Coyotes Sighted on Campus

Multiple coyote sightings were reported yesterday, March 28, 2022, and this morning. The three coyotes were spotted near Tartar Village, the Math/Science Building, and at the north end of campus, near Instructional Building No. 1.

There are at least three coyotes, and they are not always together. A pest control service will be on campus this week to assist with trapping and relocating the animals.

Students, employees and campus visitors are urged to stay away from the animals. Do not attempt to call, pet, or feed the coyotes.

Generally, coyotes are reclusive animals who avoid human contact. If you encounter a coyote:

- Do not turn your back on a coyote or run away from a coyote.
- If approached, make loud noises and make yourself look big. If this fails, throw rocks or other objects.
- Never feed or attempt to tame a coyote.
