Contains over 7,000 full-length videos and 43,000+ video clips.

Nursing Collection

Collection designed to help nursing students pass licensure exams and prepare for long-term success in the health care system. Examines nursing foundations, nursing skills, patient care and intervention, and diseases, disorders and disabilities. Contains over 700 full-length videos and 5,000+ video clips.

Nursing Current Concepts & Practices Collection

Selection of most current video content to support nursing training programs, with titles within the last five years from producers such as Cambridge Educational, Classroom Productions Inc., Medcom-Trainex, and Elsevier. Contains over 400 full-length videos.

Archival Films & Newsreels Collection

Offers archival and historical films from multiple sources throughout modern history. Covers public events, wars, cultural phenomena, and government programs. Contains over 5,000 full-length videos and 13,000+ video clips.

Option B: Institutional Log-In

Step 1: Go to Access Location

- 1. Go to the <u>Compton College Library homepage</u> and click on the <u>Library Streaming Video</u> tab, located on the left hand navigation menu.
- 2. Next, click on Films On Demand to go to the log-in portal OR bookmark Films On Demand to go directly to the log-in portal.

Use the Facts On File database credentials (case sensitive) to log-in.

How to Create Individual Account

Step 1: Log-in via MyCompton OR institutional database credentials.

Step 2 – Option A (MyCompton Log-in): Click on *Films On Demand* logo.



Step 3: Click on Your Profile and select Sign Up

Next, click on **Your Profile** at the top of the page.



At the bottom of the log-in window, select **Sign Up** and follow the instructions to create your free individual account.

Step 4: (Optional) Customize Account Settings

 1. Once logged-in to your individual account, click on your profile icon and select Account Settings from the list.

- 2. Select desired options from **Default Settings** (language, citation type, embed code size, video playback), **Caption Settings** (font size, font style, font color, background color, always start videos with captions enabled), and **Page Tools** (active and inactive display and order).
- 3. Click on **Save Changes** at bottom of page to process changes.

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How to Organize & Save Content

My Content: Organize & Save Videos, Segments, and Quizzes

1. Once logged-in to your individual account, click on your profile icon and select **My Content** from the list.



2. Select Add YouTube Video or Add Folder from the top menu to begin uploading/organizing content, or to view your saved videos and segments.

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NOTE: Quizzes are ordered as separate files and <u>cannot</u> be moved into folders in **My Content**.

Courses: Organize & Save Content by Course & Invite Students

1. Once logged-in to your individual account, click on your profile icon and select **Courses** from the list.



Select **Create Course** and follow the prompts to fill in course details.

Click on **Invite Students** to generate a link to this course content and share with your students.
