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### BSD 10 RATIFICATION OF AGREEMENT WITH LOS ANGELES COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION (TEEN FATHERS)

Special Trustees to approve the ratification of agreement with Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE), Teen Fathers. Extended Agreement July 1, 2007 and terminate on June 30, 2010 (REVENUE)

This Agreement covers facilities, supplies and services made available by the College for use by LACOE for classroom use for a period of twelve (12 months). The facilities to be utilized daily by LACOE on a non-exclusive basis from 9:30 am to 4:50 pm.

LACOE shall pay the District a twelve (12) month usage fee of \$2,700 per month for facilities supplies and services provided hereunder. Services provided shall include custodial, normal building maintenance, utilities (except telephone), classroom furniture, and other services inherent in the use of classrooms/school buildings, in a manner generally accepted for other District classrooms occupied by students.

LACOE shall pay the District for rent costs incurred as a result of this Agreement \$2,700 (Two Thousand Seven Hundred dollars) per month. The District shall invoice LACOE monthly. Payments shall be made upon receipt of itemized invoices accompanied by the appropriate supporting documents.

This Agreement commenced on July 1, 2007 and shall remain in effect through June 30, 2010.

It is recommended that the Special Trustee approve the ratification of agreement with Los Angeles County Office of Education.

### LOS ANGELES COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION USE OF FACILITIES AGREEMENT FOR FACILITIES AND SERVICES DIVISION OF ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION COMPTON COLLEGE COMMUNITY DAY SCHOOL

The Los Angeles County Office of Education, a public educational agency, located at 9300 Imperial Highway, Downey, California 90242-2890, hereinafter referred to as "LACOE," and Compton Community College District, hereinafter referred to as "District," mutually agree as follows:

### 1. BASIS OF CONTRACT

This Use of Facilities Agreement (UFA) covers facilities and services made available by the District for use by LACOE for its Division of Alternative Education program and classes for a period of thirty-six (36) months, unless otherwise terminated as specified in Section 2 hereunder. The facilities to be utilized by LACOE shall be located in Building F, Rooms 12-A, 12-B, 18, 20 and 21, located at Compton Community College, 1111 East Artesia Boulevard, Compton CA. 90221-5393.

### 2. TERM AND TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

This Contract is effective from to July 1, 2007 and shall remain in effect through June 30, 2010. The Contract may be amended by mutual written consent of the parties and may be terminated by LACOE upon ninety (90) days advance written notification.

If LACOE, with District's consent, remains in possession of the Premises after the expiration of the terms hereof, such occupancy shall be an Agreement from month-tomonth upon all the terms and conditions of the original Agreement, cancelable by either Party upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other Party.

### 3. PAYMENT

LACOE shall pay District an annual usage fee of \$32,400.00 (\$2,700.00 per month) for facilities and services provided hereunder. The usage rate includes reimbursement for the following:

- 3.1 <u>Custodial Service</u> Includes custodial salaries; employee benefits and custodial supplies. Custodial service shall be provided at the same level as the District provides to regular classrooms not occupied by LACOE.
- 3.2 <u>Normal Building Maintenance</u> Includes maintenance salaries, employee benefits and maintenance supplies as well as those maintenance charges paid to an outside Contractor for maintaining the building(s) in a manner generally accepted for schoolhouses occupied by students.

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- 3.3 <u>Utilities</u> (except telephone) If District provides a telephone for use of LACOE, LACOE shall reimburse the District for the actual cost of all message units plus a pro-rata share of the monthly usage rate. Otherwise LACOE shall install telephones for its own use and pay all charges as a result thereof.
- 3.4 <u>Normal Classroom Furniture</u> Includes student desks and chairs and a teacher workstation, unless otherwise agreed.
- 3.5 Other expenses inherent in the rental of classrooms.

### 4. CUSTODIAL SERIVES

In the event LACOE determines that custodial services are required in addition to those included in the basic rental rate, the District shall, at the request of LACOE, assign additional custodial staff at the site. The number of additional hours of service to be provided and the hourly rate(s), including employee benefits, shall be approved by LACOE prior to making such assignment. If such additional service is provided, LACOE shall reimburse the District for the total cost of the additional service. This provision shall not be interpreted to require the District to employ additional custodial staff in order to satisfy LACOE's request.

### 5. **REIMBURSEMENT**

LACOE shall reimburse the District for all costs incurred as a result of this UFA monthly on a reoccurring payment basis.

### 6. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

District hereby certifies that District is in compliance with the Environmental Protection Agency's regulations pertaining to Asbestos in schools as published in the Federal Register on May 27, 1982. The District also certifies that its employees and contractors are properly trained in the use of all hazardous materials used in the vicinity of the classrooms used by LACOE pursuant to this Contract and that a central file of Hazardous Material Data Sheets is maintained by the District and accessible in emergency situations.

### 7. INDEMNIFICATION

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7.1 <u>LACOE's Indemnification</u> - LACOE agrees to defend, indemnify, save and hold harmless District from and against any and all demands, debts, liens, claims, losses, damages, liability, cost, expenses (including, but not by way of limitation, attorneys fees and costs actually incurred, whether or not litigation has commenced), judgments or obligations, actions, or causes of action whatsoever, for or in connection with injury or damage (including, but not limited to death) to any person or property to the extent that such injury or damage results in whole or in part from the negligence of LACOE, its agents, employees or invitees in connection with their use of District's facilities pursuant to this UFA.

7.2 <u>District's Indemnification</u> - District agrees to defend, indemnify, save and hold harmless LACOE (including its officers, employees, and independent contractors) from and against any and all demands, debts, liens, claims, losses, damages, liability, cost, expenses (including, but not by way of limitation, attorneys fees and costs actually incurred, whether or not litigation has commenced), judgments or obligations, actions, or causes of action whatsoever, for or in connection with injury or damage (including, but not limited to death) to any person or property to the extent that such injury or damage results in whole or in part from the negligence of District, its agents, employees or invitees in connection with the facilities and services provided by District to LACOE pursuant to this UFA.

### 8. INSURANCE

- 8.1. During the effective dates of this Agreement, the Parties shall maintain in effect a policy or policies of insurance issued by one or more insurance companies and/or a memorandum or memoranda of coverage issued by a joint powers authority providing the coverages identified below:
  - a. Liability to a third party for bodily injury, sickness, or disease and for physical injury to tangible property and/or for loss of use of tangible property not physically injured that is neither expected nor intended from the standpoint of the insured or of the covered party. The policy limit or limit of liability for such coverage shall be at least \$1 Million per occurrence with an aggregate limit of no less than \$2 Million.
  - b. Liability to a third party for "personal injury" offense(s) as defined by the applicable policy of insurance or memorandum of coverage. The policy limit or limit of liability for such coverage shall be at least \$1 Million per occurrence or claim with an aggregate limit of no less than \$2 Million.
  - c. <u>Workers' Compensation</u>. The Parties will each maintain Workers' Compensation or similar insurance as required by law, for the benefit and protection of their own employees, and not the employees of the other. Claims under workers' compensation benefit acts: Worker's Compensation Statutory Limits shall be as required by Article I (commencing with Section 3700) of Chapter 4 of Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Labor Code (as it may, from time to time, be amended). At no time during the operation of the term of this UFA will employees of the District be considered employees of LACOE or vice-versa.
- 8.2 Each policy of insurance required under this UFA shall be obtained from a provider licensed to do business in California. Self insurance by either Party may be allowed.
- 8.3 Each policy shall bear an endorsement precluding cancellation or termination of the policy or reduction in coverage unless the other party has been given written notice of such intended action at least thirty (30) days prior to its effective date.

- 8.4 Each party shall provide to the other party with endorsements of said insurance prior to the use contemplated by this UFA and shall provide to the other party true copies of the policies of said insurance as soon as available.
- 8.5 If either party fails to obtain or maintain, or cause to be obtained and maintained, any insurance required by this UFA, the other party shall have the right but not the obligation to purchase the insurance, in which case the non-insured party shall, within ten (10) days following the other party's written demand for reimbursement, shall reimburse the other party for all costs associated with its purchase of such insurance.

### 9. FAILURE TO COMPLY

In the event the District or LACOE fails to perform in accordance with the indemnification, or insurance requirement clauses of this UFA, or otherwise breaches any other clause of this Agreement, the non-breaching party shall be entitled to recover all costs and other expenses incident to securing performance or incurred as a consequence of nonperformance with the exception of legal fees.

### 10. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

While performing its obligations under this UFA, the District and LACOE are independent contractors and not officers, employees or agents of one another Neither the District nor LACOE shall at any time or in any manner represent that it or any of its officers, employees, or agents are employees of one another.

### 11. RECORD RETENTION AND INSPECTION

The Parties agrees that each Party shall have access to and the right to examine, audit, excerpt, copy or transcribe any pertinent records pertaining to this UFA. All records shall be kept and maintained by the Parties and made available to each other during the entire term of this Contract and for a period not less than five (5) years after final payment hereunder by LACOE.

### 12. MODIFICATION

The UFA shall not be modified or amended without mutual written consent of the parties. If any actual or physical deletions or changes appear on the face of the Agreement, such deletions or changes shall only be effective if the initials of both contracting parties appear beside such deletion or change.

### 13. SEVERABILITY/WAIVER

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13.1 If any provision of this UFA is determined to be illegal, unenforceable, or invalid, such act shall in no way affect the validity of any other provision in this Agreement.

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13.2 No waiver of any provision of this UFA shall be deemed, or shall constitute, a waiver of any other provision, whether or not similar, nor shall any such waiver constitute a continuing or subsequent waiver of the same provision. No waiver shall be binding unless executed in writing by the party making the waiver.

### 14. ASSIGNMENT

The District shall not in any manner, directly or indirectly, by operation of law or otherwise, assign, transfer or encumber this UFA or any portion hereof of any interest herein, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of LACOE. If consent is not given by LACOE to assign, transfer, or encumber this Agreement, such action shall be deemed automatically void. In addition, the District shall not subcontract the work to be performed pursuant to this UFA without *prior* written approval of LACOE. The names and qualifications of subcontractors or others whom District intends to employ, other than those identified, shall be submitted to LACOE for prior written approval.

### 15. INTEGRATION

This UFA, including all exhibits and other documents incorporated herein or made applicable by reference, contains the complete and final understanding of the parties' rights, duties and obligations with respect to the transaction discussed in the Agreement and supersedes all prior Agreements, understandings and commitments, whether oral or written. This UFA shall not be amended in any way except by a writing expressly purporting to be such an amendment, signed and acknowledged by both of the parties hereto.

### 16. ATTORNEY'S FEES

Should either party be required to file any legal action or claim to enforce any provision of this UFA or resolve any dispute arising under or connected to this Agreement, each party shall bear its own attorney's fees and costs in bringing such an action and any judgment or decree rendered in such a proceeding shall not include an award thereof.

### 17. GOVERNING LAW/FORUM SELECTION

This UFA is made, entered into and executed in Los Angeles County, California, and any legal action, claim or proceeding arising out of or connected with this Agreement shall be filed in the applicable court in Los Angeles County, California. This UFA shall be construed, and all disputes hereunder shall be settled, in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

### 18. NOTICES.

Any notices to be given pursuant to this UFA shall be in writing and such notices, as well as any other document to be delivered, shall be delivered by personal service or by deposit in the U.S. Mail, certified or registered, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, and addressed to the intended party:

### 19. EMPLOYEE FINGERPRINTING

During the entire term of this Agreement, the District, including all subcontractors, shall fully comply with the provisions of Education Code Section 45125.1 when LACOE determines that the District's employees and/or employees of subcontractors will have more than limited contact with LACOE pupils in the performance of the work of the UFA.

### 20. **TOBACCO-FREE WORKPLACE**
