are not always together. A pest control service will be on campus this week to assist with trapping and relocating the animals.

Students, employees and campus visitors are urged to stay away from the animals. Do not attempt to call, pet, or feed the coyotes.

Generally, coyotes are reclusive animals who avoid human contact. If you encounter a coyote:

- Do not turn your back on a coyote or run away from a coyote.
- If approached, make loud noises and make yourself look big. If this fails, throw rocks or other objects.
- Never feed or attempt to tame a coyote.
