RE: Notice of Removal of Compton Community College District as Auxiliary Organization in Good Standing

Dear Dr. Washington:

Please be advised that I believe grounds may exist for the removal of the Compton Community College Foundation (the "Foundation") from the list of auxiliary organizations in good standing with the Compton Community College District (the "District").

The grounds for removal of the Foundation as an auxiliary organization in good standing with the District include, but are not limited to the following:

- 1. The Foundation has not submitted its program and budget for each fiscal year to the District for approval and has not submitted annual audit reports to the District, in accordance with the Education Code, the Title V Regulations and with the terms of the Foundation's Master Agreement.
- The Foundation has not complied with Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") requirements for filing Form 990s and/or has not timely filed its Form 990s, which may jeopardize the Foundation's status as a 501(c)(3) organization.
- 3. The Foundation has not been operating in accordance with the California Corporations Code, in that it has purportedly taken board action at meetings at which a quorum of directors was not present.

Pursuant to the California Code of Regulations, Title V ("Title V"), Section 59263, this letter serves as written notice to the Foundation that a conference will be held at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 10, 2009 in the Compton Community College District Boardroom to determine whether grounds do in fact exist for the removal of the Foundation from the District's auxiliary organization good standing list. Pursuant to Title V, the members of the Foundation's board of directors are entitled to be present and to be heard at this conference.

BSD 3 AMENDMENT TO BERGMAN & DACEY, INC. AGREEMENT

BACKGROUND

Amendment to the original agreement with Bergman & Dacey, Inc., approved September 28, 2004, to increase the budget amount of the contract from \$50,000 to \$910,280.

The September 16, 2008 Amendment to Bergman & Dacey, Inc.'s January 4, 2005 contract for legal services with the District requires that any expenditures in excess of \$50,000.00 per year requires the Special Trustee to approve budgets submitted by Bergman & Dacey, Inc. and to pay out monies in excess of \$50,000.00 only on approved budgets.

The District is currently engaged in several civil actions and arbitrations with two former contractors to the District, the contractors' surety companies, and others regarding the Learning Resource Center project.

Bergman & Dacey, Inc. has submitted projected budgets for these matters for the Special Trustee's consideration and approval. The total amount of each budget is not expected to be used before the end of the contract on September 27, 2009. It is likely that there will be a need to prepare a new contract for the period after September 27 and remaining funds may be reallocated at that point. The budgets contain attorney client privileged communications and attorney work product, and as such, while the aggregate dollar amount of each budget can be made part of the public record, the text of the budgets should remain confidential, privileged and protected, and not be made part of the public record or disclosed in any way. The total budget for the Tower Glass case is \$563,080 and for the Mc Mahon case is \$347,200.

RECCOMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Special Trustee approve both of the budgets submitted as part of this Agenda item. Should additional funds be required, Staff will submit revised budget projections for approval.
