Compton Community College District (CCCD) History

- Established in 1927 as part of Compton Union High School District.
- Voter-approved bond measure separated the two in 1950.
- June 2005, the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) revoked Compton College's accreditation.
- This terminated college's ability to offer classes, grant degrees, and transferrable units.

Partnership with El Camino College

- August 2006 - El Camino Community College District Board of Trustees approve Memorandum of Understanding.
- CCCD governed by Special Trustee, appointed by the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges.
- Interim Chief Executive Officer (CEO) - District's budget, fiscal policy, administration of labor agreements, legal matters, bond management, facilities management and human resources.

Partnership with El Camino College

- Academic Programs and Student Support Services under oversight of El Camino College.
- Vice President El Camino College Compton Center - Academic Programs and Student Services.



Partnership with El Camino College

- Primary intent of agreement is to assist the El Camino College Compton Center with recovery and eventual accreditation.
- Since 2007 number of degrees awarded increased significantly.
- 60 El Camino College Compton Center students received scholarships in 2011 totaling \$46,100.

Process to Accreditation

- El Camino Community College District and Compton Community College District fully committed to obtaining independent accreditation for Compton Center.
- Moving forward under goals in AB 318 and the Partnership Agreement.
- Accreditation Steering Committee and five subcommittees established November 2010 to assess and respond to Eligibility Criteria.

Process to Accreditation

- Sixteen criteria met.
- One criterion will be met when the eligibility application is filed.
- One criterion partially met.
- Financial Resources, Financial Accountability, and Institutional Planning and Evaluation criteria not met.



The Process to Accreditation

- Spring 2013, review the 2011-2012 fiscal year audit to determine if CCCD meets the ACCJC fiscal eligibility requirements.
- Next, a determination will be made whether Eligibility Proposal will be submitted to the Accrediting Commission Eligibility Committee for review at June 2014 meeting, or six months later at January 2015 meeting.

- Once all documentation is ready, the application will be submitted by El Camino College.

Fiscal Crisis Management Assistance Team (FCMAT)

- Mission - help California's local educational agencies identify, prevent and resolve financial challenges.
- AB 318 requires FCMAT provide semi-annual reports on 5 operational areas of the District and its progress toward recovery.
- FCMAT has no official impact on accreditation status.
- FCMAT standards aligned with ACCJC eligibility requirements to help eliminate duplication of standards across areas, and to prepare for accreditation self-study and application for eligibility.

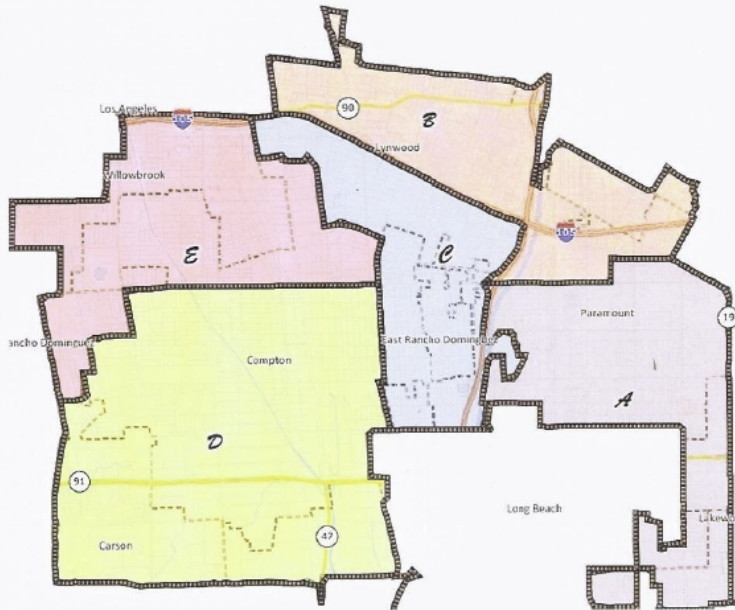


CCCD Redistricting Process

- Redistricting is a legally required process that occurs every ten years.
- To comply with the **Federal Voting Rights Act** and the **California Voting Rights Act of 2001**, community colleges, city councils and other local agencies must publicly review and modify election boundaries to equalize the population and ensure fair elections.

- January 17, 2012: Special Trustee for CCCD appointed five individuals to serve on the Redistricting Committee.
- May 16, 2012: following several Public Hearings and public forums, Special Trustee adopted new trustee area boundaries (Map 1).

CCCD Redistricting Process

- July 2012 - California Community Colleges' Board of Governors approve election waiver.
- August 2012 – CCCD submits new Trustee Areas to Los Angeles County Registrar Recorder's office.
- November 2013 – All five Board Seats up for election.



Budget

- Compton District budget reductions for past 2 years
- If Governor's tax initiative does not pass:
 - Community colleges will receive a budget cut from current year of more than \$338 million
 - CCCD will receive nearly \$2 million less from the state for 2012-13 FY

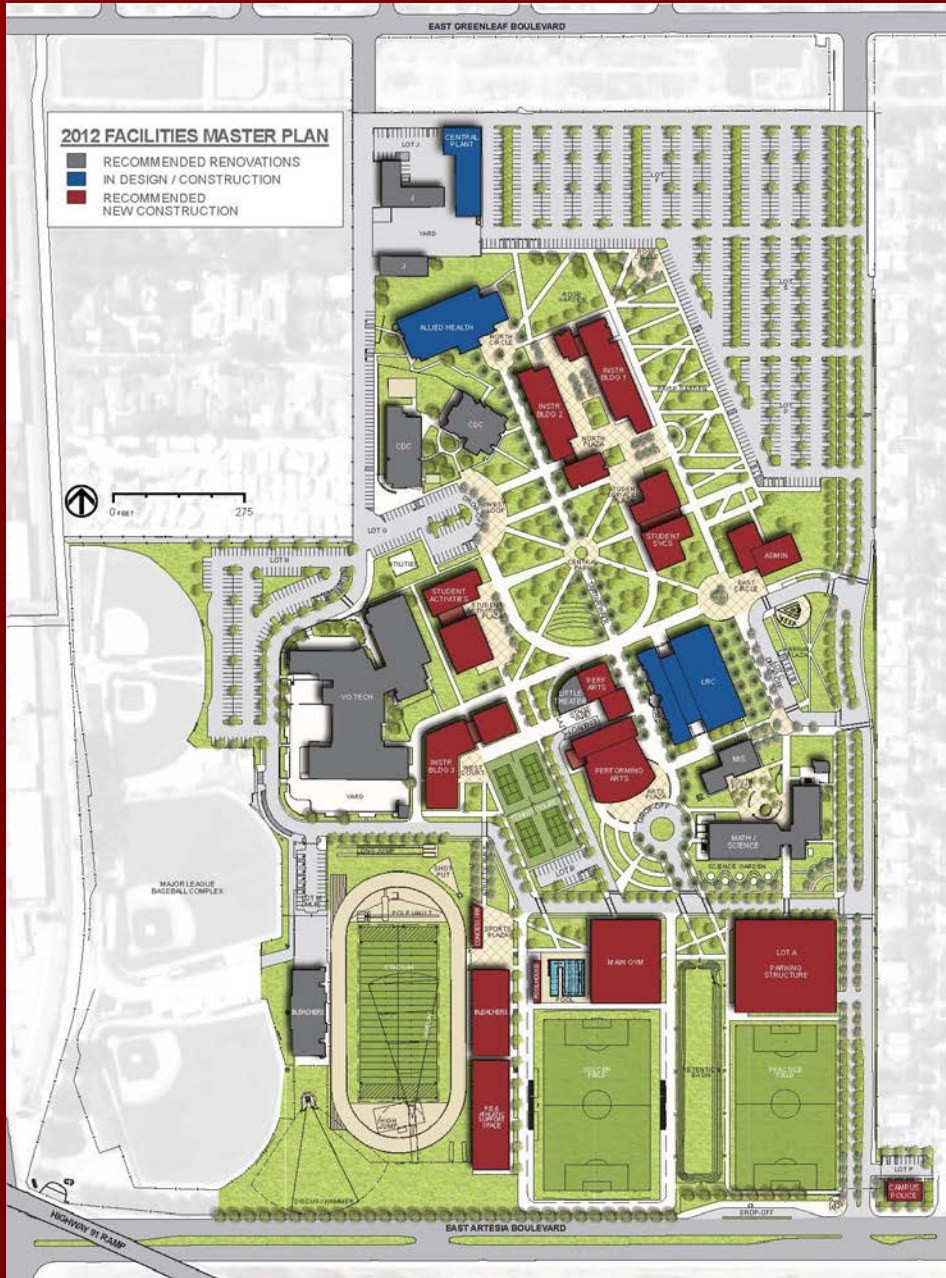
Community Participation

- Special Trustee Advisory Committee
 - “advise the Special Trustee with respect to the management of the CCCD”
- Bond Oversight Committee
 - informs the public concerning the District’s expenditure of revenues received from the sale of bonds authorized by the voters



Community Participation

- CCCD Community Participation in Governance initiative provides a way to foster community engagement and support of the District.
- Board meetings - community groups will be invited to sit at the dais.
