Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) Programs

ECC Compton Center has Guaranteed Transfer Agreements with several colleges and universities, including California State University, Dominguez Hills and several Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

Honors Transfer Program

Highly motivated students are encouraged to join our Honors Transfer Program (HTP), which prepares students to transfer to a university. HTP requirements are similar to those required by the University of California, and honors courses focus on improving reading, writing and study skills. Benefits include priority registration, increased chances of receiving scholarships, and completion of HTP designation noted on students' official transcripts.

STUDENT SUCCESS & SUPPORT

Counseling and Support

El Camino College Compton Center offers specialized support, no matter what your needs may be.

Library / Student Success Center

The Library provides reference services, general library orientation, research, instruction, and access to group study rooms. The Student Services Center provides tutoring and academic support services for all registered students attending El Camino College Compton Center.

Tutoring & Academic Assistance

The Student Success Center provides students with access to four drop-in tutorial centers, including tutoring, a Writing Center, Math & Science Center, and Reading Success Center. The Student Success Center also offers a Supplemental Instruction program, directed learning activities, academic skills workshops, and peer-led tutoring.

Computer Labs

The multidisciplinary Computer Lab features 100 state-of-the-art computers with a variety of academic software for students to utilize for computer-aided learning, word processing and research. The computers are interconnected via a high-speed, Ethernet network, and pay for printing is available. In addition, the Computer Lab offers a wide array of software including the latest packages Microsoft Office, desktop publishing and web-based learning modules, including PLATO and Rosetta Stone.

Student Health

El Camino College Compton Center students have access to free or low-cost health care in the new Molina Student Health Center. Services include physicals, treatment for colds, flu and ear infections, family planning (including pregnancy tests), health education, and flu and hepatitis vaccines.

Student Activities

Get involved in your choice of more than 12 clubs and organizations. Attend events on campus such as movie screenings, talent shows, dance performances, BBQs, cultural events, and more.

Outstanding Facilities

Technology upgrades, infrastructure advancements, and new and updated facilities have provided an ever-increasing array of academic and support opportunities for students – and significantly enhanced the appearance of the campus.

Diversity

El Camino College Compton Center's campus community reflects the diversity found in the communities served by the Compton Community College District. Surrounded by such a rich mix of cultures, backgrounds, perspectives and talents, students can experience and explore what it means to be a global citizen.

CalWORKs

CalWORKs assists single parents who are receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and those in transition from welfare to achieve long-term self-sufficiency through coordinated student services. Assistance is provided to eligible students so they can obtain their educational degrees and certificates while earning extra money and gaining valuable work experience that leads to sustainable employment.

Child Development Center

The Abel B. Sykes Jr. Child Development Center accepts applications for enrollment of infants, toddlers, preschool and school-age children. If you are a student and/or working parent, you may be eligible for FREE or low-cost child care.



Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS)

EOPS is a state-funded program designed to assist low-income and educationally disadvantaged students achieve their educational and career goals. EOPS provides priority registration, orientation, academic, career and personal counseling services, textbook vouchers, student enhancement workshops, academic achievement grants, educational supplies and other above-and-beyond services to help students succeed, transfer to a four-year universities, and be competitive in the workforce.

Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE)

CARE is a state-funded, supplemental component of EOPS designed to provide educational and career support services and activities for single parents who are academically under-prepared and receiving cash-aid assistance.

First Year Experience (FYE)

The First Year Experience program is designed to help first-time college students be successful in their first year of college life by providing a supportive, caring environment of educational and career services. Services provided in FYE include college orientation, early enrollment, guaranteed linked courses, on-going counseling support, learning community model, strategies for success in college, faculty collaboration, field drips, academic support and peer mentors.

Special Resource Center (SRC)

The SRC facilitates academic success for students with disabilities by providing equal access to educational opportunities in an integrated campus setting. The SRC provides support services, adaptive equipment, computer technology, and specialized instruction to serve students with verified disabilities. The SRC provides accommodations for both academic and extracurricular college activities.

Transfer & Career Center

Opportunities for extensive career planning and assessment of interests, personality, skills, and values are available in the Transfer and Career Center. Career exploration and workshops are also offered for vocational and pre-professional planning and job success. The Transfer Center offers a wide range of services and activities designed to assist students in transferring successfully to the four-year college or university of their choice. Among the transfer services offered are professional transfer counseling and advisement, regularly scheduled visits by recruiting and admissions officers from four-year colleges and universities, and workshops on major steps in the transfer process.

- New and returning students (those with an absence of two consecutive primary terms: fall or spring semesters; excluding summer and winter terms) must complete an online application for admission.
- A Student ID number will be issued and emailed upon completion of the online application.
- Official transcripts from all accredited colleges and trade schools attended must be submitted by those schools to the Records Office (Building A). Students applying for Advanced Placement credit must submit official high school transcripts.
